A Villanova tradition for over 60 years, Red Mass provides an opportunity for faculty, alumni, students, families and guests to celebrate the beginning of the Law School's academic year. The first Red Mass was offered in 1310 during the reign of King Edward I in Westminster Abbey to mark the opening of the judicial year. In the United States, the tradition began in 1928 at St. Andrew's Church in New York City. Since then, Red Mass has been celebrated to invoke the guidance of the Holy Spirit for all those who seek justice. The ceremony's traditional name is derived from the color of vestments worn by the celebrant and concelebrants, the scarlet robes of judges in attendance, and the scarlet gowns of the members of the law faculty. Villanova has held Red Mass since 1957.

Trial Team Champions

Villanova's Trial Competition Team competed in the First Chair Trial Competition, an elite competition that invites the top advocates from around the country to a breakneck-paced weekend of trial advocacy. 3L students **Kelsey McCafferty** and **Grace Mezzanotte** were selected to represent Villanova. After six preliminary rounds, Kelsey and Grace had competed against Cumberland, Baylor, Drexel, Quinnipiac, University of South Carolina, and St. John's University.

After the preliminary rounds, Villanova was recognized as the runner up for the Professionalism Award, and Grace also received a Best Advocate Award. The team then advanced to the semifinals against Hofstra. After a tightly contested round, Grace and Kelsey won again and advanced to the finals for a rematch against St. John's. Grace and Kelsey won the final round decisively and became champions!

Villanova's team outperformed all metrics and expectations, representing Villanova with distinction. Congratulations to Kelsey and Grace and their coaches, Zach Wynkoop and Steve Patton '15!

Please Update Your Contact Information

Whether this is your first year at VLS or you are a "seasoned" 2L or 3L, you are obligated to keep the Registrar's office up to date on your current contact information. Be assured, your information is never released to an outside source without your permission.

Continuing Obligation to Disclose Information

Please remember that students have an ongoing obligation (see Handbook: <u>Candor and Disclosure to the Law School</u>) to promptly notify the school whenever an incident occurs that could be responsive to the character and fitness questions asked on most bar applications (e.g. arrests, job losses, serious moving violations, judicial proceedings of any kind). If you need to notify the school of any potentially relevant event that occurred since you matriculated, <u>you may do so here</u>. Remember that it is always safer to over-disclose than to under-disclose. If you are unsure whether something should be disclosed or if you have any questions, please reach out to <u>Dean Matt Carluzzo</u>.

Note: The Pennsylvania deadline for registering to vote is October 21st for the November 5th election.
