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

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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency

wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is available at www.pabulletin.com.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised. A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

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Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish such information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44. 1 Pa. Code § 3.44 reads as follows:

§ 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

TITLE 207. JUDICIAL CONDUCT

PART II. CONDUCT STANDARDS

CHAPTER 51. STANDARDS OF CONDUCT OF MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGES

PENNSYLVANIA RULES FOR MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGES

Canon 4. A magisterial district judge or candidate for judicial office shall not engage in political or campaign activity that is inconsistent with the independence, integrity, or impartiality of the judiciary.

Rule 4.4. Campaign Committees.

* * * * *

(B) A judicial candidate subject to public election shall take reasonable steps to cause the magisterial district judge's campaign committee:

* * * * *

(3) to comply with all applicable statutory requirements for disclosure and divestiture of campaign contributions, and to file with the [Secretary of the Commonwealth] appropriate county board of elections a report stating the name, address, occupation, and

employer of each person who has made campaign contributions to the committee in an aggregate value exceeding \$250 and the name and address of each person who has made campaign contributions to the committee in an aggregate value exceeding \$50. The report must be filed not later than thirty days following an election, or within such other period as is provided by law.

Som.R.J.A. 1200. Duties of Domestic Relations Sec-

The Section shall perform the duties imposed by applicable statute, Pennsylvania Rule of Civil Procedure and other Local Rule, and shall have the duty:

- A. To make prompt disposition of all complaints filed in the Section, in accordance with the procedures and provisions contained in applicable statutes, Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure, Local Rules and directives from the court; and
- B. To inform persons having business with the Section of the proper procedures of the Section; and
- C. To make prompt collections of all amounts due from a support obligor; and
- D. To receive and promptly deposit all moneys paid to the Section in a bank or trust company pursuant to a depository agreement in compliance with law and approved by the President Judge; and

- E. To remit promptly to the parties entitled all support moneys received, and to remit to the County Treasurer all moneys received as costs in support cases on or before the 10th day of each calendar month for all moneys received during the preceding calendar month; and
- [F. To make and file in the Miscellaneous Docket of the Prothonotary's Office an annual report to the court of the full activity of the Section, in the form approved by the court, with a copy to each Judge of the Court; and
- G. To make a monthly report of the Section's activities to each Judge of the court on or before the 10th day of each calendar month, in form prescribed by the court.]

L-1930.4. Service of Original Process in Domestic Relations Matters.

(a) In all domestic relations actions, including Protection from Abuse matters, the plaintiff shall serve the following notice to the defendant simultaneously with original process:

(Caption)

NOTICE

You are being served with original process in a domestic relations matter, and a proceeding has been, or may be scheduled, which could affect your rights. In the event a proceeding has been scheduled, you will be served with notice of the proceeding. If you are incarcerated and want to testify or present evidence, you must apply to the Court for a writ of habeas corpus ad testificandum to enable you to participate in the proceeding. The writ is available where an incarcerated individual wishes to testify as provided by statute or rule, as well as where the testimony is sought by another.

IF YOU FAIL TO APPLY TO THE COURT FOR A WRIT, YOU MAY BE UNABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ANY PROCEEDINGS WHILE INCARCERATED.

(b) Proof of service shall be made that the notice in subsection (a) has been served in the manner set forth in Pa.R.Civ.P. 1930.4(h).

(c) Nothing contained in this rule shall alter, or otherwise modify, the rules governing the form of a complaint in an action for custody, partial custody, or visitation, complaint in divorce, or petition for protection from abuse.

Financial Disclosure and Reporting Requirements for Judicial Officers; No. 442 Judicial Administration Doc.

Order

Per Curiam:

And Now, this 6th day of February, 2015, pursuant to this Court's Order of April 13, 1984, No. 47 Judicial Administration Docket No. 1, provisions related to the filing of statements of financial interest by judicial officers were established and by subsequent Orders of March 22, 2005, No. 271 Judicial Administration Docket No. 1, and of January 23, 2006, No. 282 Judicial Administration Docket No. 1, provisions relating to the electronic filing of these statements were established;

It Is Ordered pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania that all prior orders are rescinded and all judicial officers, as defined herein, shall file a statement of financial interest in accordance with the following provisions on a form prescribed by the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts ("AOPC") and approved by this Court or such amended form as may be issued in the future.

1. Persons Required to File:

For purposes of this Order, a judicial officer is defined as a justice of the Supreme Court, a judge of the Superior or Commonwealth Court, a judge of the Court of Common Pleas, a judge of the Municipal Court of Philadelphia, a magisterial district judge, and all senior jurists who are active or eligible for recall to judicial service.

2. Filing:

All judicial officers shall file a statement of financial interest with the AOPC for the prior calendar year no later than May 1 of each year.

All judicial officers who are appointed to office shall file a statement of financial interest within 60 days of assuming office.

All judicial officers who leave their position shall file a statement of financial interest within 60 days of their departure for any period of service not covered by a previously filed statement. This requirement does not apply to judicial officers who are certified as senior jurists within that period of time.

Such filing may be accomplished electronically through the use of a secure log-in supplied by the AOPC. The submission of a statement through electronic means signifies the user's intent to sign the document. By submitting the statement electronically, the individual certifies the electronic filing is true and correct. All statements of financial interest submitted electronically through the secure log-in procedure shall be accepted for filing by the AOPC.

3. Failure to File; Falsification of Information:

Upon failure of any judicial officer to file the required statement within the time allowed, the AOPC shall give notice to such judicial officer that failure to comply with this Order within 10 days may result in the suspension of the judicial officer from his or her duties.

Following receipt of this notice, if the judicial officer fails to file the statement within the 10-day period, the AOPC shall immediately notify the Chief Justice of Pennsylvania and the Judicial Conduct Board of Pennsylvania of the delinquency in filing.

The knowing and willful falsification of any information required to be reported pursuant to this Order, or the knowing and willful failure to report information as required by this Order, may result in the suspension of the judicial officer from his or her duties, and shall constitute a charge of misconduct and result in referral of the case to the Judicial Conduct Board for disposition. See In re Bruno, _____ Pa. _____, 101 A.3d 635 (2014) (explaining the separate constitutional functions of the Judicial Conduct Board, Court of Judicial Discipline and Pennsylvania Supreme Court).

4. Public Access:

All statements of financial interest filed pursuant to this Order shall be made available for public inspection and copying during regular office hours.

5. Retention:

The AOPC shall preserve statements of financial interest for a period of 10 years from the date of receipt.

This *Order* shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. No. 103(b), and shall be effective immediately.

DELAWARE RIVER BASIN COMMISSION

Public Hearing and Business Meeting

The Delaware River Basin Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, March 10, 2015. A business meeting will be held the following day on Wednesday, March 11, 2015. The hearing and business meeting are open to the public and will take place at the Washington Crossing Historic Park Visitor Center, 1112 River Road, Washington Crossing, PA.

Public hearing. The public hearing on March 10, 2015, will begin at 1:30 p.m. Hearing items will include draft dockets for the withdrawals, discharges and other waterrelated projects listed as follows and for resolutions: (1) authorizing the Executive Director to award a contract to the lowest responsible bidder for taxonomic identification of benthic macroinvertebrates in samples collected from the Delaware River and its tributaries; (2) authorizing the Executive Director to award a contract to the lowest responsible bidder for analysis of water, sediment and tissue samples from ambient waters of the Delaware River Basin for organic chemicals including polychlorinated biphenyls and mercury; (3) delegating limited authority to the Executive Director to enter into settlement agreements and to waive administrative late fees for good cause shown; and (4) authorizing and directing the Executive Director to initiate rulemaking to provide for the One Process-One Permit Program and to enter into an Administrative Agreement with New Jersey for demonstration of the program.

The hearing also will include an opportunity for docket holders that recently received notices of violation from the Commission in connection with monitoring requirements or effluent limitations contained in their dockets to show cause why a penalty should not be assessed for the alleged violations in accordance with the provisions of Article 7 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure and Section 14.17 of the Delaware River Basin Compact. Written comments on matters scheduled for hearing on March 10, 2015, will be accepted through the close of the hearing that day. After the hearing on all scheduled matters has been completed, the meeting will include an opportunity for public dialogue.

Draft dockets and resolutions scheduled for hearing are posted on the Commission's web site at www.drbc.net 10 days prior to the hearing date. Additional public records relating to the hearing items may be examined at the Commission's offices. Contact Project Review Section assistant Victoria Lawson at (609) 883-9500, Ext. 216, with any questions concerning these items.

The public is advised to check the Commission's web site periodically prior to the hearing date, as items scheduled for hearing may be postponed if additional time is deemed necessary to complete the Commission's review. In reviewing docket descriptions, the public is also asked to be aware that project details commonly change in the course of the Commission's review, which is ongoing.

The public is advised that during the public hearing on March 10, 2015, the staff will continue the practice of offering a shorter presentation than in the past for the subset of draft dockets that consist of renewals where a project has undergone no substantive changes. Interested parties will have the same opportunity to comment on or ask questions concerning these dockets as they have historically had, and if any member of the public requests additional information about a project during the hearing, staff will be prepared to offer more detail. A detailed description of each project is included in the draft docket, which can be accessed on the Commission web site at www.drbc.net.

- 1. Exelon, D-1969-210 CP-14. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing Limerick Generating Station and its related withdrawals and discharge and to make permanent the Executive Director's temporary approval (issued by letter dated August 19, 2014) to increase consumptive water use from 24 million gallons per day (mgd) with one unit operating and 44 mgd with two units operating to 25.5 mgd and 47.3 mgd, respectively, when the ambient air temperatures are 87 degrees F. or greater. LAND RECYCLING AND **ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION**

UNDER ACT 2, 1995 PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ **6026.101—6026.907**)

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 6026.302—6026.305) requires the Department to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. A person intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard or intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area shall file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

If information concerning this acknowledgment is required in an alternative form, contact the community relations coordinator at the appropriate regional office. AIR QUALITY

PLAN APPROVAL AND OPERATING PERMIT APPLICATIONS

The Department has developed an "integrated" plan approval, State Operating Permit and Title V Operating Permit program. This integrated approach is designed to make the permitting process more efficient for the Department, the regulated community and the general public. This approach allows the owner or operator of a facility to submit permitting documents relevant to its application for all sources related to a facility or a proposed project, affords an opportunity for public input, and provides for a decision on the issuance of the necessary permits.

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. HAZARDOUS SITES CLEANUP ACT OF OCTOBER 18, 1988

Notice of Interim Response; Kuhn's Landfill; Darlington Township, Beaver County

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP"), under the authority of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act, 35 P.S. Section 6020.101 et. seq. ("HSCA"), has proposed an interim response at the Kuhn's Landfill ("Site"). The Site is located on Ridge Road in Darlington Township, Beaver County and was used for the disposal of municipal and industrial waste from approximately 1964 until 1980.

The Department's investigation of the Site has determined that certain inorganics and organics have been released at the Site which are hazardous substances as defined by the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act. These hazardous substances have been released at the Site at concentrations that exceed applicable standards. Based on these findings, the Department has determined that a response is appropriate.

The Department considered the following three alternatives to address the threats at the Site: 1) no action; 2) place a fence around contaminated soil areas, removal and disposal of gel type waste identified in the remedial investigation report; and 3) capping contaminated areas with soil, removal and disposal of gel type waste.

Alternative 3 was chosen because it complies with the applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements and is cost effective.

This notice is being provided under Section 506(b) of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act. The Administrative Record which contains information forming the basis and documenting the selection of this response action is available for public review and comment at the Department's Southwest Regional Office, 400 Waterfront Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15222 and is available for review between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. Additional Class of Disproportionate Share Payments to Certain Acute Care Hospitals

The Department of Human Services (Department) is announcing its intent to increase its funding allocation for disproportionate share hospital (DSH) payments to cer-

tain qualifying acute care general Medical Assistance (MA) hospitals to support their continued participation in the MA Program. This payment is intended to promote the availability of professional medical services to low income populations in less urbanized areas of this Commonwealth by supporting medical education and academic medical programs aimed to foster the supply of health care professionals. Availability of Pennsylvania's Statewide Transition Plan for Home and Community-Based Settings

The Department of Human Services (Department) is making available for review and public comment Pennsylvania's proposed Statewide Transition Plan for Home and Community-Based Settings. Comments received will be used to formulate Pennsylvania's Final Statewide Transition Plan that will be submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

Background

CMS published a final rule for home and community-based services (HCBS) at 79 FR 2948 (January 16, 2014) with an effective date of March 17, 2014. This final rule, among other things, amends the Medicaid regulations for HCBS waivers under section 1915(c) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.A. § 1396n(c)) to provide requirements regarding person-centered plans of care, characteristics of

settings that are home and community-based as well as settings that may not be home and community-based. See 42 CFR Parts 430, 431, 435, 436, 440, 441 and 447. These requirements reflect CMS' intent that individuals receiving services and supports through Medicaid waivers receive services in settings that are integrated in and support full access to the greater community.

All 1915(c) Medicaid waivers must comply with these requirements. In this Commonwealth there are ten 1915(c) Medicaid HCBS waivers:

- Adult Autism Waiver
- AIDS Waiver
- Aging Waiver
- Attendant Care Waiver
- COMMCARE Waiver
- Consolidated Waiver
- Independence Waiver
- Infant, Toddlers and Families Waiver
- OBRA Waiver
- Person/Family-Directed Support Waiver

The final rule recognized that a transition period may be needed for states with existing approved 1915(c) HCBS waivers to meet the provisions of the final rule. The final rule provides the Commonwealth with the opportunity to develop a transition plan that encompasses a period of up to 5 years after the effective date of the regulation to meet the provisions of the final rule. Change to an Additional Class of Disproportionate Share Payments

- (q) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a five-space horizontal, vertical or diagonal line on "CARD 5" or "CARD 6," with a red line completely covering the winning line pattern, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

- (t) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in five-space horizontal line, in the "BONUS BEELINE" area, and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area to the right of the "BONUS BEELINE" area, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (u) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a five-space horizontal, vertical or diago-

- nal line on "CARD 4," with a red line completely covering the winning line pattern, shall be entitled to a prize of \$18.
- (v) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in the 4 corners on "CARD 1," shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (w) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a five-space horizontal, vertical or diagonal line on "CARD 5" or "CARD 6," shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (x) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in five-space horizontal line, in the "BONUS BEELINE" area, and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area to the right of the "BONUS BEELINE" area, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (y) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a five-space horizontal, vertical or diagonal line on "CARD 1," "CARD 2," or "CARD 3," with a red line completely covering the winning line pattern, shall be entitled to a prize of \$9.
- (z) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a five-space horizontal, vertical or diagonal line on "CARD 4," shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.
- (aa) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in five-space horizontal line, in the "BONUS BEELINE" area, and a prize symbol of \$3.00 (THR DOL) appears in the "Prize" area to the right of the "BONUS BEELINE" area, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.
- (bb) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a five-space horizontal, vertical or diagonal line on "CARD 1," "CARD 2" or "CARD 3," shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 11. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Pennsylvania Beeline Bingo, prize money from winning Pennsylvania Beeline Bingo instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Pennsylvania Beeline Bingo instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 12. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.
- 13. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Pennsylvania Beeline Bingo or through normal communications methods.

The Moneybag symbol is a free space and when it appears in a winning pattern, the prize is multiplied by 10
- (b) Each Pennsylvania Big Money Bingo instant lottery game ticket will contain a separate "LIL' MORE BINGO" area containing nine spaces, on a 3 by 3 grid. The play symbols located in the "LIL' MORE BINGO" area are: The letter B with a number 1 through 15; the letter I with a number 16 through 30; the letter N with a number 31 through 45; the letter G with a number 46 through 60; and the letter O with a number 61 through 75. The "LIL' MORE BINGO" area is played separately.
- (c) Each ticket will also contain a "CALLER'S CARD" area. The "CALLER'S CARD" area will consist of 30 spaces on a 10 by 3 grid. Specifically, the Executive Director has amended this section to decrease the creel limit for striped bass in the River Estuary (from the Pennsylvania line upstream to Calhoun Street Bridge) during the periods January 1 through March 31 and June 1 through December 31 to one fish, and to

change the slot limit during the period April 1 through May 31 to 21 to 25 inches. The Executive Director also has amended the section to decrease the creel limit for striped bass in the Delaware River (from the Calhoun Street Bridge upstream) to one fish. This action is being taken to meet the requirements of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC).

ASMFC's management plan for striped bass calls for management actions when the coast-wide spawning stock biomass (SSB) or fishing mortality rates reach thresholds set within the management plan. The SSB threshold is 127 million pounds, and the current SSB is just above this at 128 million pounds. At the current fishing mortality rates, there is concern that the SSB will fall below the threshold in the near future. In addition to these concerns, recruitment of young fish has been relatively low in many of the years since 2004. In response to these concerns, the ASFMC Striped Bass Management Board,

which includes the Commonwealth as a member, has directed all coastal states to reduce fishing mortality rates by 25% beginning in 2015. The amendments to 58 Pa. Code § 61.2 are designed to meet this objective.

To address the coast-wide regulation directed by the ASMFC, the Commission's Executive Director has taken immediate action to make the following modifications to fishing regulation:

§ 61.2. Delaware River, West Branch Delaware River and River Estuary.

* * * * *

(d) The following seasons, sizes and creel limits apply to the Delaware River, West Branch Delaware River and Delaware River tributaries, from the mouths of the tributaries upstream to the limit of the tidal influence and the Lehigh River from its mouth upstream to the first dam in Easton, Pennsylvania:

The Executive Director has found that this action is necessary and appropriate for the management of fish and to conserve and preserve fishing opportunities. The temporary modifications will go into effect on March 1, 2015, and will remain in effect until the Commission, by appropriate action, amends 58 Pa. Code § 61.2. At its meeting on May 5, 2015, the Commission will consider the publication of a notice of proposed rulemaking containing the proposed amendments and soliciting public comments for 30 days.
