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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

## ***Pennsylvania Bulletin***

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

## **Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations**

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

*Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

## **Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin***

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

## ***Pennsylvania Code***

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

## **How to Find Documents**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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### Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

### Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

## GOVERNOR'S OFFICE

### Proclamation Declaration of Drought Emergency in the Commonwealth and Implementing Measures

*Whereas*, a long and continuing period of unusually dry weather, abnormally low stream flows, and reduced groundwater levels have resulted in shortages of water supplies within Pennsylvania; and

*Whereas*, in accordance with criteria established by the Commonwealth Emergency Operations Plan for natural resource shortages, a review of climatic, hydrologic, and water supply conditions indicate the existence of a drought and water shortage emergency in Pennsylvania; and

*Whereas*, these conditions and water shortages may endanger the health, safety, and welfare of a significant number of Pennsylvania citizens, threaten our natural resources, and have created and threaten to create problems greater in scope than municipal and county governments alone may resolve; and

*Whereas*, conservation measures are necessary to reduce the severity of these water shortfalls and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of affected citizens in Pennsylvania;

*Therefore*, I, Thomas J. Ridge, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution, the Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa.C.S.A. Section 7101 et seq., as amended, and other laws of the Commonwealth, do hereby declare, order, direct, and certify as follows:

1. A state of drought and water shortage emergency exists in all of the following counties: Bedford, Blair, Cambria, Cameron, Clarion, Clearfield, Crawford, Elk, Jefferson, Lycoming, Snyder and Somerset. These counties constitute the designated drought emergency area.

2. I hereby transfer up to \$500,000 in unused appropriated funds to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency. The aforementioned funds shall be used for drought-related expenses incurred by various state agencies and departments. These funds shall be credited to a special account established by the Office of the Budget. All Commonwealth agencies purchasing supplies or services in response to this drought emergency are authorized to utilize the emergency procurement procedures set forth in Section 516 of the Commonwealth Procurement Code. Act of May 15, 1998, P. L. 358, No. 57, § 516. This Proclamation shall serve as the written determination of the basis for the emergency under Section 516.

3. During the period of this drought and water shortage emergency, the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency and Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council are authorized and directed to do the following:

a. implement the regulations set forth in 4 Pa. Code Chapters 118, 119, and 120, consistent with the provisions of the Pennsylvania Emergency Operations Plan and all other applicable state, county, and municipal disaster emergency management plans;

b. prohibit and restrict nonessential uses of water;

c. require the submission of drought and water shortage contingency plans by public water supply agencies located within the designated drought emergency area in cooperation with the governing body of each political subdivision where they provide services;

d. provide for contingency plans to conserve water and energy through the reduction of major water uses, where necessary, within the designated drought emergency area in Pennsylvania;

e. require the development and adoption of local water rationing plans, as defined in 4 Pa. Code Chapter 120, by water purveyors, public water supply

agencies and governing bodies of political subdivisions within the designated drought emergency area, when deemed necessary to meet local conditions; and

f. require the development and adoption of contingency plans by self supplied commercial and industrial water risers in cooperation with local governing bodies that will provide for the reduction of major water users where necessary, through the mandatory implementation of specific water conservation measures within the designated drought emergency area.

4. The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection is authorized to issue orders or take other appropriate actions to do the following:

a. order temporary modification of conditions in existing water withdrawal permits, including restrictions in the timing or quantity of water use;

b. supervise the storage and release of water in public and private reservoir facilities subject to State regulation;

c. require emergency and permanent interconnection of public and private water systems and prescribe the delivery of water through such interconnections;

d. regulate the diversion and withdrawal of water in the designated drought emergency area in excess of such quantities as may be prescribed by order or regulation, including the establishment of requirements for emergency withdrawal permits; and

e. cooperate with the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency and Federal agencies responsible for operation of Federal Reservoir facilities to develop and implement emergency schedules for storage and release of water.

5. The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, the Public Utility Commission, and all other agencies of the Commonwealth are authorized, ordered and directed to adopt and enforce such rules, regulations or orders as necessary to carry out their respective responsibilities and functions under this Proclamation, to adopt, amend and enforce such rules, regulations or orders under their respective statutory authorities as may be reasonably necessary to assist in responding to this water shortage, and to cooperate with all applicable River Basin Commissions in implementing and enforcing the drought and water shortage emergency orders and measures undertaken by those Commissions.

6. The Commonwealth Drought Coordinator, appointed under the provisions of the Commonwealth Emergency Operations Plan, is authorized and directed to carry out all functions, duties and responsibilities specified by the Plan and this Proclamation, and generally to assist the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency in coordinating and directing State Agency response to the drought emergency. The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council shall review the actions of the Commonwealth Drought Coordinator.

7. Each public water supply agency located within the designated drought emergency area is hereby directed to develop a contingency plan in cooperation with the local governing body where it provides services in order to balance demand and available supplies and to assure that sufficient water is available to preserve public health and safety. The contingency plan shall establish equitable water use restrictions for residential, commercial, industrial and other water uses together with appropriate implementing arrangements. The contingency plan must be completed and submitted to the Department of Environmental Protection within thirty (30) days of the date of this Proclamation. If a public water supply agency has a contingency plan, it shall review the plan in cooperation with the local governing body for coordination purposes. The plan review shall be completed within thirty (30) days of the date of this Proclamation and the Department of Environmental Protection notified of such action.

8. The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency is directed to activate and coordinate state agencies and intergovernmental compliance and conservation efforts. The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council is authorized to adopt and promulgate Local Water Rationing Plans, in accordance with the following:

a. As part of its drought contingency plan, each public water supply agency or water purveyor located within the designated drought emergency area is hereby authorized to develop a Local Water Rationing Plan in cooperation with the local governing body as may be necessary to balance demand and available supplies and to assure that sufficient water is available to preserve public health and safety. The Local Water Rationing Plan, as described in 4 Pa. Code Chapter 120, may:

(1) prohibit nonessential water uses, and

(2) establish equitable water use restrictions for residential, commercial, industrial and other water uses together with appropriate implementing arrangements.

b. Each public water supply agency located within the designated drought emergency area may prepare and submit its Local Water Rationing Plan, as part of its contingency plan to the local governing body in which it supplies water. The local governing body shall review and finalize concurrence of the Rationing Plan and contingency plans as required by Paragraph 7 above, and shall submit the plan to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council for its review and approval within thirty (30) days of the date of this Proclamation.

c. Any measures, rules, restrictions or orders contained in a Local Water Rationing Plan that may be developed by public water supply agencies and/or political subdivisions, pursuant to this Proclamation, shall be enforceable only upon submission to and adoption by the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council, without limitation on any other remedies which may be available for noncompliance with such measures, rules, restrictions and orders.

d. It shall be the duty of every person in, or doing business in, the designated drought emergency area; the officers, agencies and employees of every public water supply agency; the members of the governing bodies and the officials, agents and employees of every political subdivision in the designated drought emergency area; and the officers and employees of all State agencies, to cooperate fully in all matters concerning this water shortage, and faithfully to exercise their respective duties and responsibilities to respond to the water shortage as set forth in this Proclamation and each Local Water Rationing Plan which may be developed.

9. For the purpose of promulgating or amending rules, regulations, and Local Water Rationing Plans authorized and directed by this Proclamation, such rules, regulations and plans may be adopted and rendered effective pursuant to the expedited procedures in sections 203 and 204 of the Commonwealth Documents Law Act of July 31, 1968, P. L. 769, No. 240, as amended, (45 P. S. §§ 1203, 1204) (relating to omission of proposed rule-making) and pursuant to the emergency procedures provided by Section 6(b) of the Regulatory Review Act (Act of June 25, 1982, P. L. 633, No. 181, as amended, 71 P. S. § 745.6(b)).

10. Any rule, regulation, contingency plan, or Local Water Rationing Plan adopted pursuant to this Proclamation may be amended, relaxed, suspended or repealed pursuant to the same procedures set forth in this Proclamation and without regard to said statutes, regulations and executive orders, if compliance with such procedures is impracticable, would impose unnecessary hardships, or would be unnecessary or contrary to the public interest.

11. If any provision of the Public Utility Code or any other statute, administrative order, rule or regulation relating to operation and management of water supplies is inconsistent with the requirements of this Proclamation or any rule, regulation, contingency plan, Local Water Rationing Plan or order issued pursuant hereto, or if strict compliance with such

provisions would prevent, hinder or delay necessary action to cope with the emergency, then such provision is hereby suspended for the duration of this Proclamation.

12. For purposes of undertaking effective response to the drought and water shortage emergency and to allow for expedited development of emergency replacement of supplemental water supplies and to protect against possible energy shortages, the Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Health, Public Utility Commission, Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority and Department of Community and Economic Development are authorized to issue such emergency permits or approvals as required by law, without regard to the procedures set forth in the Act of February 17, 1984 (P. L. 75, No. 14) (71 P. S. § 510-5) or to any other applicable statute, regulation or executive order, if compliance with such procedures is impracticable or would be contrary to the public interest.

13. All residents of the Commonwealth are urged to conserve water on a voluntary basis and to comply with water use restrictions requested or imposed by the public water supply agencies servicing their areas in order to prevent further water shortages.

14. All county commissioners of counties located within the designated drought emergency area shall establish a drought management task force within their county. The county task force shall coordinate, monitor, and manage all drought reporting and response activities and water conservation measures undertaken within their county as necessary to ensure the provision of safe and reliable drinking water sources. The county task forces shall be comprised of county emergency management officials, public water supply agency representatives, elected officials, health officials, fire officials, law enforcement officials, affected business and industry representatives and others as the county may determine. The county commissioners will monitor, coordinate, initiate and report to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council on county task force activities to include but not limited to public information, planning, water system vulnerabilities, enforcement coordination, fire protection, and other areas of public concern.

15. The Pennsylvania State Police, all local law enforcement departments, county and state fire marshals, other state employees with law enforcement authority and public water supply agencies shall assist the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council and all affected political subdivisions within the designated drought emergency area, in the enforcement of the various water use restrictions, Local Water Rationing Plans and other measures that are implemented under this Proclamation.

16. This Proclamation shall take effect immediately.

#### Proposed Rule 229.1 Governing Judgment of Non Pros for Inactivity; Proposed Recommendation No. 152

The Civil Procedural Rules Committee proposes that the Rules of Civil Procedure be amended by adding new Rule 229.1 governing Judgment of Non Pros for Inactivity. The recommendation is being published to the bench and bar for comments and suggestions prior to its submission to the Supreme Court.

### TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

#### PART I. GENERAL

#### CHAPTER 200. BUSINESS OF COURTS

#### Rule 229.1. Judgment of Non Pros for Inactivity.

(a) Not earlier than two years after the commencement of an action, a party may file a petition seeking the entry of a judgment of non pros for inactivity if the party has given at least ninety days written notice to every other party of the intention to file the petition. The written notice shall be in the form prescribed by subdivision (c) of this rule. A copy of the written notice shall be attached to the petition.

(b) The court may grant the relief sought if

(1) the party against whom judgment is sought has shown a lack of due diligence by failing to proceed with reasonable promptitude both before and after receiving the written notice required by subdivision (a);

(2) there is no compelling reason for the delay; and

(3) the delay has caused actual prejudice to the petitioner.

**Official Note: Rule 229.1 is derived from *James Brothers Lumber Co. v. Union Banking and Trust*, 432 Pa. 129, 247 A.2d 587 (1968) as reaffirmed in *Jacobs v. Halloran, et al.*, 551 Pa. 350, 710 A.2d 1098 (1998).**

The activity sufficient to demonstrate the diligent prosecution of a case may be on the docket, outside the record or both. For example, mediation or settlement negotiations between the parties are

activities that progress the case toward resolution but do not appear on the docket.

The prejudice to the defendant caused by the delay must be actual and not presumed.

“A party who seeks the equitable relief provided by the entry of a judgment of non pros must do so with clean hands,” *Jacobs v. Halloran, et al.*, 551 Pa. at \_\_\_, 710 A.2d at 1103 (1998).

#### Explanatory Comment

Proposed Rule 229.1 establishes the procedure for obtaining a judgment of non pros for inactivity. The rule incorporates the three prong test of *Jacobs v. Halloran, et al.*, 551 Pa. 350, \_\_\_\_, 710 A.2d 1098, 1103 (1998):

To dismiss a case for inactivity pursuant to a defendant's motion for non pros there must first be a lack of due diligence on the part of the plaintiff in failing to proceed with reasonable promptitude. Second, the plaintiff must have no compelling reason for the delay. Finally, the delay must cause actual prejudice to the defendant.

Two aspects of the rule should be noted. First, this rule contemplates activity which progresses a case toward resolution whether or not that activity is noted in a docket entry. Second, there is no presumption of prejudice arising from a specific time period of inactivity. A party must show actual prejudice to the ability to defend the case in addition to a lack of due diligence which is unexcused. This is in accord with the *Jacobs* case which held that “the equitable principles underlying the entry of a judgment of non pros must be recognized and the presumption of prejudice first enunciated in *Penn Piping, Inc., v. Insurance Company of North America*, 529 Pa. 350, 603 A.2d 1006 (1992), must be abandoned.” *Jacobs v. Halloran, et al.*, 551 Pa. at \_\_\_\_, 710 A.2d at 1100 (1998).

The rule introduces the concept of a ninety-day notice to be given to all parties of the intention to file a petition for the entry of a judgment of non pros after ninety days. This notice requirement is designed to alert the parties to



the lack of activity in the action. Under the proposed rule, due diligence after notice has been given is sufficient to avoid the entry of the judgment and, in many cases, it is likely that the notice will be sufficient to cause the parties to move the case forward, thereby avoiding the necessity of filing a petition.

**TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE**

**PART I. GENERAL**

**CHAPTER 1910. ACTIONS FOR SUPPORT**

**Rule 1910.2. Venue. Transfer of Action.**

(a) An action may be brought in **[ any county in which ]**

- (1) **the county in which** the defendant resides, or
- (2) **the county in which** the defendant is regularly employed, or
- (3) **the county in which** the plaintiff resides and that county is the county in which the last **[ family ] marital** domicile was located and in which the plaintiff has continued to reside, or
- (4) **the county in which the child resides if the relief sought includes child support.**

(b) Where jurisdiction is acquired over the defendant pursuant to the long arm statute, 23 Pa.C.S. [A] § 4342(c) **[ and d ]**, the action may be brought in the county where the plaintiff resides **[ whether or not the parties maintained a family domicile in that county ]**.

**Official Note: 23 Pa.C.S. § 7201 sets forth the specific bases for long arm jurisdiction over a non-resident defendant.**

**(c) If, at the time of the filing of the action, there is a divorce or custody action pending between the parties in an appropriate court in another county, the court upon good cause shown may transfer the support action to that county.**

**(d) For the convenience of the parties and witnesses the court may transfer an action to the appropriate court of any other county where the action could have been brought at the time of transfer.**

**Official Note: The standards for transfer of an action for the convenience of parties and witnesses are the same as the standards under Rule 1006(d).**

**(e) If neither party to an action presently resides in the county where the action is pending or a support order is in effect, and the defendant-obligor is not employed in that county, the court may transfer the action or order or both to any county where either party resides or where the defendant-obligor is regularly employed.**

**(f) It shall be the duty of the domestic relations section of the court in which the action is pending to forward to the domestic relations section of the court to which the action is transferred all papers filed in the action and a certified copy of the docket entries.**

**(g) A support order may be enforced in accordance with the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act, 23 Pa.C.S. § 7101 et seq., if the defendant resides outside the Commonwealth, or in accordance with the Intrastate Family Support Act, 23 Pa.C.S. § 8101 et seq., if the defendant resides in another county within the Commonwealth.**

**Rule 1910.8. [ Transfer of Action ] Rescinded.**

**Official Note: The provisions in this Rule now appear in Rule 1910.2(d) through (f).**

**Rule 1910.18. Support Order. Subsequent Proceedings.**

(a) Subsequent proceedings to modify or terminate a support order pursuant to Rule 1910.19 shall be brought in the court which entered the order. If the action has been transferred pursuant to **[ Rule 1910.8 ] Rule 1910.2** following the entry of a support order, subsequent proceedings shall be brought in the court to which the action was transferred.

\* \* \* \* \*

**Rule 1910.50. Suspension of Acts of Assembly.**

The following Acts or parts of Acts of Assembly are suspended insofar as they apply to the practice and procedure in an action for support:

(1) Section 3 of the Support Law of June 24, 1937, P. L. 2045, 62 P. S. § 1973, insofar as it provides a procedure to enforce the liability of relatives for the support of an indigent person; **[ and ]**

**(2) Section 4 of Act 1996-20, 23 Pa.C.S. § 4342, insofar as it provides that long arm jurisdiction shall be used in preference to proceedings under Part VIII-A relating to intrastate family support actions; and**

**[ (2) ] (3) All Acts or parts of Acts of Assembly inconsistent with these rules to the extent of such inconsistency.**

*ALL existing explanatory notes and comments pertaining to the rule listed below are replaced by the following:*

**Explanatory Comment—Rule 1910.2**

The amendments to this Rule are intended to implement the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act (UIFSA) and the Intrastate Family Support Act (IFSA) to facilitate the fair and prompt establishment of child support by means of encouraging the support litigation to take place as a local action in one forum only. Under the former rule, venue in support matters was in the county where the defendant lived or worked, or in the county where the plaintiff lived if that county was the last family domicile. The amended Rule expands the circumstances under which venue lies in the county in which plaintiff resides. If the action is one for spousal and child support or child support only, plaintiff may bring the action in the county in which the child resides regardless of whether that county was the last family domicile. The defendant will be required to defend the action there unless he or she can establish sufficient grounds for transfer of the action pursuant to subdivisions (c) through (e) of the proposed rule. It is important to note, however, that the court may always permit a party or witness to testify by telephone, audiovisual or other electronic means at specially designated locations. 23 Pa.C.S. § 4342(j).

If plaintiff seeks spousal support only, then venue continues to lie in plaintiff's county only if that county was also the last marital domicile.

Subdivisions (c) through (e) identify the circumstances under which a support action may be transferred to another county. New subdivision (c) is designed to avoid multiple claims from being litigated in different counties. Subdivisions (d) through (f) are adopted verbatim from former Rule 1910.8 and were moved to Rule 1910.2 only for the convenience of the practitioner in resolving questions of venue.

**Explanatory Comment—Rule 1910.18**

Rule 1910.18 clarifies the question of jurisdiction which arises where parties wish to proceed for termination, modification or enforcement in counties other than the county which entered the order. Section 6710 of the Judicial Code provides that the county which entered the original order continues to retain jurisdiction for termination, modification or enforcement. Section 6710 also provides that this shall not limit the right of the plaintiff to "institute additional proceedings" in any county where the defendant resides or where his or her property is located. Additionally, Rule 1910.2(g) permits enforcement of a support order in accordance with the Intrastate Family Support Act, 23 Pa.C.S. § 8101 et seq., if the defendant resides in another county within the Commonwealth.

There will be instances where the parties no longer reside in the original county. In this situation, Rule 1910.18 permits a party to seek transfer of the entire matter under Rule 1910.2 and authorizes the transferee county to modify, terminate or enforce the order. There may be other instances where the parties retain some connection with the county which entered the order but circumstances require the enforcement of the order in another county. In such a case, the plaintiff, without an order of court may transfer the support order and seek enforcement under the Uniform Intrastate Family Support Act or the Transfer of Judgment Rule 3001 et seq.

**Explanatory Comment—Rule 1910.50**

Insofar as long arm jurisdiction is an issue that arises only in the context of interstate cases in which the

defendant resides outside of the Commonwealth, the language in 23 Pa.C.S. § 4342(c) implying that it has relevance to intrastate support cases is suspended.

The Intake Conference is not a hearing, but an opportunity for parents to reach agreement early in the custody process. No evidence or testimony is presented. The goal of the Intake Conference is (1) to assist the parties in identifying areas of agreement and disagreement and sharing parenting responsibilities and (2) develop a parenting plan that best suits them and their children.

b) All agreements reached at Intake Conference shall be reduced to a Consent Agreement. (FORM 2).

c) If agreement on all issues is not reached, then a temporary agreement may be entered into by the parties and a Conciliation Conference scheduled to further address the unresolved issues.

d) The Conciliation Conference will be conducted by the Custody Conciliator, whose role is to actively engage the parties in reaching a custody agreement using mediation skills and techniques.

*Comment—1998*

A Conciliation Conference is informal, with no record created or testimony elicited from parties or witnesses and is scheduled for 1 1/2 hours for one (1) or two (2) sessions as needed. The parties are given the opportunity to present the issues or problems and explore all available options for resolution.

e) A Consent Agreement form will be completed and signed when reached. (FORM 2). Any unresolved issues are to be negotiated to a temporary agreement that the parties can live with or the Conciliator will forward a Referral for Temporary Order to the Court that shall become a final order unless a request for Evidentiary Hearing is filed. The Temporary Order will include all areas of prior agreement.

f) Participation will be limited to the parties and/or their counsel. All participants must act in a cooperative manner and comply with the directives of the person conducting the conference.

g) Any attorney who attends Intake and/or a Conciliation Conference with a client will participate consistent with the following:

1) The primary duty of the attorney will be to counsel and advise the client rather than to advocate.

2) Attorneys shall fully cooperate with the efforts of the Intake Officer and/or Custody Conciliator to facilitate the agreement of the parties.

3) Attorneys shall advise their clients in a manner not disruptive of the conciliation process, which will ordinarily require consulting with the client outside the conference room.

4) Counsel shall at all times behave in a professional manner and refrain from engaging in hostile or antagonistic conduct directed toward any conference participant.

5) Attorneys shall not engage in legal argument except that counsel may advise of legal issues relevant to the formation of a temporary or recommended order.

6) Counsel shall not attempt to question the other party, present evidence nor otherwise engage in conduct characteristic of an adversarial proceeding.

h) If at any time during the conciliation process a party and/or their counsel engages in conduct inconsistent with the rules or disrupts the conciliation process or interferes with the function of the Blair County Custody Office, the Intake Officer or Conciliator may recess the proceeding, remove the violator and reconvene if appropriate. If a party is removed, an order can be entered in their absence. If an attorney is removed, the party can continue in the process if they so desire. Any violator will be referred to a contempt proceeding.

**Rule 1915.21. Custody Litigation Process.**

a) Within ten (10) days from the date of service of a Custody Order, a party may file a request for Evidentiary Hearing form in the Blair County Prothonotary's Office (FORM 3).

1) There is no filing fee required. The request form must be served on the other counsel/party with the specific issues identified for consideration in the Evidentiary Hearing. The request form shall be forwarded by the Prothonotary to the Court Administrator's Office for a date to be assigned for a prehearing conference before the Hearing Officer.

2) Ten (10) days prior to the prehearing, the parties and/or counsel shall submit to the Court Administrator a prehearing narrative, including but not limited to the following:

(i) Names and addresses of all witnesses, including experts.

(ii) Summary of each witness's anticipated testimony.

(iii) Copies of all exhibits.

(iv) Anticipated length of trial.

(v) Proposed custody arrangement for both parties.

(vi) Requested stipulation of facts.

3) If no prehearing narrative is filed, the offending party may be fined or sanctioned otherwise by the Court.

*Comment—1998*

As to 2)(v) Each party shall prepare a parenting arrangement that encompasses time with both parents. The arrangements should be prepared from the perspective that each party would consider either side of the proposal reasonable were they in the position of the other party.

b) The prehearing conference will be conducted by the Blair County Prehearing Officer in preparation for a trial by the parties before a Blair County Judge. The prehearing focuses on identification of contested issues, witnesses to testify, exchange of medical reports, names of any expert witnesses to be called, exhibits and requests for an interview of a child. A time and date for the Evidentiary Hearing will be set and any requirement of the filing of any briefs will also be discussed. A summary will be forwarded by the Prehearing Officer to a Judge in preparation for trial.

c) Before a party can request Special Relief, a complaint for custody must be filed or a Court Order must be in effect. At any time during the custody process, a party may file a Motion for Special Relief setting forth facts as to why the child is in immediate danger of physical injury or serious emotional harm. Where such a motion is filed concerning a temporary or recommended order of custody,

the Petitioner must show why the custody arrangement is so harmful to the child to warrant Court intervention apart from the standard custody process.

*Comment—1998*

Motions for Special Relief will be screened prior to any hearing scheduled and may be denied without

hearing. Special Relief Motions will be scheduled by the Court Administrator. The Petitioner must provide service to the Respondent prior to the case being heard. Special Relief will be decided on oral argument only.

  - a) Replacement of the 2,688 tons/day waste processing limitation with steam flow measurement (pounds of steam produced per unit time, for example, pounds of steam per hour or tons of steam per year).
  - b) Increase the 4,350 tons/day maximum waste acceptance limitation to a 6-day average of 4,350 tons/day limitation. This would include a new maximum waste acceptance limitation of 5,800 tons/day.
  - c) Additional Form R (Residual) and Form S (Municipal-like Residual) wastes being requested.
  - d) Reclassification of certain Form R wastes, currently approved in the permit, to be considered as Form S wastes.
  - e) Incineration of facility-generated used oil for energy recovery at the facility.
  - f) Language modification to some existing permit conditions to provide clarification and improve operational effectiveness.
  - g) Increase in waste storage volumes.

Based on the information provided by the applicant and the Department's own analysis, the Department would place the following conditions in the proposed Air Quality Plan Approval to assure compliance with the applicable standards:

*General Requirements*

1. This Plan Approval is issued to the owner and operator, American Ref-Fuel Company of Delaware Valley, LP, for the modification of its six Westinghouse-O'Connor mass-burn rotary municipal waste combustors (MWC). This Plan Approval allows an increase in the waste charging rate of the MWC. Each unit is equipped with individual dry acid gas scrubbers and pulse-jet cleaning type fabric collectors.

2. Each combustor shall be limited to a maximum MWC unit load of 158,000 pounds of steam per hour (calculated in 4-hour block arithmetic averages), or 110% of the maximum demonstrated unit load during the most recent annual dioxin/furan performance test, whichever is less.

3. This Plan Approval authorizes temporary operation of the sources covered by this Plan Approval, provided the following conditions are met:

a) The Department must receive written notice from the owner/operator at least 5 working days, prior to its increased firing rate as stated in Condition 2B above. The notice should state when the increased unit load is expected. An administrative amendment shall be required to revise the facility's operating permit.

b) The owner/operator may request an extension if compliance with all applicable regulations and Plan Approval requirements has not been established. The extension request shall be submitted, in writing, at least 15 days prior to the end of this period of temporary operation and shall provide a description of the compliance status of the source, a detailed schedule for establishing compliance and the reasons compliance has not been established.

c) The company shall comply with all of the existing requirements of its Operating Permit No. OP-23-0004, originally issued on November 16, 1996, and as subsequently amended, unless specifically revised in this Plan Approval. The conditions and requirements of Operating Permit No. OP-23-0004 are incorporated by reference into this Plan Approval. The provisions in this Plan Approval shall be construed to supersede any contrary provisions in any previous Plan Approval or Operating Permit.

The conditions of Operating Permit No. OP-23-0004 are revised as follows. Please note these conditions are numbered to correspond with condition changes for the existing Air Quality Operating Permit No. OP-23-004.

#### 5. Stack Emission Limitations

##### A. Criteria Pollutants

3. Carbon monoxide (CO) emissions per combustor shall not exceed 29.95 pounds per hour and 100 ppm by volume on a 4 hour average, corrected to 7% O<sub>2</sub> (dry basis). The owner/operator shall also comply with Condition 8.K of this Plan Approval.

##### B. Non-criteria Pollutants

2. The owner/operator shall demonstrate facility compliance with the following levels and shall not exceed the calculated maximum annual ambient concentrations listed as follows using the actual stack emission rates and the exhaust parameters from the stack test specified in Condition 9 of this Operating Permit and the dispersion modeling techniques used in the application as approved by the Department. The Department may waive the modeling requirement after the issuance of this Operating Permit, if the measured pollutant levels are below those used in the application, the volumetric flow rate has not significantly increased from the value used in the application, and the stack gas temperature has not significantly decreased from the value used in the application.

#### 6. Operating Requirements

A. The combustor(s) shall maintain the combustion gases at a temperature greater than 1800°F for at least 1 second. The temperature shall be calculated on an hourly (1-hour block arithmetic) average. To verify compliance with this requirement, a temperature sensor shall be

located at the furnace roof position approved by the Department for each unit. The temperature at this location shall be maintained at a temperature greater than 850°F, a Department approved reference temperature which corresponds to 1800°F, for at least 1 second. The combustor(s) auxiliary burners shall be automatically controlled to maintain the combustion gases at the aforementioned condition whenever refuse is being incinerated.

#### D. Tipping Floor Negative Pressure Requirements

1. Whenever the combustor(s) is in operation, the tipping area shall be operated at a negative pressure. The air passing through all natural draft openings surrounding the tipping floor including the MWC charging area shall flow inward continuously. The continuous inward flow of air shall be verified by continuous observation using streamers or other means approved by the Department.

2. This condition for the submission of a plan by November 15, 1995 is deleted.

L. The ash shall be tested annually for total combustibles. Results of this analysis shall be kept for a period of 2 years and shall be made available to the Department upon its request.

N. Revisions are dependent upon joint Air Quality and Solid Waste Permit revisions.

#### 8. Continuous Monitoring Requirements

H. The Department reserves the right to require the owner/operator to install, operate and maintain an uninterruptable power supply (UPS) for the continuous monitoring system at the facility. The requirement to install an UPS shall be based on future power outages and loss of data and the affect on the CEM system. In the event of power loss from the provider, an existing turbine generator shall remain available at the facility to power all CEMS. In addition, the owner/operator shall ensure that the Data Acquisition System maintains at least 4 hours of an uninterruptable power supply.

K. Any changes to current Department certified monitoring method, equipment, procedures shall be approved by the Department following the procedures specified in the Department Continuous Source Monitoring Manual. Phase I application shall be submitted within 60 days after the issuance of this Plan Approval. Phase III Department approval shall be obtained no later than 6 months after the issuance of this Plan Approval.

#### 9. Testing Requirements

B.1. For PM, PM10 and toxic metals indicated in 9.A above, except PCDD/PCDF—semi-annually. In every 2 year period, source testing shall be done in each of the four seasons. The stack test schedule may be altered by the Department as a data base is developed.

B.3. For PCDD/PCDF, VOC, PAH, SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>x</sub>, HCl, and CO—annually.

F. Tests shall be conducted semiannually or as required by the Department to verify the Department approved reference temperatures monitored by the sensor located at the Department approved location corresponding to combustion gas temperatures of 1800°F and 1600°F respectively for combustion gas retention times in each

instance of 1 second. Temperature monitor verification tests shall be performed during stack testing. The test plan required under Condition 9E of this Operating Permit shall also include procedures to assure compliance with the above temperature monitoring conditions. The testing frequency may be altered, if the temperature verification records at a particular MWC unit indicate that a lesser schedule is adequate.

H. Within 30 days after the source test, two copies of the complete test report shall be submitted to the Regional Manager for approval. The test report shall include all operating conditions and indicate the amount of wastes combusted, classification of wastes, amount of each type of waste, Btu content of wastes and composition of wastes.

#### 10. *Start-up Requirements*

No solid waste shall be charged into the combustor(s) until equilibrium has been attained in the furnace zones, the temperature of the combustion gases reaches 1800°F (based upon a surrogate temperature of 850°F as displayed on the facility CEMS) for 1 second of retention time and the combustor is empty. All control equipment shall be operational and functioning properly prior to the introduction of solid waste into the combustor(s).

#### 16. *Recordkeeping and Reporting Requirements*

G. Temperature values submitted in each quarterly report shall consist of actual temperature values plus 950°F, the difference between the temperatures measured at the surrogate location and the demonstrated 1800°F for 1 second retention time location.

**SEWAGE FACILITIES ACT

*Location—*Quincy Township, Franklin County, 7575 Mentzer Gap Rd., Waynesboro, PA 17268. The approved plan modifies a previous plan (A1-28918-Act) approved in October 1994. It expands a proposed .2 mgd sewage treatment plant to .3 mgd. It expands the previous collection system to include the Slabtown and Biesecker Gap areas of the Township. The plan also selects a hybrid collection system using small diameter variable grade technology with low pressure collection where necessary. An OLDS Management Ordinance will address the remainder of the municipality. The Department's review of the sewage facilities update revision has not identified significant environmental impacts resulting from this

proposal. Any required NPDES permits or WQM permits must be obtained in the name of the municipality or authority as appropriate.

*Location—*Cumru Township, Berks County, R. D. 3, Box 3005, Mohnton, PA 19540. Approved plan provides for extension of public sewers to serve the Steever's Glen, Alpine Drive and Hemlock Road areas of the Township. Implementation of several portions of these projects is dependent upon completion of developer driven projects. Special studies will be conducted for the Agelica and Kohl's Mill areas. Areas with elevated levels of nitrate-nitrogen groundwater contamination are identified and the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance new land development procedures will be modified accordingly. The Department's review of the sewage facilities update revision has not identified significant environmental impacts resulting from this proposal. 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#### Consent Order and Agreement Borough of Tyrone

On the 15th day of December, 1998 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Borough of Tyrone entered into a Consent Order and Agreement with the following actions agreed to:

1. Until completion of the sewage treatment plant upgrade and expansion, Tyrone shall comply with an interim daily maximum effluent limitation for total residual chlorine of 0.5 mg/l.
2. Within 30 days of execution of the COA, Tyrone shall pay a civil penalty of \$7,000 to the Commonwealth's Clean Water Fund.
3. In the event Tyrone fails to comply with the interim effluent limit established in condition #1, Tyrone Borough shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$400 per day.

#### Certified Emission Reduction Credits in Pennsylvania's ERC Registry

Emission reduction credits (ERCs) are surplus, permanent, quantified and Federally enforceable emission reductions used to offset emission increases of oxides of nitrogen (NOx), volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and the following criteria pollutants: carbon monoxide (CO), lead (Pb), oxides of sulfur (SOx), particulate matter (PM), PM-10 and PM-10 precursors.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) maintains an ERC registry in accordance with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 127.209. The ERC registry system provides for the tracking of the creation, transfer and use of ERCs. Prior to registration of the credits, ERC Registry Applications are reviewed and approved by the Department to confirm that the ERCs meet the requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. Registration of the credits in the ERC registry system constitutes certification that the ERCs satisfy applicable requirements and that the credits are available for use. The following registered, and certified ERCs in the ERC Registry are currently available for use as follows:

- (1) To satisfy new source review (NSR) emission offset ratio requirements;
- (2) To "net-out" of NSR at ERC-generating facilities;
- (3) To sell or trade the ERCs for use as emission offsets at new or modified facilities.

The certified ERCs shown below, expressed in tons per year (tpy), satisfy the applicable ERC requirements contained in 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. ERCs created from the curtailment or shutdown of a source or facility expire for use as offsets 10 years after the emission reduction occurs. ERCs generated by the over control of emissions by an existing facility do not expire for use as offsets. However, credits in the registry which are not used in a plan approval will be discounted if new air quality requirements are adopted by the Department or United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

An income below the \$23,874 will demonstrate the applicant may be incapable of self-support and demonstrate a financial need. An amount above the \$23,874 may qualify an applicant for admission on his/her ability to pay the full per diem cost.

## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE

### Medical Assistance Items and Services Requiring Prior Authorization

The purpose of this notice is to provide a listing of additional Medical Assistance items and services requiring prior authorization.

Section 443.6(b)(7) of the Public Welfare Code (62 P. S. § 443.6(b)(7)) authorizes the Department of Public Welfare (Department) to add other items and services to its list of services requiring prior authorization by publication of notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

In addition to the items and services listed in section 443.6(b)(1)—(6) of the Public Welfare Code, the following items and services require prior authorization before payment will be made:

1. All home health services. The first visit will be approved following hospitalization, the onset of an illness which does not involve a hospitalization, the onset of a new primary diagnosis or the exacerbation of an existing diagnosis which causes a change in the recipient's condition and requires a change in the plan of treatment, even if the balance of services in the plan or treatment is disapproved.

2. Psychiatric partial hospitalization services that exceed the limit of 240 3-hour sessions (720 total hours) of

psychiatric partial hospitalization in a 365 consecutive day period for recipients under 21 years of age.

3. Multisource legend brand name products, identified by the Department, having therapeutically equivalent "A" rated generic products available for substitution, when the licensed prescriber certifies that the particular brand name product is medically necessary for a specific recipient.

4. Multisource brand name products that are subject to a State Maximum Allowable Cost.

5. Anti-ulcer drugs as identified by the Department for one of the following situations:

a. When prescribed or dispensed for periods that exceed the initial 90 days of treatment. Prior authorization is not required if the product has an indication for the treatment of gastric or duodenal ulcers; the product's recommended dosage includes a short-term treatment for gastric or duodenal ulcers until a reduced maintenance therapy to prevent the recurrence of gastric or duodenal ulcers; and the daily dose is reduced to the recommended maintenance therapy.

b. When prescribed or dispensed concurrently with another anti-ulcer drug at any time.

c. When the prescription is changed from one anti-ulcer drug to another during the initial 90 days of treatment.

6. Behavioral health rehabilitative services not included on the Medical Assistance Fee Schedule provided to individuals under 21 years of age.

7. Medical Assistance case management services provided to individuals under 21 years of age.

#### *Fiscal Impact*

The Department has required prior authorization of these services under Notices of Rule Change published at 24 Pa.B. 3761 (July 30, 1994); 25 Pa.B. 347 (January 28, 1995); 24 Pa.B. 4423 (August 27, 1994); 25 Pa.B. 3782 (September 9, 1995); and 24 Pa.B. 2654 (May 21, 1994), consequently, no future fiscal impact is anticipated as a result of these amendments.

### Limit on Cancellations, Refusals to Renew, Refusals to Write, Surcharges, Rate Penalties and Point Assignments; No. 1999-01
