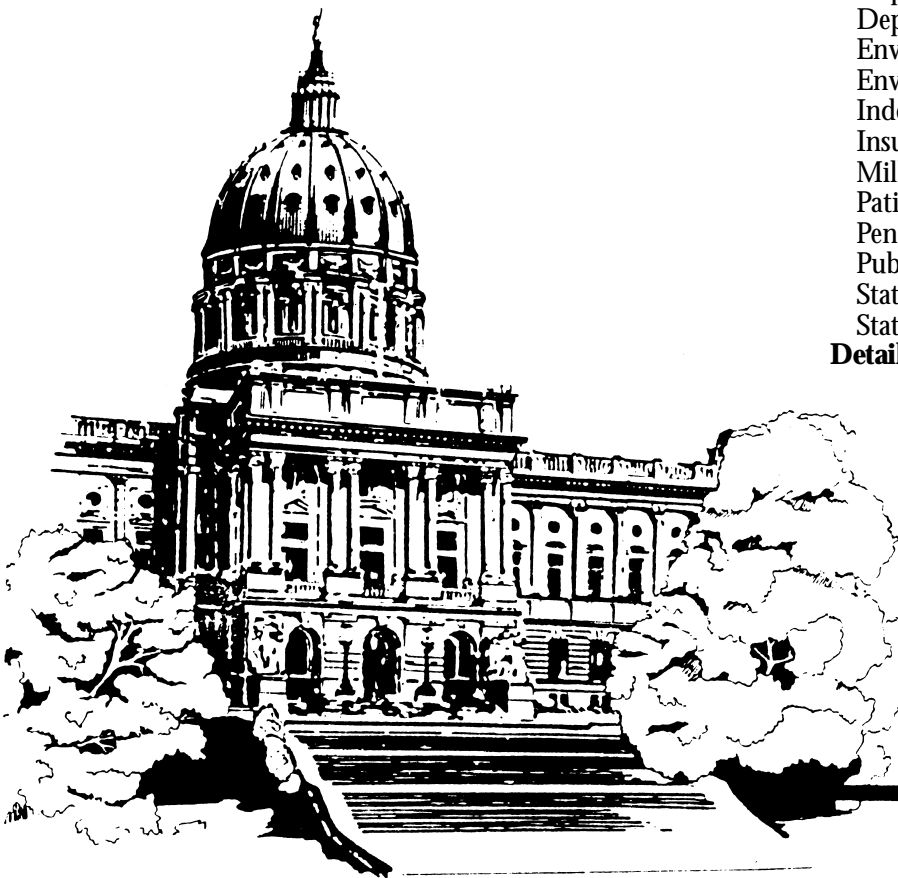

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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where “no fiscal impact” is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Order Amending Rule 314 of the Rules of Conduct, Office Standards and Civil Procedure for District Justices; No. 207 Magisterial Doc. No. 1

The Minor Court Rules Committee has prepared a Final Report explaining the amendments to Rule 314 of the Rules of Conduct, Office Standards and Civil Procedure for District Justices, effective July 1, 2004. These rule changes provide clarification regarding the costs for reinstating a civil complaint. The changes also provide for technical or "housekeeping" amendments to the rule. The Final Report follows the Court's Order.

Annex A

TITLE 246. MINOR COURT CIVIL RULES

PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 300. CIVIL ACTION

Rule 314. Return, Waiver and Failure of Service; Reinstatement.

A. The person serving the complaint shall, at or before the time of the hearing, make proof of service [**on the form provided,**] which shall show [**the manner of service, the day, hour and place thereof, and the name and relationship or title, if any, of the person on whom the copy of the complaint was served**] (1) **the manner of service,** (2) **the date, time, and place of service and,** (3) **the name and relationship or title, if any, of the person on whom the complaint was served.** The proof of service shall be [**attached to**] **filed with** the original complaint [**form**].

B. When service is made by registered or certified mail, the return receipt shall be [**attached to**] **filed with** the original complaint [**form**].

* * * * *

Official Note:

* * * * *

Subdivision E provides for the reinstatement, upon written request of the plaintiff, of a complaint that has been dismissed without prejudice for failure to make service under subdivision D. Compare Pa. R.C.P. No.

401(b). The written request for reinstatement may be in any form and may consist of a notation on the permanent copy of the complaint form, "Reinstatement of complaint requested," subscribed by the plaintiff. The district justice shall mark all copies of the reinstated complaint, "Complaint reinstated. Request for reinstatement filed on _____ (date)." If it is necessary to use a new form for the reinstated complaint, the reinstated complaint, except for service portions thereof, shall be an exact copy of the original complaint, although signatures may be typed or printed with the mark "/s/" indicating an actual signature. The language in subdivision E that a complaint may be reinstated "at any time" will permit reinstatement after a faulty service without waiting for further proceedings in the case. Reinstatement must occur within the period of the statute of limitations from the date of the last filing or reinstatement. [**Since a reinstated complaint is merely a continuation of the original action, there is no filing fee for reinstating a complaint. However**] **The cost for reinstating a complaint is specified in Section 1725.1 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 1725.1. In addition,** there may be additional server costs for service of the reinstated complaint.

FINAL REPORT¹

Amendment to Pa. R.C.P.D.J. No. 314

Clarification Regarding Costs for Reinstating a Complaint; Technical Amendments

On April 22, 2004, effective July 1, 2004, upon recommendation of the Minor Court Rules Committee,² the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania amended Rule 314 of the Rules of Conduct, Office Standards and Civil Procedure for District Justices.³

The Committee reviewed the Note to Pa. R.C.P.D.J. No. 314 in response to an inquiry. It was reported to the Committee that there may be confusion among the district justice courts as to what costs, if any, are to be charged when a civil complaint is reinstated pursuant to Rule 314E. The Committee recognized that the Official Note to Rule 314, prior to this amendment, provided that, "[s]ince a reinstated complaint is merely a continuation of the original action, there is no filing fee for reinstating a complaint." Pa. R.C.P.D.J. No. 314, Official Note. While this statement is technically correct, the Committee further recognized that Section 1725.1(a)(10) of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 1725.1(a)(10), specifies costs for the reinstatement of a complaint.⁴

Accordingly, the Committee recommended that the Official Note to Rule 314 be revised to remove any confusion about the costs for reinstatement of a civil complaint. The revised Official Note will now read, in pertinent part, "[t]he cost for reinstating a complaint is specified in Section 1725.1 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 1725.1."

In addition, the Committee recommended several technical or "housekeeping" amendments to subdivisions A and B of the rule. Specifically, in subdivision A, the Committee recommended that the list of contents of the return of service be enumerated to enhance readability.

Also, in subdivisions A and B, the Committee recommended that the requirement that items be "attached to" the original complaint be deleted. This requirement is unnecessary and not in keeping with actual practice in the district justice courts.

Annex A

TITLE 246. MINOR COURT CIVIL RULES

PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 400. EXECUTION OF JUDGMENTS FOR THE PAYMENT OF MONEY

Rule 420. Determination of Property Claims and Disputes.

* * * * *

B. In acting under subdivision A of this rule, the district justice may:

(1) Reappraise or redesignate property appraised or designated by the executing officer, or order inclusion in the levy of property set aside by that officer.

(2) **[Stay or order] Order** the abandonment of the levy in whole or part, or release property from the levy.

* * * * *

Official Note: [Subdivisions] Subdivision A [and B] of this rule [set] sets forth the various disputes concerning the execution [which] that, along with property claims, [the district justice is to hear and determine and what he may do in connection therewith] may be brought before the district justice. Subdivision B sets forth the relief that the district justice may grant in connection with these disputes. The [subsections of A and B should] provi-

sions of this rule can be compared with the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure as follows:

* * * * *

This rule does not provide for a preliminary determination by the executing officer as to the merits of a property claim by a third party (see Pa. R.C.P. Nos. 3206, 3207), for it was considered that the district justice should be readily available for this purpose and that it would not be desirable to allow constables to make any such determination. Also, it was thought to be permissible to require the district justice to make the determinations and to take the actions mentioned in this rule as an exercise of power ancillary to [his] the district justice's general power to order execution of the judgment. Subdivision C of the rule is based on Pa. R.C.P. No. 3132.

FINAL REPORT¹

Amendment to Pa. R.C.P.D.J. No. 420

Clarification Regarding the Relief a District Justice May Grant in Connection with Objections to Levy

On April 22, 2004, effective July 1, 2004, upon recommendation of the Minor Court Rules Committee,² the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania amended Rule 420 of the Rules of Conduct, Office Standards and Civil Procedure for District Justices.³

The Committee reviewed Pa. R.C.P.D.J. No. 420 when, in the course of designing and revising forms relating to other rule changes, it was brought to the Committee's attention that the language in Rule 420B(2) was causing confusion about the relief that a district justice may grant in connection with an objection to levy. Specifically, Rule 420B(2), prior to this amendment, referred to a "[s]tay . . . of the levy . . ." The Committee noted that a stay issued in accordance with Rule 410, a supersedeas, or a bankruptcy stay, will stay the entire execution. And, the Committee further noted that such a stay may take effect prior to the executing officer making a levy upon the defendant's property. However, the Committee could not contemplate any procedural occurrence in which the limited relief of staying the levy itself would be necessary or appropriate. The Committee also noted that, as a form of relief in connection with an objection to levy, a stay of the levy is procedurally impossible. In order for an objection to a levy to be raised, the levy must necessarily have already occurred. In such a situation, the appropriate relief may be a stay of the sale, which is provided for in Rule 420B(3).

Accordingly, the Committee recommended that Rule 420B(2) be amended to delete the reference to a stay, and thus remove any confusion about the relief that a district justice may grant in connection with an objection to levy.

In addition, the Committee recommended other minor revisions to the Official Note to address gender neutrality issues and to enhance clarity.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Title 49—PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL STANDARDS

STATE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY [49 PA. CODE CH. 7]

Deletion of Examination Fees

The State Board of Cosmetology (Board) amends §§ 7.2, 7.31, 7.32a and 7.32g to read as set forth in Annex A.

A. *Effective Date*

The final-form rulemaking is effective upon final-form publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

B. *Statutory Authority*

Section 11 of the act of May 3, 1933 (P. L. 242, No. 86) (Act 86) (63 P. S. § 517) authorizes the Board to promulgate regulations for “the examination and licensing of applicants to practice or teach cosmetology . . . and generally for the conduct of persons, copartnerships, associations or corporations” affected by Act 86.

Section 12 of Act 86 (63 P. S. § 518) prescribes the time, place and materials for examinations for licensure. Section 13(b) of Act 86 (63 P. S. § 519(b)) requires the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs to contract with a professional testing organization to prepare and administer examinations in accordance with section 812.1(a) of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 279.3a(a)). Under section 812.1(b) of The Administrative Code of 1929, each board has the discretionary power to charge a fee for the administration of and cost of each examination. Section 812.1(c) of The Administrative Code of 1929 defines cost as “all contractual charges relating to the preparation, administration, preparing, administering, grading and recording of the examination.”

C. *Background and Need for the Final-Form Rulemaking*

The final-form rulemaking deletes references to the fees for the theory and performance examination for cosmetologists, cosmeticians, manicurists and teachers and the theory examination for managers. These fees are set by the administrators of the examinations, not by the Board. To avoid the necessity of amending the regulations whenever the examination administrator changes the fees, the Board is deleting the examination fees from its schedule of fees. In addition, references to the examination fees contained in other sections were amended to clarify that applicants are still required to submit the examination fees set by the professional testing organization with their applications.

D. *Description of Amendments*

Section 7.2 (relating to fees) has been amended to delete references to the fees for the theory and performance examination for cosmetologists, cosmeticians, manicurists and teachers and the theory examination for managers. These fees are set by the professional testing organizations.

Section 7.31 (relating to examination prerequisite for licensure; exception) has been amended to clarify that applicants are required to pass the examination required by the Board, rather than given by the Board. The Board

contracts with a professional testing organization to give the various licensure examinations.

Sections 7.32a and 7.32g (relating to contents of examination application; and issuance of temporary licenses to qualified examination applicants) have been amended to make it clear that the applications are to be accompanied by the examination fee set by the professional testing organization.

E. *Comment and Regulatory Review of the Proposed Rulemaking*

Publication of proposed rulemaking at 31 Pa.B. 5713 (October 13, 2001) was followed by a 30-day public comment period during which the Board received no public comments. One public comment supporting the proposed rulemaking was received during the pre-draft period.

Following the close of the public comment period, the Board received comments from the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC). The Board did not receive comments from the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee or the House Professional Licensure Committee.

The following are the Board’s responses to the comments submitted by IRRC.

1. IRRC pointed out that § 7.32a requires applications to include the examination fees prescribed by § 7.2. In response to IRRC’s comment, the Board has amended this section to eliminate the cross reference to the examination fees in § 7.2 and to require the application to include the examination fee set by the professional testing organization. Applicants will continue to submit the examination fees to the Board with their applications.

2. Section 7.32g(a) requires payment of the examination and license fees prescribed in § 7.2. This section has been amended to eliminate the cross reference to the examination fees in § 7.2 and to clarify that the applicant needs to pay the examination fee set by the professional testing organization. IRRC suggested that the Board delete the references to examination fees throughout the entire chapter. However, the Board believes it is necessary to clarify through regulation that satisfaction of the examination fee is still required before a license may be issued.

3. IRRC also noted that § 7.31(a) requires applicants to “pass the examination given by the Board for that license.” IRRC suggested that, as the professional testing organization gives the examination and charges the fees for that service, that the subsection should be rewritten to read “. . . shall pass the examination required by the Board for that license.” The Board agrees and has amended the subsection as suggested.

F. *Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements*

The final-form rulemaking will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The final-form rulemaking will impose no additional paperwork requirements upon the Commonwealth, political subdivisions or the private sector.

G. *Sunset Date*

The Board continuously monitors the cost effectiveness of its regulation. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

H. *Regulatory Review*

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on September 27, 2001, the Board submitted a copy of the notice of proposed rulemaking, published at 31 Pa.B. 5713, to IRRC and the Chairpersons of the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee and the House Professional Licensure Committee for review and comment.

Under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC and the House and Senate Committees were provided with copies of the comments received during the public comment period, as well as other documents when requested. In preparing the final-form rulemaking, the Department has considered all comments from IRRC, the House and Senate Committees and the public.

Under section 5.1(j.2) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(j.2)), on December 16, 2003, the final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the House and Senate Committees. Under section 5.1(e) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC met on December 18, 2003, and approved the final-form rulemaking.

J. *Findings*

The Board finds that:

(1) Public notice of proposed rulemaking was given under sections 201 and 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P. L. 769, No. 240) (45 P. S. §§ 1201 and 1202) and the regulations promulgated thereunder, 1 Pa. Code §§ 7.1 and 7.2.

(2) A public comment period was provided as required by law and all comments were considered.

(3) This final-form rulemaking does not enlarge the purpose of proposed rulemaking published at 31 Pa.B. 5713.

(4) This final-form rulemaking is necessary and appropriate for administering and enforcing the authorizing act identified in Part B of this preamble.

EXAMINATIONS

§ 7.31. **Examination prerequisite for licensure; exception.**

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), an individual who wants to obtain a teacher's, manager's, cosmetologist's, cosmetician's or manicurist's license listed in §§ 7.12—7.15 shall pass the examination required by the Board for that license.

(b) An individual who meets the criteria for licensure by reciprocity under section 9 of the act (63 P. S. § 515) may obtain a license without examination.

§ 7.32a. **Contents of examination application.**

(a) The application of a first-time examinee shall include the following:

(1) Proof of having met the requirements for the examination applied for as set forth in §§ 7.32b—7.32f.

(2) A physician's certification that the applicant is free from contagious, communicable or infectious diseases.

(3) The examination fee set by the professional testing organization and the license fee prescribed in § 7.2 (relating to fees).

(b) The application of a reexaminee shall be accompanied by the examination fee set by the professional testing organization.

§ 7.32g. Issuance of temporary licenses to qualified examination applicants.

(a) A temporary license may be issued to an applicant who is eligible for admission to the cosmetologist's or manicurist's examination and who pays the examination fee set by the professional testing organization and the

license fee prescribed in § 7.2 (relating to fees). The purpose of a temporary license is to allow an otherwise qualified applicant to practice pending the applicant's scoring a passing grade on the examination.

(b) A temporary license is valid for 9 months or until the next examination, whichever comes first.

(c) The holder of a temporary cosmetologist's license shall practice under the supervision of a licensed teacher, manager or cosmetologist. The holder of a temporary manicurist's license shall practice under the supervision of a licensed teacher, manager or cosmetologist.

Plum Pox Virus Voluntary Commercial Orchard Fruit Tree Indemnity Program

The Department of Agriculture (Department) establishes the procedures and requirements under which it awards grants under the Plum Pox Virus Voluntary Commercial Orchard Fruit Tree Indemnity Program (program). This new program is similar to the Plum Pox Virus Commercial Orchard Fruit Tree Indemnity Program; however: (1) participation is completely voluntary on the part of the participant; and (2) the amount of the Department's indemnity payment for lost fruit production differs.

Authority and Funding

The program will be funded through annual appropriations of funds to the Department for fruit tree indemnity payments related to the Plum Pox Virus (PPV) and costs related to disease eradication and other prevention and control measures, as well as through authorizations to retain and spend previously appropriated funds for this same purpose.

Background

PPV is a serious plant pest that injures and damages stone fruits such as peaches, nectarines, cherries, plums and apricots by drastically reducing the fruit yields from these stone fruit trees and by disfiguring the fruit to the point it is unmarketable. PPV has the potential to cause serious damage to the stone fruit production and stone fruit nursery industries in this Commonwealth. PPV is transmitted from infected trees by aphids and by budding or grafting with PPV-infected plant material. There is no known control for PPV other than the destruction of infected trees. PPV is not known to exist anywhere in the United States except in parts of Adams, Cumberland, Franklin and York Counties.

The Plant Pest Act (act) (3 P.S. §§ 258.1—258.27) provides the Department broad authority with respect to the identification, containment and eradication of plant pests in this Commonwealth. Under authority of the act, the Department has established PPV-related quarantines in parts of Adams, Cumberland, Franklin and York Counties. There are a number of commercial stone fruit production orchards within the quarantined area. Where PPV has been detected in a commercial stone fruit orchard or where the orchard is near a location where PPV is known to be present, the Department has ordered the destruction and removal of the stone fruit trees and prohibited replanting of stone fruit trees until the quarantine is rescinded.

From 2000 to 2003, staff from the Department and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) have conducted extensive surveys for the virus throughout this Commonwealth and in particular in the four counties currently under the PPV quarantine. The aggressive nature of the eradication program has drastically decreased the amount of virus present in the quarantine area. A small amount of PPV remains in the quarantine area, though. This fact, coupled with the latent nature of the virus, has compelled the Department to seek avenues

to speed up the eradication program and bring it to a timely and successful conclusion.

The Department feels that another program is needed to increase the opportunity to eradicate the virus in that portion of the PPV quarantine area where the greatest number of PPV-infected commercial stone fruit trees have been found (the core area). The core area consists of the following contiguous townships in Adams, Cumberland and York Counties:

Adams County: Huntington, Latimore, Menallen and Tyrone Townships

Cumberland County: Dickinson and South Middleton Townships

York County: Franklin and Washington Townships.

Approximately 225 acres of commercial stone fruit trees remain in the core area, including 75 acres that are 15 years of age or older. According to information furnished by the National Plum Pox Virus Science Issues Working Group (SIWG), these blocks constitute a serious threat to the stone fruit industry because of their old age and declining vigor. The SIWG has stated that, based on the best scientific information available, PPV is more difficult to detect in older trees due to the slower growth rate of these trees. The presence of these older trees will prolong or thwart the PPV eradication program. Trees that are younger than 15 years, but that are commingled among the older trees, are considered a part of the condemned block, since they must be considered to have been exposed to trees that may already be infected with PPV.

Unlike other programs administered by the Department to address the current PPV outbreak, this program does not have USDA partnership or financial assistance. The Department's obligations for this voluntary program, reimbursement for costs associated with removal and destruction, replanting, vector control and herbicide application shall be identical to those outlined in the program. Other costs shall include payment for up to 3 years of indemnities for lost fruit production at the rate of 70% of the value of that lost fruit production, as listed in the following chart.

The program's reimbursement formula assumes that affected commercial stone fruit orchards cannot be replanted with stone fruit trees for a minimum of 1 year after removal and destruction of the trees at the order of the Department. Growers will have the option of choosing to receive an indemnity payment for 1, 2 or 3 years of lost fruit production at the rate of 70% of the value of that lost fruit production, as listed in the following chart.

The remaining, younger stone fruit trees in the core area also represent a threat to a timely conclusion to the eradication program. The Department will make a one-time offer for voluntary removal and destruction of trees younger than 15 years of age. The compensation rate for these trees shall be a 15% indemnity payment for 3 years of lost fruit production. Reimbursement for costs associated with removal and destruction, replanting, vector control and herbicide application shall be identical to those outlined in the program.

Reimbursement Formula

The following table shall be used to compute the value of the indemnity payment:

Obtaining an Application

A person seeking a grant under the new program for voluntary removal and destruction of these older trees shall apply for the grant using an application/agreement form provided by the Department.

Contents of Application

An application for a reimbursement grant for economic losses relating to the voluntary removal of the blocks containing older trees will require the following information of an applicant:

1. The name, address and Federal tax identification number (or Social Security number) of the applicant.
2. Verification that the applicant is an owner of the destroyed stone fruit orchard.

3. A listing of the block numbers of the destroyed stone fruit orchard with respect to which a grant is sought.

4. The stone fruit tree acreage figures described in paragraph 3.

5. A signature acknowledging that representations made in the application are true, and further acknowledging that the criminal punishments and penalties of 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities) apply to any false statement made in the application.

Review of Applications

The Department will review and approve or disapprove complete, timely grant applications within 30 days of receipt. The Department will stamp or otherwise identify each grant application to record the date and the order in which the applications are received. The Department will consider grant applications in the order they are received. The Department will approve a grant application if the following criteria are met:

1. The application is complete and provides the Department all the information necessary to a reasoned review of the document.

2. There are sufficient unencumbered funds available for fruit tree indemnity payments regarding PPV and costs related to disease eradication and other prevention and control measures to fund the grant amount sought in the reimbursement grant application.

Notice of Decision

The Department will, within 10 days of completing its review, inform (whether by mail or other means) a grant applicant of whether the grant application is approved or disapproved. If the application is disapproved, the written notice will specify the basis for disapproval.

No Right or Entitlement to Funds

The appropriation or availability of funds for fruit tree indemnity payments regarding PPV and costs regarding disease eradication and other prevention and control measures does not create in a person a right or entitlement to a grant from these funds. Departmental approval of a grant application is the event that establishes entitlement of the applicant to the grant funds sought, provided appropriated funds are available in an amount adequate to fund the grant.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995

PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302—305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the Background Standard, Statewide Health Standard, the Site-Specific Standard or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a Site-Specific Standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality within which the site is located may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made

within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

For further information concerning the content of a Notice of Intent to Remediate, contact the environmental cleanup program manager in the Department regional office before which the notice appears. If information concerning this acknowledgment is required in an alternative form, contact the community relations coordinator at the appropriate regional office. The "dust bunker" is a roofed 20-foot by 20-foot square concrete block structure into which dust is deposited by various pieces of process equipment and air cleaning devices. The applicant proposes to ventilate the dust bunker through a new fabric collector to control the emission of fugitive particulate matter which heretofore have periodically been observed emanating from the dust bunker. The fugitive particulate matter emissions from the dust bunker are expected to decrease by an unknown amount as a result of the collector's installation and the particulate matter emissions from the collector exhaust are expected to be no greater than .2 pound per hour.

The applicant also proposes to divert a portion of the dust now entering the dust bunker into a different bin

and will install a diverter valve and cyclone separator to accomplish this. The particulate matter emissions from the bin to which the dust will be diverted are currently controlled by, and will continue to be controlled by, a fabric collector. No change is expected in the particulate matter emission rate from this bin or the associated fabric collector.

The Department's review of the information submitted by Meckley's Limestone Products, Inc. indicates that the installation of the fabric collector on the dust bunker will meet applicable air quality requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants as will the installation of the diverter valve and cyclone separator. This includes the best available technology requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12. Based on this finding, the Department proposes to issue plan approval. Additionally, if plan approval is issued and the dust bunker, and the like, is found to be operating in compliance with all conditions of the plan approval as well as all applicable regulatory requirements, the conditions of the plan approval will be incorporated into Operating Permit 49-00054 by means of an administrative amendment in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 127.450.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department proposed to place into the plan approval to be issued to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

1. All material deposited in the dust bunker shall be wetted in a pug mill or mixer.
2. Whenever material is being deposited in the dust bunker, the dust bunker shall be ventilated through a C. P. E. Filters Model 84 BF 042 C fabric collector. The particulate matter concentration in the exhaust of the collector shall not exceed .01 grain per dry standard cubic foot and there shall be no visible air contaminant emissions other than water vapor or steam.
3. The air compressor used to supply air to the C. P. E. Filters Model 84 BF 042 C fabric collector shall be equipped with an air dryer and an oil trap.
4. The C. P. E. Filters Model 84 BF 042 C fabric collector shall be equipped with instrumentation to continuously monitor the pressure differential across the collector.
5. Spare bags shall be kept onsite for the C. P. E. Filters Model 84 BF 042 C fabric collector.
6. The access doors to the dust bunker shall be kept closed at all times except when removing material from the dust bunker with a front-end loader.
7. The cyclone separator shall be exhausted into stone bin no. 2.
8. The Eastern Control Systems, Inc. Model 315-10 fabric collector used to control the particulate matter emissions from stone bin no. 2 shall continue to be subject to all of the requirements to which it is currently subject to under Operating Permit 49-00054.

HAZARDOUS SITES CLEANUP UNDER THE ACT OF OCTOBER 18, 1988

Prompt Interim Response

Reading Industrial Scrap, Inc. Site, Reading City, Muhlenberg Township, Berks County

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), under the authority of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (HSCA) (35 P. S. §§ 6020.101—6020.1305), has initiated a prompt interim response at Reading Industrial Scrap, Inc. (RISCO). This response has been initiated under sections 501(a) and 505(b) of the HSCA (35 P. S. §§ 6020.501(a) and 6020.505(b)).

The RISCO Site is off Route 61 along Berks Street in the City of Reading and Muhlenberg Township, Berks County. The address of the property is listed as 2001 Centre Avenue, Reading, PA 19605. The RISCO Site can be found on the USGS Elverson Pennsylvania Quadrangle map at north 40° 22' 6.3" latitude and west 75° 55' 48.3" longitude. The RISCO Site is in an industrialized area. The original property was 26 acres in size. The current disposal area covers approximately 3 acres.

Access to the RISCO Site is currently unrestricted. Several area major roadways frame the RISCO Site, including Route 61 to the west and Route 222 to the north. A set of railroad tracks lies along the eastern perimeter, a commercial building along the western perimeter, an industrial building along the southern perimeter and a large excavated pit is inside the northern perimeter of the RISCO Site. A large pile of heavily damaged drums containing a tar-like substance, exposed waste, soil, rock and contaminated debris is in the center of the RISCO Site. The material in this pile was previously determined to be characteristically hazardous for lead.

Lead is a hazardous waste as defined under the Solid Waste Management Act (35 P. S. §§ 6018.101—6018.1003) and a hazardous substance as defined under section 103 of the HSCA (35 P. S. § 6020.103). Lead is an inorganic compound that is listed as a probable carcinogen. Lead is toxic by ingestion and inhalation and chronic cumulative effects of lead are exhibited in the body's nervous system.

Based on the past history of disposal activities at the RISCO Site, it is anticipated that the remaining unexcavated area contains waste with similar hazardous substances. The RISCO Site is not secure and is open to trespass. The waste in the open pit and the surface piles of waste, contain hazardous substances that pose a direct contact threat. The excavated areas pose a safety risk and the remaining buried waste containing hazardous substances creates a possible threat to the groundwater. An initial response by the Department is deemed appropriate to secure the RISCO Site to prevent direct contact health

threats to the public and promote public safety by preventing unrestricted access to the RISCO Site.

The Department proposes a prompt interim response at the RISCO Site to protect public health and safety or the environment. This determination is based upon the following conditions that exist at the RISCO Site: (a) the actual or potential exposure by means of inhalation, ingestion and dermal contact to hazardous substances; and (b) public safety issues relative to an open excavation approximately 30 feet in depth.

A prompt interim action is justified to remove the current exposure risks posed through releases of hazardous substances and contaminants and to prevent unrestricted access to excavated areas at the RISCO Site. This response should not be delayed for the length of time that it would take to develop and close an administrative record. This response will cost less than \$2 million and take less than 1 year to implement.

This response is not a final remedial response under section 504 of the HSCA (35 P. S. § 6020.504) and therefore is not required to meet the cleanup standards that apply to final responses. Additional response action may be needed to achieve a complete and final cleanup for the RISCO Site.

The Department considered two alternatives:

1. No action for the contaminated soil or waste and would involve no action by the Department at the RISCO Site and is retained as a baseline for comparison with other alternatives. Under this alternative, the Department would take no further action at the RISCO Site. The RISCO Site would not be secured to prevent unrestricted access. Surface stockpiled waste and soil containing hazardous substances and contaminants would not be removed. This alternative would not remove the actual or potential exposure threat posed by the contaminated media and waste and would not be protective of the public health and safety. This alternative would not comply with ARARs and not be protective of human health and the environment. The present cost of this alternative is \$0.

2. Secure the RISCO Site with fencing and remove stockpiled hazardous waste and contaminated media. This alternative will comply with ARARs and is protective of human health and safety and the environment. The estimated cost of implementing this alternative is \$417,165.08.

The Department has selected Alternative 2 because it is protective, cost effective and meets substantive regulatory requirements. The proposed response is necessary based on current RISCO Site conditions.

The Department is providing this notice under section 505(b) of the HSCA and section 506(b) of the HSCA (35 P. S. § 6020.506(b) and the publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* starts the administrative record period under the HSCA. The Administrative Record, which contains information about the RISCO Site and supports the Department's decision to perform this action at the RISCO Site, is available for public review and comment. The Administrative Record can be examined Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Southcentral Regional Office, 909 Elmerton Avenue, Harrisburg, PA 17110 by contacting David Hrobuchak, (717) 705-4843. The Administrative Record can also be reviewed from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Reading District Office, 1050 Crossroads Boulevard, Reading, PA by contacting Thomas Grubb at (610) 916-0100.

The Administrative Record will be open for comment from the date of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and will remain open for 90 days. Persons may submit written comments regarding this action to the Department before August 9, 2004, by sending them to David Hrobuchak, Southcentral Regional Office, 909 Elmerton Avenue, Harrisburg, PA 17110-8200.

The public will have an opportunity to present oral comments regarding the proposed action at a public hearing scheduled for June 9, 2004, at 7 p.m. at the Reading District Office. LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995

PREAMBLE 2

The following plans and reports were submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Provisions of Chapter 3 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a notice of submission of plans and reports. A final report is submitted to document cleanup of a release of a regulated substance at a site to one of the act's remediation standards. A final report provides a description of the site investigation to characterize the nature and extent of contaminants in environmental media, the basis for selecting the environmental media of concern, documentation supporting the selection of residential or nonresidential exposure factors, a description of the remediation performed and summaries of sampling analytical results which demonstrate that remediation has attained the cleanup standard selected. Submission of plans and reports, other than the final report, shall also be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. These include the remedial investigation report, risk assessment report and cleanup plan for a site-specific standard remediation. A remedial investigation report includes conclusions from the site investigation, concentration of regulated substances in environmental media; benefits of refuse of the property and, in some circumstances, a fate and transport analysis. If required, a risk assessment report describes potential adverse effects caused by the presence of regulated substances. If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements.

PREAMBLE 3

If required, a risk assessment report describes potential adverse effects caused by the presence of regulated substances. If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. A work plan for conducting a baseline remedial investigation is required by provisions of the act for compliance with selection of a special industrial area remediation. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Availability of Draft Hazardous Waste Facilities Plan

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) and the Environmental Quality Board (Board) will hold a public information meeting and a public hearing regarding the Department's draft Hazardous Waste Facilities Plan (plan). On April 20, 2004, the Board accepted the draft plan under the Solid Waste Management Act (act) (35 P. S. §§ 6018.101—6018.1003).

The plan is a requirement of the act and must be updated no less than every 5 years. Upon the Board's final approval, this version of the plan will update and replace the plan adopted by the Board on July 21, 1998. The objective of the plan is to determine whether additional treatment and disposal capacity is needed to properly manage hazardous waste generated in this Commonwealth. As such, the plan addresses: criteria and standards for siting hazardous waste treatment and disposal facilities, which were established in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 269 in 1986; sources of hazardous waste concentration and current hazardous waste practices; future hazardous waste facility needs; source reduction; and identification of additional hazardous waste treatment and disposal facilities and their locations, if needed. The first plan was developed in 1986, followed by updates in 1992 and 1998.

The plan is one of the factors that the Board would evaluate in determining whether a Certificate of Public Necessity (CPN) can be issued. If the plan finds that new hazardous waste management capacity is needed, and the other factors of public participation and impact are addressed, the act empowers the Board to issue a CPN, which overrides local zoning and other restrictions. The amount of hazardous waste sent to commercial facilities from generators in this Commonwealth has been steadily declining since 1989, and that trend is expected to continue. In addition, generators have adequate access to technology that reduces or eliminates hazardous waste generation, and there is adequate commercial treatment and disposal capacity available. As a result, the plan concludes that the issuance of a CPN to provide additional hazardous waste management options to genera-

tors in this Commonwealth is not necessary. The CPN regulations are in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 269a, Subchapter B (relating to certificates of public necessity).

Public Information Meeting

The Department will hold a public information meeting for the purpose of discussing the draft plan and answering questions. No formal record of questions or comments will be kept at this public information meeting. The public information meeting will be held at 7 p.m. on Monday, June 14, 2004, in Room 105, Rachel Carson State Office Building, 400 Market Street, Harrisburg, PA.

 The net payment date stated on the business' invoice.

A 15-day grace period after the required payment date is provided to the Commonwealth by the Act.
