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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

There are no restrictions on the republication of official documents appearing in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted

proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Equal Employment Opportunity

December 20, 1996

Whereas, this Administration believes that the employment practices of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania should be nondiscriminatory in intent and effect to promote public confidence in the fairness and integrity of government; and

Whereas, past governors of the Commonwealth have recognized a constitutional and legislative mandate to take affirmative steps to remedy employment discrimination and have issued Executive Orders promoting equal employment opportunity; and

Whereas, this Administration is firmly committed to strengthening and developing equal employment opportunity programs in the Commonwealth.

Now, Therefore, I, Thomas J. Ridge, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other laws, do hereby order and direct as follows:

PART I. GOVERNOR'S OFFICE

CHAPTER 1. AGENCY OPERATION AND ORGANIZATION

Subchapter M. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

§ 1.161. Prohibition of discrimination and affirmation of equal employment opportunity.

(a) No agency under the jurisdiction of the Governor may discriminate against any employe or applicant for employment because of race, color, religious creed, ancestry, union membership, age, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, AIDS or HIV status or disability.

(b) Positive steps shall be taken by each agency under the jurisdiction of the Governor to ensure fair and equal employment at every level of government for African Americans, Hispanics, Asians, American Indians, Alaskans, Pacific Islanders, persons with a disability, persons of 40 years of age or older and women.

(c) Sexual harassment or harassment based on any of the factors listed in subsection (a) is prohibited.

§ 1.162. Responsibility for implementing equal employment opportunity.

(a) The Secretary of Administration shall supervise the development, implementation and enforcement of the Commonwealth's equal employment opportunity programs through the Bureau of Equal Employment Opportunity, which shall:

(1) Develop and promote steps designed to ensure employment and fair treatment of the protected classes at all levels of State government.

(2) Develop Commonwealth-wide equal employment opportunity policies and procedures to ensure consistency and uniformity.

(3) Conduct or participate in periodic onsite reviews and audits of agency equal employment opportunity programs.

(4) Develop complaint resolution procedures for implementation by all agencies under the jurisdiction of the Governor.

(5) Develop and implement a standardized equal employment opportunity procedure to monitor personnel transactions in Commonwealth agencies under the jurisdiction of the Governor.

(6) Develop and issue guidelines for the conduct of agency equal employment opportunity programs and review of equal employment opportunity plans prior to implementation.

(7) Design and implement monitoring and reporting systems to measure effectiveness of agency equal employment opportunity programs.

(8) Consult with agency officials regarding personnel actions affecting agency equal employment opportunity professional staffs, including recruitment, hiring, promotion, demotion, termination, transfer, performance standards and evaluation, and rate of pay.

(9) Provide leadership to agencies in the design and implementation of innovative equal employment opportunity strategies which will further the Commonwealth's fulfillment of the commitment to equal opportunity.

(b) Heads of departments and agencies under the jurisdiction of the Governor shall:

(1) Designate an equal opportunity manager or specialist with primary responsibility to develop and implement the agency's equal employment opportunity program.

(2) Ensure that the agency equal opportunity manager or specialist reports directly to the individual who has overall responsibility for the agency's equal opportunity program.

(3) Ensure that the agency's commitment to equal employment opportunity is clearly transmitted to all agency employees and that bureau directors and managers provide adequate support to the equal opportunity manager or specialist in the development and implementation of program plans designed to achieve the agency's equal employment opportunity objectives.

(4) Seek input on personnel actions affecting equal opportunity professional personnel from the Director of the Bureau of Equal Employment Opportunity.

(5) Ensure that the agency develops and implements effective equal employment opportunity plans and auditing and reporting mechanisms.

(6) Ensure that all agency supervisory and management employees are rated on equal employment opportunity, based in part upon criteria identified in the agency's equal employment opportunity plan.

[EXECUTIVE ORDER 1996-14]

Prohibition of Sexual Harassment in the Commonwealth

December 20, 1996

Whereas, all employers are increasingly aware that sexual harassment is a significant problem in the workplace and in society in general; and

Whereas, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as Pennsylvania's largest employer, has an obligation to aggressively address sexual harassment issues in the workplace; and

Whereas, sexual harassment shall not be tolerated in Commonwealth workplaces under any circumstances; and

Whereas, this Administration is committed to providing a work environment where employees, applicants for employment or individuals receiving services from the Commonwealth shall not be subjected to sexual harassment; and

Whereas, to prevent sexual harassment in the workplace, all managers, supervisors and employees must be made aware of the Commonwealth's sexual harassment policy, the steps to take when concerns arise, and our commitment to address instances of sexual harassment aggressively and equitably; and

Whereas, sexual harassment is unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature if:

- a. submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment; or
- b. submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as the basis for employment decisions affecting such individuals; or
- c. such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment.

Now, Therefore, I, Thomas J. Ridge, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other laws, do hereby reaffirm and direct as follows:

§ 7.591. Agency responsibility.

An agency, board and commission under the jurisdiction of the Governor will not tolerate sexual harassment by any Commonwealth employe against any other employe, applicant for employment, or client or other person receiving services from the Commonwealth.

§ 7.592. Harassment policy.

Each agency, board and commission under the jurisdiction of the Governor which has not already done so shall issue a sexual harassment policy consistent with the content and intent of this order and with policy guidance received from the Secretary of Administration through the Bureau of Equal Employment Opportunity.

§ 7.593. Education and agency response.

Agency heads shall create a workplace environment which encourages discussion of sexual harassment issues, where employes are educated about and sensitized to sexual harassment, and where individuals with sexual harassment questions or complaints are provided a response which is clear, impartial and timely.

§ 7.594. Sanctions and complaints.

The Secretary of Administration, through the Bureau of Equal Employment Opportunity, shall ensure that a systematic review of programs is in place to address issues of sexual harassment, including the steps to be taken and appropriate sanctions, when instances of sexual harassment are alleged and proven.

§ 7.595. Strategies to discourage and prevent sexual harassment.

The Secretary of Administration shall also ensure effective strategies to discourage and prevent sexual harassment through clearly drawn policies and education. In addition, the Secretary of Administration shall ensure that each agency has an effective complaint mechanism in place and that the Bureau of Equal Employment Opportunity, Office of Administration, provides appropriate oversight and resolution of the appeals.

§ 7.596. Issuance of regulations.

The Secretary of Administration shall have the authority to issue Management Directives and promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the mandates of this subchapter.

§ 7.597. Cooperation with Secretary of Administration.

Commonwealth agencies, boards and commissions under the jurisdiction of the Governor shall cooperate fully with the Secretary of Administration in the implementation of this subchapter.

§ 7.598. Rescission.

Executive Order 1993-1 is rescinded.

THE COURTS

Title 231—RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

PART I. GENERAL

[231 PA. CODE CHS. 200, 1000 AND 4000]

Proposed Amendments of Rules Governing Pleading, Business of the Courts and Discovery; Recommendation No. 141

The Civil Procedural Rules Committee proposes that the rules of civil procedure governing pleading, business of the courts and discovery be amended as set forth in this recommendation. The recommendation is being published to the bench and bar for comments and suggestions prior to its submission to the Supreme Court.

The Explanatory Comment which appears in connection with the proposed recommendation has been inserted by the Committee for the convenience of the bench and bar. It will not constitute part of the rules nor will it be officially adopted or promulgated by the Court.

Annex A

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 200. BUSINESS OF COURTS

I. Rule 212 is amended and renumbered as Rule 212.3 and new Rules 212.1 and 212.2 are promulgated to read as follows:

Rule 212.1. Civil Actions to be Tried by Jury. Notice of Earliest Trial Date. Time for Completing Discovery and Filing Pre-trial Statement.

(a) In a civil action in which the damages sought exceed the jurisdictional limit for compulsory arbitration and which is to be tried by a jury, notice shall be given by the court of the earliest date on which the case may be tried. The notice may include a date by which discovery shall be completed.

Official Note: This rule takes into account existing practice in which notice is ordinarily provided at least sixty days before the earliest trial date. It is not intended by this rule to change the form and manner of notice of trial.

(b) A pre-trial statement shall be filed

(1) by the plaintiff not later than forty-five days prior to the earliest trial date.

(2) by the defendant not later than thirty days prior to the earliest trial date, and

(3) by an additional defendant not later than fifteen days prior to the earliest trial date.

Official Note: A copy of the pre-trial statement must be served upon every other party to the action. See Rule 440(a).

(c) The times set forth in subdivision (b) may be made earlier by local rule, by special order or as set forth in a trial list published in the county law journal or otherwise made available to the parties.

Official Note: The court by local rule may extend Rules 212.1 and 212.2 to apply to actions to be tried non-jury as well as by jury and to other forms of action in addition to civil actions.

Rule 212.2. Civil Actions to be Tried by Jury. Pre-trial Statement. Content. Sanctions.

(a) A pre-trial statement shall contain

(1) a brief narrative statement of the case;

(2) a list of the types and amounts of all damages claimed;

(3) a list of the names and addresses of all persons who may be called as witnesses by the party filing the statement, classifying them as liability or damage witnesses. A reference which does not state the name of the witness shall be permitted when the witness is described by title or representative capacity;

Official Note: A listing of "anyone named in discovery" is insufficient under this rule. A listing of a "records custodian" of a specific entity is a sufficient listing.

(4) a list of all exhibits which a party intends to use at trial;

(5) a copy of the written report, or answer to written interrogatory consistent with Rule 4003.5, containing the opinion and the basis for the opinion of any person who may be called as an expert witness;

(6) stipulations of the parties, if any; and

(7) such additional information as the court by local rule or special order may require.

(b) The exhibits listed in the pre-trial statement, or copies thereof, shall be marked to correspond to the exhibit list and be made available by the party filing the statement.

(c) Where unfair prejudice may occur for non-compliance with subdivisions (a) and (b), the trial judge may grant appropriate relief which may include

(1) the preclusion or limitation of the testimony of

(i) any witness whose identity is not disclosed in the pre-trial statement, or

(ii) any expert witness whose opinions have not been set forth in the report submitted with the pre-trial statement or otherwise specifically referred to in the pre-trial statement, consistent with Rule 4003.5, and

(2) the preclusion of exhibits not listed in the pre-trial statement and made available.

Rule 212.3. Pre-Trial Conference.

(a) In any action the court, of its own motion or on motion of any party, may direct the attorneys for the parties to appear for a conference to consider:

[(a)] (1) The simplification of the issues;

[(b)] (2) The necessity or desirability of amendments to the pleadings;

[(c)] (3) The possibility of obtaining admissions of fact and of documents which will avoid unnecessary proof;

[(d)] (4) The limitation of the number of expert witnesses;

[(e)] (5) The advisability of a preliminary reference of issues to a master for findings to be used as evidence when the trial is to be by jury;

[(f)] (6) Such other matters as may aid in the disposition of the action.

(b) The court may make an order reciting the action taken at the conference, the amendments allowed to the pleadings, and the agreements made by the parties as to any of the matters considered, and limiting the issues for trial to those not disposed of by admissions or agreements of the attorneys. Such order when entered shall control the subsequent course of the action unless modified at the trial to prevent manifest injustice.

(c) The court may establish by rule a pre-trial list on which actions may be placed for consideration as above provided, and may either confine the list to jury actions or to non-jury actions, or extend it to all actions.

CHAPTER 1000. ACTIONS AT LAW

Subchapter A. CIVIL ACTION

PLEADINGS

II. Rule 1023 is amended to read as follows:

Rule 1023. Signing.

(a) Every pleading, **motion, legal paper or other paper directed to the court and every discovery request or response** of a party represented by an attorney shall be signed by at least one attorney of record in [his] the attorney's individual name. [A party not represented by an attorney shall sign his own pleading.] Every such document of a party not represented by an attorney shall be signed by the party.

(b) The signature to a [pleading] document described in subdivision (a) constitutes a [certificate] certification that the person signing it has read it, that the best of [his] the signer's knowledge or information and belief there is good ground to support it, **that it is submitted in good faith**, and that it is not interposed solely for delay.

(c) **The court may impose an appropriate sanction for a bad faith violation of subdivision (b).**

Official Note: The court in its discretion at any stage of the proceedings may deny a motion for sanctions without hearing or argument.

The certification in subdivision (b) implies a reasonable belief that existing law supports the document or that there is a good faith argument for the extension, modification or reversal of existing law.

The grant or denial of relief (e.g., grant or denial of preliminary objections, motion for summary judgment or discovery application) does not, of itself, ordinarily warrant the imposition of sanctions against the party opposing or seeking the relief.

The inclusion in the rule of a provision for "an appropriate sanction" is designed to prevent the abuse of litigation. The rule is not a fee shifting rule *per se* although the award of reasonable attorney's fees may be an appropriate sanction in a particular case.

The following provisions of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S., provide additional relief from dilatory or frivolous proceedings: (1) Section 2503 relating to the right of participants to receive counsel fees and (2) Section 8351 et seq. relating to wrongful use of civil proceedings.

(d) Section 8355 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 8355, is suspended absolutely, in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of 1968, Article V, Section 10(c).

Official Note: Section 8355 of the Judicial Code provides for the certification of pleadings, motions and other papers.

See also Order of January 17, 1997, Civil Procedural Rules Docket No. 5, No. 269, suspending the following sections of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, added by Act No. 1996-135; Section 813-A, 40 P. S. § 1301.813-A, providing for the signing and certification of pleadings, motions and other papers and Section 821-A, 40 P. S. § 1301.821-A, providing for the signing and certification of a complaint.

CHAPTER 4000. DEPOSITIONS AND DISCOVERY

III. New Rule 4003.7 is promulgated to read as follows:

Rule 4003.7. Discovery of Net Worth. Punitive Damages.

A party may obtain discovery of the net worth of a defendant in a claim for punitive damages only upon order of court setting forth appropriate restrictions as to the time of the discovery, the scope of the discovery, and the dissemination of the material discovered.

Official Note: Discovery may also proceed pursuant to the agreement of the parties. See Rule 4002.

Explanatory Comment

Recommendation No. 141 proposes the following innovations to Pennsylvania civil practice and procedure.

I. New Rules 212.1 and 212.2

New Rules 212.1 and 212.2 are mandatory provisions governing pre-trial proceedings in civil actions to be tried by jury. A note to the rule advises that a court may extend the application of the rules to non-jury actions and additional forms of action.

Rule 212.1 requires the court to provide a notice which must advise the parties of the earliest trial date and which may impose a date for the completion of discovery. The rule also requires the parties to file pre-trial statements according to a specified schedule.

Rule 212.2 specifies the content of the pre-trial statement and sets forth sanctions for violation of the rule. Copies of the written reports of expert witnesses, or answers to written interrogatories consistent with Rule 4003.5, must be included as part of the pre-trial statement.

Present Rule 212 governing the pre-trial conference remains unchanged in substance but is renumbered as Rule 212.3. The paragraphs and subparagraphs of the rule are lettered and numbered to conform to the format of the rules of civil procedure.

Rule 212.3 stands in contrast to proposed Rules 212.1 and 212.2 which are of mandatory application. While Rule 212.3 specifies the nature of a pre-trial conference, it does not mandate that a conference be held.

II. Amendment of Rule 1023

Rule 1023 governing signing is amended in several respects. The category of documents subject to the requirement of signing is significantly expanded beyond pleadings. The certification which arises from the act of signing is broadened to include a clause that the document "is submitted in good faith." A provision for sanctions is added for a bad faith violation of the rule. A note elaborates on the application of the rule.

III. New Rule 4003.7

New Rule 4003.7 places under the control of the court the discovery of net worth when there is a claim for punitive damages. However, a note serves as a reminder that such discovery may be had also pursuant to agreement of the parties under Rule 4002.

Title 249—PHILADELPHIA RULES

PHILADELPHIA COUNTY

Directive Concerning Court Appointed Counsel Fees; Directive No. 1 of 1997

Pursuant to a resolution adopted on November 21, 1996, by the Board of Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, a further extension of the Guaranteed Fee System was declined, and the issue of counsel fees to court appointed counsel was referred to the Administrative Governing Board of the First Judicial District for determination.

On December 9, 1996, the Administrative Governing Board decided to continue the lapsed Guaranteed Fee System until the Administrative Governing Board adopted a new process.

Upon a comprehensive review of the underlying issue, the Administrative Governing Board at a regularly scheduled meeting held on January 14, 1997, determined that the Guaranteed Fee System shall continue to operate as amended hereunder. From time to time, the Administrative Governing Board may further amend or modify the Guaranteed Fee System as necessary.

Effective for Court appointments made on or after March 10, 1997, the Guaranteed Fee System shall be amended as follows:

I. Philadelphia Municipal Court

Compensation shall be a flat fee of \$350.00 per case. In extraordinary cases, the attorney may receive compensation in excess of \$350.00 upon petition and approval of the Municipal Court President Judge or his designee.

In appeals from the Municipal Court to the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County, compensation shall be at the prevailing per diem rate in the Court of Common Pleas.

II. Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County

A. Family Court

1. In delinquency cases, the maximum amounts payable at disposition are as follows:

- a. Pre-trial disposition (misdemeanor or felony): \$150.00
- b. Pre-trial list room conflict counsel per diem (misdemeanor or felony): \$250.00
- c. Misdemeanor: \$300.00
- d. Felony or adult certification: \$400.00

2. In dependency cases, the maximum amounts payable at disposition are as follows:

- a. First year of proceedings per appointment: \$300.00
- b. Disposition subsequent to first year (i.e., adoption, long-term foster care, return home/supervision, placement with relative, independent living): \$150.00

3. In abuse cases, compensation shall be a flat fee of \$350.00 per case, payable at disposition.

4. In extraordinary cases, court appointed counsel may receive compensation in excess of the above rates upon petition and approval of the administrative Judge of the Family Court Division or his designee.

B. Trial Division

The maximum per diem compensation that any attorney shall receive in any given day regardless of the number of cases in which the attorney attends court shall be reduced from three half-days to two half-days.

In the event of a continuance, an attorney shall not receive any per diem compensation regardless of the reason for the continuance.

An attorney shall receive per diem compensation for a full day only when the attorney is physically present in the courtroom for more than three hours.

III. All Cases (Common Pleas Court and Municipal Court)

No Court appointed attorney shall receive compensation without first receiving mandatory training and certification from the Philadelphia Bar Association with regard to proper billing procedures in Guaranteed Fee System and non-Guaranteed Fee System cases.

Falsification of fee petitions in Guaranteed Fee System cases or non-Guaranteed Fee System cases (i.e. submission of multiple fee petitions for the same time period) shall result in automatic removal from all court appointment lists, referral to the Disciplinary Board of Pennsylvania Supreme Court and prosecution to the full extent of the law.

Any question concerning the interpretation of these amendments shall be decided by the Administrative Judge of the division to which the question pertains, or, in case the question pertains to the Municipal Court, by the Municipal Court President Judge.

This directive is issued consistent with the Order of the Supreme Court dated March 26, 1996, at No. 164 Judicial Administration Docket No. 1, and at the request of the Board of Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County and Pa.R.Crim.P. No. 6, and shall become effective March 10, 1997. As required by Pa.R.Crim.P. No. 6, the original Directive shall be filed with the Prothonotary in a docket maintained for Directives issued by the Administrative Governing Board of the First Judicial District of Pennsylvania, and copies shall be submitted to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, the Legislative Reference Bureau and the Criminal Procedure Rules Committee. Copies of the Directive

shall also be submitted to Legal Communications, Ltd.,
The Legal Intelligencer, Jenkins Memorial Library, and
the Law Library for the First Judicial District.

GAME COMMISSION

[58 PA. CODE CHS. 139 AND 143]

Seasons and Bag Limits Table; Antlerless Deer Licenses; and Bear Licenses

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission), at its January 14, 1997, meeting, proposed the following amendments:

Amend § 139.4 (relating to seasons and bag limits for the license year) to provide dates for the 1997-1998 hunting license year.

Amend § 143.48 (relating to first-come-first-served license issuance) to clarify conditions for the initial acceptance of antlerless deer license applications.

Amend § 143.51 (relating to application and issuance of bonus tags) concerning issuance of bonus antlerless deer licenses to muzzleloader hunters.

Amend Chapter 143, Subchapter D (relating to bear licenses), by adding §§ 143.66—143.70 concerning the application, issuance and display of bear licenses.

These amendments will have no adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for the proposal of these amendments is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to the Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

These proposals were made public at the January 14, 1997, meeting of the Commission and comments on these proposals can be sent to the Executive Director of the Game Commission, 2001 Elmerton Avenue, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9797 until April 4, 1997.

Proposed amendment to § 139.4

1. *Introduction*

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Commission, at its January 14, 1997, meeting proposed changing § 139.4 to provide for seasons and bag limits for the 1997-1998 license year. These seasons and bag limits were proposed under sections 322(c)(1) and 2102(b)(1) of the code (relating to power and duties of Commission; and regulations). Notable changes for the 1997-1998 year are the allowing of the taking of a coyote during the spring gobbler season and the establishment of no closed season on chipmunks, red squirrels and porcupines.

2. *Purpose and Authority*

The Commission is required to set hunting and fur-taking seasons and bag limits on an annual basis. Section 322 of the code specifically empowers the Commission to "... fix seasons ... and daily, season and possession limits for any species of game or wildlife." Section 2102(b) of the code mandates that the Commission promulgate regulations relating to seasons and bag limits. Populations of red squirrels, chipmunks, porcupines and coyotes are sufficiently abundant and those species have generated nuisance complaints so that the Commission is eliminating or relaxing restrictions on their taking.

3. *Regulatory Requirements*

These proposed seasons and bag limits establish when and where it is lawful to hunt and trap various game species and place limits on the numbers that can be legally taken.

4. *Persons Affected*

Persons wishing to hunt and trap in this Commonwealth would be affected by these seasons and bag limits.

5. *Cost and Paperwork Requirements*

The proposed new seasons and bag limits would not result in additional cost either to the Commission or to hunters and furtakers.

6. *Effective Dates*

The effective dates are July 1, 1997 to June 30, 1998.

Proposed amendments to Chapter 143, Subchapter C (relating to antlerless deer licenses)

1. *Introduction*

To clarify procedures and more fairly provide antlerless deer hunting opportunities, the Commission at its January 14, 1997, meeting proposed changes to Subchapter C to clarify procedures for issuing antlerless deer licenses

and to give muzzleloader license holders additional opportunity to obtain bonus antlerless licenses. These changes are being adopted under the authority contained in section 2722(g) of the code (relating to authorized license-issuing agents).

2. *Purpose and Authority*

Section 143.48 generally refers to § 143.45 (relating to completing and submitting applications) in establishing procedures for the issuance of antlerless licenses. County treasurers have complained that this general reference has created some confusion. The proposed change to § 143.48 would refer to specific subsections of § 143.45.

The proposed change to § 143.51 would provide holders of muzzleloader licenses three additional days to apply for bonus antlerless licenses before those licenses are made available to the general public. Muzzleloader license holders are required to give up their regular antlerless license application to get the muzzleloader license. The proposed change helps to compensate for this sacrifice by providing more opportunity for bonus tags.

Section 2722(g) of the code authorizes the Commission to adopt regulations controlling license issuance. Both of the changes are being proposed under this authority.

3. *Regulatory Requirements*

The proposed change to § 143.48 would merely clarify current requirements. The proposed change to § 143.51 would relax restrictions on muzzleloader hunters seeking bonus antlerless deer licenses.

4. *Persons Affected*

County treasurers and their employes and those seeking bonus antlerless deer licenses would be affected by these changes.

5. *Cost and Paperwork Requirements*

The proposed changes would not result in any additional cost and paperwork.

6. *Effective Date*

These changes would be effective on publication of final adoption in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and would remain in effect until changed by the Commission.

Proposed amendment to Chapter 143, Subchapter D

1. *Introduction*

To more efficiently issue bear licenses, the Commission at its January 14, 1997, meeting proposed the addition of §§ 143.66—143.70 to Subchapter D, which would allow the issuance of bear licenses by authorized license issuing agents and dispense with the requirement to display the bear license while hunting. These changes are proposed under the authority contained in sections 2102 and 2722(g) of the code.

2. *Purpose and Authority*

Bear license applications are currently processed, and bear licenses are currently issued, directly by the Commission. When there was a limit on the number of these licenses available, that procedure was necessary. Now that there are no limitations on the number of bear licenses, it would be more efficient and convenient to the license purchaser to have authorized license issuing agents perform that function. In addition, given the limited nature of the bear hunting season, it was decided that it would be more convenient to dispense with requiring display of the license.

Section 2102 of the code authorizes the Commission to "... promulgate such regulations as it deems necessary and appropriate concerning ... hunting or furtaking in this Commonwealth,..." Section 2722(g) of the code authorizes the Commission to adopt regulations relating to administration and control of license issuance activities.

3. *Regulatory Requirements*

The proposed changes would allow authorized license issuing agents to issue bear licenses and require that the bear license be signed and carried but not displayed.

4. *Persons Affected*

Authorized license issuing agents would have additional workload but would also receive additional fees. It is anticipated that the proposed system would be more convenient for most bear license purchasers.

5. *Cost and Paperwork Requirements*

Authorized license issuing agents might have some additional cost and paperwork which would be offset by additional fees. The burden on the Commission would be lightened.

6. *Effective Date*

This change would be effective on publication of final adoption in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and would remain in effect until changed by the Commission

MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS

(c) Subject to approval by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, an early and late season for Canada geese will be held as defined in § 141.25.

Subchapter C. ANTLERLESS DEER LICENSES

§ 143.48. First-come-first-served license issuance.

(a) Except when conducting a public drawing as set forth in § 143.46 (relating to public drawing), a county treasurer shall accept envelopes containing applications on a first-come-first-served basis. Envelopes shall be inspected, unopened, to determine if they comply with § 143.45(a), (b), (d) and (f) (relating to completing and submitting applications).

(b) If the conditions in § 143.45(a), (b), (d) and (f) are met, it constitutes initial acceptance, and the appropriate number of licenses shall be assigned. If the conditions are not met, the enclosed applications shall be rejected and returned to the sender as soon as possible, and no license will be assigned.

§ 143.51. Application and issuance of bonus tags.

* * * * *

(b) County treasurers shall accept and process bonus applications from applicants in possession of a current muzzleloader license (stamp) beginning the [**Thursday immediately preceding the fourth Monday in August**] **third Monday in August**. Bonus applications accepted by county treasurers on the [**Thursday and**

Friday preceding the fourth Monday in August] third Monday in August shall have the applicant's muzzleloader license number written in the upper corners of the bonus application. The applicant shall write or indicate "Muzzleloader" in the lower left corner of the official envelope.

§ 143.66. Purpose and scope.

This subchapter establishes methods for the application and issuance of bear licenses and provides for the carrying of a bear license.

§ 143.67. Application.

(a) Applications for bear licenses shall be submitted to authorized issuing agents and licenses issued by them under the act and this subchapter.

(b) Applications for bear licenses may be made when purchasing a regular hunting license, or any time thereafter, upon presentation of the regular hunting license.

§ 143.68. Carrying the license.

The bear license shall be signed by the owner in the space provided and shall be carried on the person at all times when the owner is hunting for bear. The bear license does not need to be displayed but shall be produced for inspection upon demand of any officer authorized to enforce this title.

§ 143.69. Unlawful acts.

The following acts are unlawful:

(1) Issuance of a bear license without proof of applicant purchasing a regular hunting license.

(2) Hunting bear without carrying a valid bear license on the person.

(3) Lending a bear license to another.

(4) Failing to produce bear license upon demand of an officer.

§ 143.70. Penalties.

A person who violates this subchapter shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay the penalties provided for in the act.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

[61 PA. CODE CH. 31]

Sales and Use Tax; Duplicating

The Department of Revenue (Department), under authority contained in section 270 of the Tax Reform Code of 1971 (code) (72 P.S. § 7270), proposes to amend § 31.22 (relating to duplicating) to read as set forth in Annex A. Section 270(a) of the code specifically provides that the Department is authorized and empowered to prescribe, adopt, promulgate and enforce, rules and regulations consistent with the provisions of Article II of the code (72 P.S. §§ 7201—7282).

The proposal sets forth more clearly the Department's current policy relating to duplicating. The changes to § 31.22, in part, respond to questions the Department has received, which made it apparent that clarification was needed in the regulation.

Specifically, subsection (a) has been divided into two paragraphs. Paragraph (1) addresses duplication of documents provided by the customer and reiterates existing language with some minor revisions. Paragraph (2) details the treatment of duplication of documents not provided by the customer. This paragraph explains that when the document being duplicated is provided by the vendor in the ordinary course of business, the charge for copies is taxable unless the document is an official document.

Subsection (b) is amended to provide that vendors may claim the resale exemption on purchases of tangible

personal property, such as toner or paper, that is transferred to the customer in connection with the sale of a duplicated document.

Fiscal Impact

The Department has determined that the proposed amendment will have no significant fiscal impact on the Commonwealth.

Paperwork

The proposed amendment will not generate significant additional paperwork for the public or the Commonwealth.

Effectiveness/Sunset Date

The amendments will become effective upon final publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The regulation will be monitored annually. No sunset date has been assigned.

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on February 11, 1997, the Department submitted a copy of this proposed amendment to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the House Committee on Finance and the Senate Committee on Finance. In addition to submitting the proposal, the Department has provided IRRC and the Committees with a copy of a detailed Regulatory Analysis Form prepared by the Department in compliance with Executive Order 1996-1, "Regulatory Review and Promulgation." A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

If IRRC has objections to any portion of the proposed amendment, it will notify the Department within 30 days from the close of the public comment period. The notification shall specify the regulatory review criteria that have not been met by the portion of the proposed amendment to which an objection is made. The act specifies detailed procedures for review of objections raised, prior to final publication of the regulation, by the Department, the General Assembly and the Governor.

CHAPTER 31. IMPOSITION

SPECIALIZED TYPES OF BUSINESS OR PROPERTY

§ 31.22. Duplicating.

(a) *Sale at retail of taxable property.*

(1) Duplication of documents provided by customer: Persons engaged in the process of accurately

duplicating, reproducing or forming a durable medium for the reproduction of an original document are vendors of **[copies] tangible personal property** purchased by their customers, **regardless of whether [or not] the copies are produced to the special order of the customer.** Duplicating includes **[, but is not limited to,]** the production of photostatic copies or blueprints. Sales tax applies to all **[charges for the products sold at retail, including]** charges for the **[making of copies out of materials] duplicating of documents** furnished by the customer. The purchase price may not be reduced on account of expenses incurred **[,]** such as **amounts paid for rentals of equipment, [or] salaries or wages paid to assistants, regardless of whether [or not such] the expenses are itemized in billings to customers.**

(2) Duplication of documents not provided by customer: When the document being duplicated is provided by the vendor in the ordinary course of the vendor's business, the charge for copies sold is taxable unless the document is an official document. An official document includes notes of court testimony, deposition transcripts, medical records, blueprints, driving records, accident reports, birth and death certificates, deeds, divorce decrees and other similar documents.

(b) Purchase of supplies and equipment. Vendors may claim the resale exemption on purchases of tangible personal property, such as toner or paper, that is transferred to the customer in connection with the sale of a duplicated document. The purchase of [items] supplies and equipment, such as chemicals, film, proof paper, developer units or [other supplies] similar items used or consumed in the process of duplicating, reproducing or forming a durable medium for the reproduction of an original is subject to tax, unless the vendor is entitled to claim an exemption under § 32.36 (relating to printing and related businesses). Repair services do not qualify for the resale exemption. [Vendors may claim the resale exemption on purchases of tangible personal property which they directly resell or incorporate into products which they resell.]

Commission Meeting and Public Hearing

The Delaware River Basin Commission will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, February 26, 1997. The hearing will be part of the Commission's regular business meeting which is open to the public and scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. in the Goddard Conference Room of the Commission's offices at 25 State Police Drive, West Trenton, New Jersey.

An informal conference among the Commissioners and staff will be held at 11 a.m. at the same location and will include a presentation on the Christina River Basin point and nonpoint study; a demonstration on the New Castle County GIS program; discussion of proposed amendments to the Southeastern Pennsylvania Ground Water Protected Area Regulations and a review of Basin States' policies on discharges to intermittent streams.

In addition to the subjects listed below which are scheduled for public hearing at the business meeting, the Commission will also address the following matters: Minutes of the January 22, 1997 business meeting; announcements; General Counsel's report; report on Basin hydrologic conditions, a resolution concerning funding in connection with the Christina Basin study and public dialogue.

The subjects of the hearing will be as follows:

Applications for Approval of the Following Projects Under Article 10.3, Article 11 and/or Section 3.8 of the Compact.

1. *New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) D-77-20 CP (Revision No. 3).* An application to add the schedule of experimental augmented conservation releases for Cannonsville Reservoir to the current experimental augmented conservation release program of the Pepacton and Neversink Reservoirs. Along with the Cannonsville Reservoir program, the applicant requests an extension of the existing experimental augmented conservation release program for Pepacton and Neversink Reservoirs for a 3 year period. New release valves at the Cannonsville Reservoir allow a more flexible release schedule and make it feasible to reserve additional storage for thermal stress release when needed. The Neversink Reservoir is located in Sullivan County and the Cannonsville and Pepacton Reservoirs are located in Delaware County, all in New York State.

2. *Merrill Creek Owners Group (MCOG) D-77-110 CP (Amendment No. 10).* An application for inclusion of PECO Energy Company's Fairless Hills Generating Station (a 72 megawatt combustion turbine facility formerly owned by U. S. Steel and approved for operation by PECO via Docket No. D-96-63 on January 22, 1997) as a Designated Unit to Table A (Revised) of the Merrill Creek Reservoir project. This action will allow releases from the reservoir to make up consumptive water use of the plant during drought periods. MCOG expects the Fairless Hills Generating Station to have maximum monthly consumptive water uses of 385,000 gallons per day (gpd) during winter, 124,000 gpd during summer, and 324,000 gpd during spring and fall. The plant is located at the existing U. S. Steel Fairless Hills plant site in Falls Township, Bucks County, PA.

3. *Pennsylvania-American Water Company D-85-86 CP Renewal 2.* An application for the renewal of a groundwater withdrawal project, previously approved under the ownership of Pocono Farms East Water Company, to supply up to 4.68 million gallons (mg)/30 days of water to the applicant's Whispering Glen and Hickory Glen systems from well nos. 2E, 3E and 4E. Commission approval on April 24, 1991 was limited to 5 years. The applicant requests that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 4.68 mg/30 days. The project is located in Coolbaugh Township, Monroe County, PA.

4. *Crystal Water Supply Company, Inc. D-86-22 CP Renewal 2.* An application for the renewal of a groundwater withdrawal project to supply up to 11.23 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's distribution system from well nos. A, B and 1. Commission approval on December 11, 1991 was limited to 5 years. The applicant requests that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 11.23 mg/30 days. The project is located in the Town of Thompson, Sullivan County, NY.

5. *Lake Wynonah Municipal Authority D-91-20 CP Renewal.* An application for the renewal of a groundwater withdrawal project to supply up to 12 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's distribution system from well nos. 1, 2, 3 and 6. Commission approval on August 14, 1991 was limited to 5 years. The applicant requests that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 12 mg/30 days. The project is located in South Manheim and Wayne Townships, Schuylkill County, PA.

6. *City of Coatesville Authority D-96-16 CP.* An application to amend the City of Coatesville Authority (CCA) Docket by extension of the time for compliance with Docket DECISION II.e. which requires the CCA to submit an Operating Plan for conjunctive use of its West Branch Brandywine Creek withdrawal with its multiple-source water supply system including the Rock Run and Hibernia (renamed Chambers Lake) Reservoirs. The project withdrawal is located in West Caln Township, Chester County, PA.

7. *Borough of West Grove D-96-26 CP.* An application to replace the withdrawal of water from well nos. 1 and 6 in the applicant's water supply system which has been contaminated by leakage of gasoline from an underground storage tank. The applicant requests that the withdrawal from replacement well no. 4 (Harmony Road) be limited to 4.5 mg/30 days, and that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 10.8 mg/30 days. The project is located in West Grove Borough, Chester County, PA.

8. *Paunacussing Founders, Inc. D-96-42.* An application for approval of a groundwater withdrawal project to supply up to 6.0 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's Look-A-Way Golf Club from new well nos. 2 and 3, and to limit the withdrawal from all wells to 6.0 mg/30 days. The project is located in Buckingham Township, Bucks County in the Southeastern Pennsylvania Ground Water Protected Area.

9. *Fox Valley Community Services, Inc. D-96-60.* A project to modify and rerate the applicant's existing sewage treatment plant (STP) from 0.056 million gallons/day (mgd) to 0.074 mgd. The STP will continue to provide secondary biological treatment via the extended aeration activated sludge process; after modification to equalize flow (and other minor modifications), the STP will be able to increase its capacity to 0.074 mgd. The STP will continue to serve the Fox Valley residential development

in Concord Township, Delaware County, PA. The project is located in Concord Township just south of U. S. Route 1 and north of the West Branch Chester Creek to which it will continue to discharge.

10. *Simpson Paper Company D-97-3*. An application for approval of an existing combined groundwater and surface water withdrawal project to supply up to 60 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's paper mill from existing well nos. 1 and 2 and Bubbling Springs, and to limit the withdrawal from the wells to 42 mg/30 days, and from Bubbling Springs to 60 mg/30 days. The project withdrawals are located in Whitemarsh Township, Montgomery County in the Southeastern Pennsylvania Ground Water Protected Area. Bubbling Springs is situated on

Spring Mill Run, a tributary of the Schuylkill River.

Written comments or objections, or requests for informal conferences on applications, may be submitted by any person or any officer or head of any Federal, State or local government agency or authority to the Department at the same address within 30 days of this publication, or within 30 days after the last publication of the applicant's newspaper advertisement, as provided by 25 Pa. Code §§ 77.121—77.123 and 86.31—86.34 (relating to public notices of filing of permit applications, opportunity for comment, and informal conferences).

Where any of the mining activities listed below will have discharges of wastewater to streams, the Department will incorporate NPDES permits into the mining activity permits issued in response to these applications. Such NPDES permits will contain, at a minimum, technology-based effluent limitations (as described in the Department's regulations—25 Pa. Code §§ 77.522, 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.242, 89.52 and 90.102) for iron, manganese, suspended solids, settleable solids, alkalinity and pH. In addition to the above, more restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining which may occur will be incorporated into a mining activity permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chs. 93 and 95). Persons or agencies which have requested review of the NPDES permit requirements for a particular mining activity within the above-mentioned public comment period will

be provided with a 30-day period to review and submit comments on those requirements.

Written comments or objections should contain the name, address and telephone number of persons submitting comments or objections; application number; and a statement of sufficient detail to inform the Department on the basis of comment or objection and relevant facts upon which it is based. Requests for an informal conference must contain the name, address and telephone number of requestor; application number; a brief summary of the issues to be raised by the requestor at the conference; and a statement whether the requestor desires to have the conference conducted in the locality of the proposed mining activities.

S. § 904). Municipalities include counties, cities, boroughs, incorporated towns, townships and home rule municipalities. This application period is for eligible materials recycled and marketed in calendar year 1996.

Municipal Recycling Program Performance Grant funds will be awarded to municipalities based upon the weight of source separated recyclable materials identified in § 1501(c)(1)(i) of Act 101 recovered by municipal recycling programs, and the population of the municipality as determined by the most recent decennial census. Municipalities awarded grants will receive a base award of \$5 for each approved ton of eligible recyclable materials marketed, and a bonus award of \$1 per approved ton for each percentage of municipal waste calculated by DEP to be diverted from disposal. The weight of eligible materials allowable from nonresidential (commercial and institutional) sources will be limited to no more than the weight

of approved eligible materials from residential sources. The Department will not award grants calculated to be less than \$10.

Eligible materials include postconsumer: clear glass, colored glass, aluminum, steel and bimetallic cans, high-grade office paper, newsprint, corrugated paper, other marketable grades of paper, and plastics. Grants will be awarded only for properly documented, eligible materials that were actually marketed on or after January 1, 1996, to and including December 31, 1996. Grant funds will not be awarded for residues, materials not listed as eligible including, but not limited to, leaf and yard wastes, or any materials which cannot be documented as being recycled into a new product or use.

Documentation to support all claims that eligible recyclable materials were generated within the municipality and marketed must be retained at the offices of the municipal applicant for 4 years from the end date of the year the application covers. The supporting documentation is not required to be submitted with the application.

Acceptable Supporting Documentation: Weight slips or receipts verifying that the materials were recycled or marketed are required as supporting documentation for the grant application. The documentation must include: 1) the date the materials were recycled/

marketed; and, 2) the type of material recycled/marketed; and 3) the name of the municipality where the material was generated; and, 4) the weight, stated in pounds or tons, of the material recycled/marketed. Documentation supporting materials source separated from municipal waste by commercial/institutional establishments and recycled/marketed must bear the name of the establishment and the municipality where the establishment is located. This information must be contained on one of the following: 1) a weight/market receipt; or, 2) a report submitted by the hauler or market vendor on its company letterhead; or, 3) a signed report submitted by the hauler or market vendor, which clearly indicates the name of the company who collected the material or the name of the market vendor, as well as the name, title and signature of the company official who completed the report. Reports may be submitted on annual, monthly, weekly or other time period format. All information must be legible.

Estimates of weight will not be accepted except in cases where: 1) the material is packaged in uniform bales and the average weight of a bale can be demonstrated and supported by weight receipts, and a record of the number of bales was provided by the market vendors; or when, 2) multiple generators contribute to a known quantity of marketed material, and the hauler or market estimates the quantities attributable to any individual establishment or municipality, and verifies the estimate with a signature.

Supporting documentation must be available for review by representatives of the Department of Environmental Protection, the Office of the Attorney General and the Office of the Treasurer. Although the supporting documentation is not required to be submitted with the grant application, any documentation provided must conform to the above requirements or the materials claimed will not be credited toward the grant award.

Grant applications must be on forms provided by the Department for calendar year 1996. Grant applications must be delivered by 3 p.m., September 30, 1997, or postmarked on or before that day. Applications received by the Department after the deadline will be returned to the applicant. Individual Permits for Sewage Sludge Land Application Under Chapter 275

On January 25, 1997, new regulations relating to the land application of sewage sludge and the beneficial use of municipal waste were published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* as final.

The new regulations allow the Department to issue general permits immediately for the beneficial use of

municipal waste other than sewage sludge. The new sewage sludge general permit authority will be effective on May 27, 1997. This allows the Department time to finalize the sewage sludge land application general permits, which are now available in draft for comment.

The Department may continue to issue individual permits for sewage sludge land application under Chapter 275 regulations, under May 27, 1997. After May 27, 1997, the Department will be able to issue individual permits under Chapter 271, Subchapter J of the recently revised regulations published at 27 Pa.B. 521 (January 25, 1997). Please contact the appropriate Regional Office to determine the best way to proceed with an application during the transition period to provide sufficient time for technical review and public comment.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEARING BOARD

Fairmont Products v. DEP; EHB Doc. No. 95-155-C

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) and Fairmont Products have agreed to an amendment of the settlement in the above matter. The original settlement agreement dated January 17, 1996 was approved by the Environmental Hearing Board by an order dated February 1, 1996. The original agreement required, among other things, that Fairmont Products would present to the Department a request for a thermal variance under 25 Pa. Code § 97.82 and section 316 of The Clean Water Act (33 U.C.S.A. § 1326). Fairmont would conduct a thermal profile of the receiving stream and a biological survey of the creek. On or before January 31, 1997, Fairmont would submit to the Department a final report concerning the proposed alternate effluent limits.

Additionally, Fairmont was obligated to evaluate its housekeeping practices and/or its management of its heat discharge at the Belleville facility, to identify and characterize problems in controlling and limiting any wide variations in its heat discharge. On or before January 31, 1997, Fairmont was obligated to submit to the Department, for the Department's approval, its recommendations, if any, concerning modifications to its housekeeping practices and/or its management of the facility's heat discharge.

Fairmont conducted thermal monitoring of the receiving stream in 1996, but because of high flow conditions in the receiving stream caused by winter precipitation, it was not able to complete a thermal profile. To enable the Department to determine whether Fairmont has successfully demonstrated that alternate thermal effluent limitations will not adversely impact the indigenous aquatic community in the receiving stream, the amendment provides that in 1997 Fairmont will conduct an additional thermal profile of the receiving stream, and in 1998 it will submit it as part of its report to the Department.

Fairmont conducted a review of its housekeeping practices and/or its thermal discharge in 1996, but intends to introduce a new product use this year. The parties believe that it would be beneficial for the proper management of the thermal discharge at the Belleville facility for Fairmont to evaluate its housekeeping practices and/or its management of its heat discharge at the Belleville facility in 1997, and to identify and characterize problems in controlling and limiting any wide variations in the heat discharge.

The parties have agreed to amend the settlement agreement. The major provisions of the amendment include:

1. From early August, 1997 until November, 1997, Fairmont shall implement the thermal profile sampling at each station of the receiving stream.

2. On or before January 31, 1998, Fairmont shall submit to the Department a final report concerning the proposed alternate thermal effluent limitations. The report shall contain the results of the thermal profile sampling and a biological assessment of the receiving stream.

3. Additionally, Fairmont shall evaluate its housekeeping practices and/or its management of its heat discharge at the Belleville facility, to identify and characterize problems in controlling and limiting any wide variations in its heat discharges.

4. On or before January 31, 1998, Fairmont shall also submit to the Department, for the Department's approval, its recommendations, if any, concerning modifications to its housekeeping practices and/or its management of the facility's heat discharge.

5. On or before March 31, 1998, the Department will notify Fairmont of the Department's determination whether Fairmont has successfully demonstrated that such alternate thermal effluent limitations will not adversely impact the indigenous aquatic community in the receiving stream.

INDEPENDENT REGULATORY REVIEW COMMISSION

Department of Transportation—Minimum Standards for Fixed Base Operations; Doc. No. 18-322

Order

On October 4, 1994, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Department of Transportation (Department). This rulemaking would create 67 Pa. Code Chapter 476, establishing minimum standards for fixed base operators (FBO) at state-owned airports. The authority for this regulation is contained in section 5103(a) of the Aviation Code (74 Pa.C.S. § 5103(a)). The proposed regulation was published in the October 15, 1994 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on November 14, 1996. Because the standing committees of the General Assembly did not have their full 20 days to review the regulation prior to the *sine die*

adjournment, the Department was required to resubmit the final regulation on January 27, 1997, under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act.

The regulation applies to FBOs at Harrisburg International Airport and Capital City Airport. The other State-owned airport, Grand Canyon Airport, is not covered by this regulation. According to the Department, the minimum standards established in this regulation do not apply to Grand Canyon because it is presently leased to one airport operator who meets all of the needs of current airport users.

The proposed regulation sets the minimum facility requirements for both Harrisburg International Airport and Capital City Airport. An FBO providing service at Harrisburg International shall provide a minimum of 50,000 square feet of aircraft parking and 10,000 square feet for automobile parking. An FBO at Capital City Airport shall provide a minimum of 40,000 square feet for aircraft parking and 10,000 square feet of automobile parking. An FBO at either airport must provide a building that contains a lounge, public restrooms, training and flight planning offices of at least 2,000 square feet, and a hangar of at least 10,000 square feet.

An FBO must provide aircraft fuel and oil dispensing services, aircraft parking services and hangar storage services. Additionally, an FBO must provide two of the following services: airframe and power plant service; radio and instrument service; air taxi and charter services; flight training services; or ground handling services.

The regulation requires any person desiring to provide fixed base operations to submit a written request to the Department indicating its interest in becoming an FBO. The Department, within 30 days, must respond to this request. Once a written request to conduct fixed base operations is granted by the Department, the FBO and the Department will enter into a written agreement in accordance with the requirements established in this rulemaking. Current agreements between FBOs and the Department are not affected by the requirements established in this chapter until the agreements terminate.

According to the Department, the regulation will not increase costs to either itself or any FBO. Instead, the regulation provides minimum standards for services provided to airport users. Establishing the minimum standards in regulation assures that all FBOs will meet the same requirements. The Department states that this should result in more competition among FBOs and should assure better, quality service.

There is currently only one FBO at both Harrisburg International Airport and Capital City Airport. Their current agreements will not be affected by this rulemaking. However, once their agreements expire, the FBOs must follow the procedures and meet the standards contained in the rulemaking in order to continue to operate.

Our major comment on the proposed rulemaking questioned the need for the regulation. We believed that the minimum standards contained in the regulation could be more appropriately contained in a request for proposal (RFP) since the standards only apply to an FBO that contracts with the Department to provide services. Regulations are more appropriate for situations which apply to multiple locations and govern multiple parties. In this rulemaking, the Department sets different standards for two of its airports and no standards at its third airport. The standards set for each airport would only apply to a

few entities since each airport may only need 2—5 FBOs. Therefore, we questioned the need for establishing the minimum standards by regulation and recommended the Department consider using the RFP process instead.

In response, the Department provided several reasons for the need to proceed with the regulation. First, the Department cited the Office of Budget's Manual for contracting services where it states that an RFP "will be used to obtain consultant, professional and other services when the work statement is detailed, the agency is seeking a contractor's solution to a management problem, and/or criteria, in addition to cost, will be used in evaluating proposals." Under this guidance, the Department believes it is inappropriate to use the RFP process since FBOs do not provide service to the Department. Instead, FBOs are tenants of the Department who provide services to airport users.

Second, the Department indicated that the RFP process would make it difficult to turn down applicants who wish to pick and choose the types of services they wish to provide. The ability of an FBO to provide a less capital intensive service, such as fueling, does not provide a level playing field with those FBOs who provide a full complement of services requiring more capital investment. In order to establish a level playing field, the Department believes it must require all FBOs to provide minimum services to assure that the more capital intensive services are provided. By establishing minimum standards in a regulation, the Department will have a binding norm that all potential applicants can review to determine if they may be eligible to provide services, as well as the process that will be used to make a decision on the application. In addition, the minimum standards also ensure that each FBO meets applicable safety standards.

Third, the Department observed that the regulation sets standards that are similar to the requirements at other airports, none of which utilize an RFP process to select FBOs. These airports include Reading Regional Airport, Johnstown-Cambria County Airport, Lancaster Airport, Hazelton Municipal Airport, Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Airport, and Northeast Philadelphia Airport.

Finally, the Department wrote to the FBOs at Capital City and at Harrisburg International Airport regarding the use of an RFP process instead of establishing a regulation. Both FBOs indicated that they supported using a regulation instead of the RFP process.

We still believe that the Department could have set these minimum standards via an RFP because it only deals with two locations and will only be used by a few FBOs. However, we believe that the Department has justified the use of a regulation to establish the standards and we defer to their judgment that a regulation will be administratively easier. However, we recommend that the Department carefully review the implementation of the regulation to ensure that it is an efficient process to establish FBO agreements at state-owned airports. If the regulation creates unnecessary barriers for FBO services at Commonwealth-operated airports, the Department should amend the regulation accordingly or again consider the use of an RFP process.

A second significant concern with the regulation arose when the Department initially submitted the final-form regulation in September of 1996. Upon our review of the regulation, we notified the Department we had a concern with the lack of specific criteria the Department would use to accept or reject an application. Specifically, the regulation merely provided that the Department could

establish internal review procedures to evaluate the applications and that the Department had the total discretion in the selection or rejection of the application. The regulation did not give any notice or indication as to what criteria would be employed. We believed the regulation should include the criteria used to review applications to provide notice to the affected parties and ensure consistent and fair review of the applications. The Department agreed that such language was necessary and withdrew the regulation to make the amendments.

The resubmitted final-form regulation contains the criteria that will be employed to review applications. We believe the inclusion of the criteria will insure a fair and consistent process for the evaluation of FBOs.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be in the public interest. The regulation will establish minimum standards for FBO services that will be easily understood and available to all potential FBOs. The establishment of the standards will also ensure that all FBOs are providing safe and adequate service at State-owned airports.

Therefore, It Is Ordered That:

1. Regulation No. 18-322 from the Department of Transportation, as submitted to the Commission on January 27, 1997, is approved; and
2. The Commission will transmit a copy of this Order to the Legislative Reference Bureau.
