

READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva-nia Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish such information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44. 1 Pa. Code § 3.44 reads as follows:

§ 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

Title 231—RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

PART I. GENERAL [231 PA. CODE CH. 1910]

Amendments to the Rules of Civil Procedure Relating to Domestic Relations Matters; Recommendation 74 Republication

The Domestic Relations Procedural Rules Committee is planning to recommend that the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania amend the Rules of Civil Procedure relating to domestic relations matters as set forth herein. This proposal has not been submitted for review by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.

This recommendation has been amended since its first publication in light of comments received. It is being republished to solicit comments on the revised proposal.

Notes and explanatory comments which appear with proposed amendments have been inserted by the committee for the convenience of those using the rules. Reports, notes and comments will not constitute part of the rules and will not be officially adopted or promulgated by the Supreme Court.

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 1910. ACTIONS FOR SUPPORT Rule 1910.16-2. Support Guidelines. Calculation of Net Income.

Generally, the amount of support to be awarded is based upon the parties' monthly net income.

- (b) Treatment of Public Assistance, SSI Benefits and Social Security Payments to a Child Due to a Parent's Death, Disability or Retirement.
- (1) Neither public assistance nor Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits shall be counted as income for purposes of determining support.
 - (2) Social Security Derivative Benefits.
- (A) This subdivision (A) shall only be applied if the child is receiving Social Security derivative

benefits as a result of the obligor's retirement or disability. It shall not apply if the benefits are the result of the obligee's retirement or disability. If a child for whom support is sought is receiving Social Security benefits as a result of [a parent's] the obligor's retirement[, death] or disability, the benefits the child receives shall be added to the combined monthly net incomes of the obligor and the obligee to calculate the income available for support on the vertical axis of the basic child support schedule set forth in Rule 1910.16-3. The presumptive amount of support as set forth on the schedule at the combined income of the obligee, obligor and child's benefits shall then be reduced by the amount of the child's benefits before apportioning the remaining support obligation | apportioned between the parties pursuant to Rule 1910.16-4. After such apportionment, the amount of the child's benefit then shall be deducted from the obligor's share of the basic support amount.

- (B) If a child for whom support is sought is receiving Social Security benefits as a result of the obligee's retirement or disability, the benefits shall be added to the obligee's net monthly income and the amount of support calculated without any additional adjustment. The amount of the child's benefit will be included in the obligee's net monthly income on line 4 of the formula at Rule 1910.16-4. It shall not be added on line 6 or subtracted on line 9 or line 12 of the formula.
- (C) For purposes of determining the support obligation of a surviving parent when the child is receiving benefits as the result of the other parent's death, the benefits the child receives shall be added to the combined monthly net incomes of the obligor and the obligee to calculate the income available for support on the vertical axis of the basic child support schedule set forth in Rule 1910.16-3. The presumptive amount of support as set forth on the schedule at the combined incomes of the obligee and the obligor, plus the child's benefits, shall then be reduced by the amount of the child's benefits before apportioning the remaining support obligation between the parties. The income of a non-parent obligee who is caring for a child but has no support obligation to that child shall include only those funds the obligee is receiving on behalf of the child.

Example 1. If the obligor has net income of \$1,200 per month; the obligee has net monthly income of \$800; and the child receives Social Security derivative benefits of \$300 per month as a result of [either] the obligor's [or **obligee's** retirement or disability, then the total combined monthly net income is \$2,300. Using the schedule at Rule 1910.16-3 for one child, the amount of support is \$568 per month. From that amount, subtract the amount the child is receiving in Social Security derivative benefits (\$568 minus \$300 equals \$268). **Then, apply] Apply** the formula at Rule 1910.16-4 to apportion the **[remaining]** basic child support amount of **[\$268] \$568** between the obligor and the obligee in proportion to their respective incomes. The obligor's \$1,200 net income per month is 60% of the total of the obligor's and the obligee's combined net monthly income. Thus, under the formula, the obligor's support obligation would be 60% of [\$268] \$568, or [\$161] \$341, per

month. From that amount, subtract the amount the child is receiving in Social Security derivative benefits (\$341 - \$300 = \$41). The obligor's basic support obligation is \$41.

Corrective Amendment to 31 Pa. Code § 84a.6 (b)(3)

The Insurance Department has discovered a discrepancy between the agency text of 31 Pa. Code § 84a.6(b)(3) (relating to contract services), as deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau and published at 36 Pa.B. 3667 (July 15, 2006), and the official text as printed in the September 2006 Pennsylvania Code Reporter (Master Transmittal Sheet No. 382) and as currently appearing in the Pennsylvania Code. The texts of clauses (A) and (B) were inadvertently omitted from subparagraph (iii) and placed under subparagraph (v).

Therefore, under 45 Pa.C.S. § 901: The Insurance Department has deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau a corrective amendment to 31 Pa. Code § 84a.6(b)(3). The corrective amendment to 31 Pa. Code § 84a.6(b)(3) is effective as of January 1, 2007, the effective date of adoption of the amendment as originally announced in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The correct version of 31 Pa. Code § 84a.6(b)(3) appears in Annex A, with ellipses referring to the existing text of the regulation.

(3) Termination rates.

- (i) Termination rates used in the computation of reserves shall be on the basis of a mortality table as specified in Appendix A except as noted in subparagraphs (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v).
- (ii) Total termination rates may be used at ages and durations when these exceed specified mortality table rates, but not in excess of the lesser of 80% of the total termination rate used in the calculation of the gross premiums or 8%.
- (iii) For long-term care individual contracts and group certificates issued on and after January 1, 1999, termination rates in addition to the specified mortality table rates may be used. The termination rates other than mortality may not exceed the following:
- (A) For policy years 1 through 4, the lesser of 80% of the voluntary lapse rate used in the calculation of gross premiums and 8%.
- (B) For policy years 5 and later, the lesser of 100% of the voluntary lapse rate used in the calculation of gross premiums and 4%.
- (iv) For long-term care individual contracts and group certificates issued on and after January 1, 2007, the following termination rates in addition to the mortality table rates specified in Appendix A may be used.
- (A) For policy year 1, the lesser of 80% of the voluntary lapse rate used in the calculation of gross premiums and 6%.
- (B) For policy years 2 through 4, the lesser of 80% of the voluntary lapse rate used in the calculation of gross premiums and 4%.
- (C) For policy years 5 and later, the lesser of 100% of the voluntary lapse rate used in the calculation of gross premiums and 2%, except for group long-term care insurance where the 2% shall be 3%.
- (v) For single premium credit disability insurance, termination rates may not be used.
 - (4) Reserved methods.

A person who demonstrates attainment of one, a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a Site-Specific Standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality within which the site is located may

request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

The extension request shall be submitted in writing at least 15 days prior to the end of the Period of Temporary Operation and shall provide a description of the compliance status of the source. The extension request shall include a detailed schedule for establishing compliance and the reasons compliance has not been established. This Period of

Temporary Operation may be extended for additional limited periods, each not to exceed 120 days, by submitting an extension request as described above.

If, at any time, the Department has cause to believe that air contaminant emissions from the sources listed in this plan approval may be in excess of the limitations specified in, or established pursuant to this plan approval or the permittee's operating permit, the permittee may be required to conduct test methods and procedures deemed necessary by the Department to determine the actual emissions rate. The testing shall be conducted in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapter 139, when applicable, and in accordance with any restrictions or limitations established by the Department at such time as it notifies the company that testing is required.

Project Description: The Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority, which administers the Commonwealth's State Revolving Fund, is intended to be the funding source for this project. The Houtzdale Municipal Authority proposes construction of Well Th-14, surface water intake, raw water pumping station, transmission line, treatment plant modifications, Henderson booster pump station and storage tank. The Department's review of the project and the information received in the Environmental Report for the project has not identified any significant, adverse environmental impact resulting from this proposal. The Department hereby approves the Environmental Assessment.

Bureau of Mine Safety Approval of Request for Variance

The Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Mine Safety (BMS) has approved AMFIRE Mining Company LLC's request for a variance from the requirements of section 242(c) of the Pennsylvania Bituminous Coal Mine Act at the Gillhouser Run Mine. This notification contains a summary of this request and the basis for the Department's approval. A complete copy of the variance request may be obtained from Cathy Dunn by calling (724) 439-7469 or from the BMS web site at www.depweb.state.pa.us/deepminesafety/site/default.asp.

Summary of the Request: AMFIRE Mining Company LLC requested a variance from Section 242(c) of the Pennsylvania Bituminous Coal Mine Act to allow for the common ventilation of belt conveyor entry with other entries at the Gillhouser Run Mine. The proposal accords protections to persons and property substantially

equal to or greater than the requirements set forth in the Pennsylvania Bituminous Coal Mine Act.

The basis for the Bureau's approval is summarized as follows:

- 1. The Pyott-Boone 9500 CO Monitoring System will provide advance warning of a developing mine fire originating in the conveyor belt entry. When maintained and operating correctly, this system provides warnings much earlier than the point type heat sensors.
- 2. Common entries would permit the larger section mantrip and scoops access to belt entry for transportation of personnel and supplies.
- 3. The operator will maintain a separate isolated intake escapeway that is at a higher air pressure than the belt and common entries.
- 4. The plan provides for the common entries to serve as an alternate intake escapeway. There will be a total of three separate, isolated escape routes.

This approval is limited to a variance from the requirements in section 242(c) requiring that the belt entry is isolated from other entries. All other terms and requirements of section 242(c) shall remain in effect. Continued authorization for operation under the approval is contingent upon compliance with the measures described in the plan and the following conditions:

- 1. All mine employees shall be task trained in the Pyott-Boone 9500 CO monitoring system alert and alarm response procedures. These procedures shall also be included in the 8-hour annual retraining.
- 2. As part of the requirements of section 228, all belt entries, common entries and unfenced roadways shall be preshifted in their entirety.
- 3. Designated areas (DA) shall be established a strategic locations along the belt entry and common entry to determine whether the air is traveling in the proper course and normal volume. This air reading shall be taken by a scientific means (anemometer, chemical smoke tube, velometer).

Improvements to the NPDES Postconstruction Stormwater Management Permitting Process

In 2000, amendments were implemented to the Federal Clean Water Act that have, as a result, increased the demand for stormwater permits issued by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) over the last 6 years. These amendments, which include new permitting requirements for sites less than 5 acres but greater than 1 acre, have in 6 years nearly doubled the workload of Departmental staff responsible for reviewing processing NPDES Postconstruction Stormwater Permits. As a result, the time required for Department review of the permit application has increased.

To address these issues, including improving the quality of permit applications and reducing the Department's review time of NPDES Postconstruction Stormwater Management permit applications, the Department considered four initiatives for which it requested public comment as 36 Pa.B. 6738 (November 4, 2006). During the 30-day public comment period, the Department received comments from 28 commentators. While some commentators expressed support of the initiatives outlined by the Department, some requested additional detail on the initiatives and recommended the Department proceed cautiously with their strategy.

After consideration and careful deliberation of the public comments received to improve NPDES Post-construction Stormwater Management Permitting, the Department has finalized the initiatives summarized in this notice and scheduled their implementation. The Department's written responses to the specific public comments submitted can be accessed on the Department's website at www.depweb.state.pa.us (DEP Keywords: Stormwater).

Initiative 1: Encourage the Use of a Simultaneous Review Process for Erosion and Sediment Control and Postconstruction Stormwater Plan Review

Implementation: The Department will continue to advance the use of a simultaneous review process for Erosion and Sediment Control and Postconstruction Stormwater Management (PCSM) Plan reviews. This process encourages the owner/applicant and their "project team" to meet with municipal officials and staff from the Department and County Conservation Districts to discuss the conceptual, or preliminary design plans of the project. This allows the exchange of information on the project and applicable requirements in the early development stages. Under this initiative, the Department will not issue a final permit decision during the preapplication process; however, a summary of the preapplication meeting will be maintained by the Department or Conservation District in the permit applicant's file.

Initiative 2: Expedited Permit Review where applicants have Municipal or County Conservation District Approval of the PCSM Plan and that the Plan has been sealed by a Professional Engineer (PE) who has attended Best Management Practices (BMP) Manual training and has demonstrated knowledge and experience in preparing PCSM Plans

Implementation: The Department will provide expedited permit reviews where applicants have municipal or County Conservation District approval of the PCSM Plan, which must be sealed by a qualified Licensed Professional (LP) who has attended BMP Manual training provided by the Department or other training recognized by the Department and demonstrates proficiency in the

stormwater management program through the submission of a complete and quality application. The Department will also provide expedited permit reviews to land developers whose PCSM plans are approved by a County Conservation District with PSCM delegation. The expedited review has the expectation of final permit action within 66 calendar days (this includes the public notification process and 30 day public comment period) of receipt of a final application meeting the previous requirements. In the event neither a municipality or County Conservation District is equipped to approve a plan but the plans are sealed by an LP who has attended BMP Manual training, the Department will conduct a review of the PCSM Plan concurrent with the County Conservation District's review of the Erosion and Sediment Control Plan. The Department will make a permit decision within 66-calendar days of receipt of an administratively complete application. Exceptions to this time frame include situations where applications are administratively or technically deficient and those where a public meeting has been requested.

The Department is working with the County Conservation Districts to develop a modified delegation agreement to include the District's review of PCSM plans. The State Conservation Commission must approve the modified delegation agreement prior to the Department's implementation of this initiative.

Instructions for utilizing an expedited permit review process for NPDES Postconstruction Stormwater Permits are available on the Department's website at www. depweb.state.pa.us (DEP Keywords: Stormwater).

Initiative 3: Development of New General Permits (GPs) and Clarification of Existing General Permits

Implementation: The Department has developed a fact sheet that explains the permit requirements for the development of small home lots entitled "Soil Erosion And Sediment Requirements For Single-Family Residence, Individual Lot Construction And Minor Construction Project Activities." The fact sheet identifies and explains the regulatory and permit requirements for development of single-family home lots and minor construction project activities. Depending on the size and scope of a project, the Fact Sheet identifies various requirements ranging from implementing and maintaining BMPs and Erosion and Sediment Control Plans to requiring an NPDES permit for stormwater discharges associated with construction activities. The Fact Sheet can be found on the Department's website at www.depweb.state.pa.us (DEP Keywords: Erosion Control).

Further, the Department continues to evaluate all possibilities to provide additional NPDES GPs for use in nonspecial protection waters.

Initiative 4: Third-Party Service Providers—Issuance of Request for Information (RFI)

Implementation: Under this initiative, the Department will solicit qualified consultants, including County Conservation Districts to assist applicants in preparing NPDES Stormwater permit applications or facilitating the application development process. Applications that reflect the full benefits of these services will qualify for expedited NPDES permit reviews by the Department.

To implement this initiative, the Department will issue a Request for Information (RFI) to solicit information from interested parties on their capabilities to assist applicants in preparing NPDES Stormwater permit applications. The Request for Information can be found at www.dgsweb.state.pa.us/comod/main.asp (Search by using

RFI 2006-1). Upon receipt and evaluation of this information, the Department will post a list of Qualified Providers on the Department's website at www.depweb.state. pa.us (DEP Keywords: Stormwater). Proposed Revision to the State Implementation Plan for the Pittsburgh-Beaver Valley 8-Hour Ozone Nonattainment Area; Public Hearing

Ground-level ozone concentrations above the Federal health-based standard are a serious human health threat and can also cause damage to crops, forests and wildlife. The Pittsburgh-Beaver Valley Area 8-hour Ozone Nonattainment Area has met the health-based National ambient air quality standard for ozone based on 2003-2005 concentrations. Therefore, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) plans to submit a request to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to redesignate this nonattainment area to attainment of the 8-hour ozone national ambient air quality standard (NAAQS). The Department is seeking public comment on the 8-hour ozone redesignation request, the 2002 base year inventory and a State Implementation Plan revision setting forth a Maintenance Plan, which demonstrates that the area can maintain the healthbased ozone standard for the next 10 years as required under section 175A(a) of the Federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. § 7505a). The Maintenance Plan, once approved by the EPA, will also establish new motor vehicle emission budgets for purposes of transportation conformity.

On February 20, 2007, the Environmental Quality Board (Board) accepted a rulemaking petition for study under 25 Pa. Code Chapter 23 (relating to Environmental Quality Board Policy for processing petitions—statement of policy). The petition, submitted by the Delaware Riverkeeper Network, in partnership with Perkiomen Valley Trout Unlimited, Lehigh County Conservation District, Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy, Montgomery County Conservation District, and over 80 co-petitioners, requests the Board amend 25 Pa. Code § 93.9f (relating to drainage list F) to upgrade the Upper Perkiomen Watershed to Exceptional Value Waters (EV) and Macoby

Creek to High Quality Waters (HQ). The petitioner's request also includes the redesignation of Hosensack Creek (Montgomery County) from Cold Water Fishes (CWF) to EV; Perkiomen Creek (Berks County) from HQ-CWF to EV; Perkiomen Creek (Montgomery County) from Trout Stocking (TSF) to EV; West Branch Perkiomen (Berks County) from CWF to EV; West Branch Perkiomen Creek (Montgomery County) from CWF to EV; and Macoby Creek (Montgomery County) from TSF to HQ.

Under 25 Pa. Code § 93.4d(a) (relating to processing petitions, evaluations and assessments to change a designated use), the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is required to publish a notice of intent to assess candidate waters before performing survey work. The Department's assessment notice for the Upper Perkiomen Watershed will appear in a future issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

At the next Commission meeting on April 16 and 17, 2007, the Commission will consider designating the following lake as water subject to proposed special fishing regulations under 58 Pa. Code Chapter 65, effective January 1, 2008:

2007 Changes to List of Class A Wild Trout Waters

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) is considering changes to its list of Class A Wild Trout Streams. Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.8a (relating to Class A wild trout streams), it is the Commission's policy to manage self-sustaining Class A wild trout populations as a renewable natural resource to conserve that resource and the angling it provides. Class A wild trout populations represent the best of Pennsylvania's naturally reproducing trout fisheries. The Commission manages these stream sections solely for the perpetuation of the wild trout fishery with no stocking.

The criteria developed for Class A Wild Trout fisheries are species specific. Wild Trout Abundance Class Criteria include provisions for:

- (i) Wild Brook Trout Fisheries.
- (A) Total brook trout biomass of at least 30 kg/ha (26.7 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least $0.1\ kg/ha$ (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Brook trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.

- (ii) Wild Brown Trout Fisheries.
- (A) Total brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Brown trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.
 - (iii) Mixed Wild Brook and Brown Trout Fisheries.
- (A) Combined brook and brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least $0.1\ kg/ha$ (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (D) Brook trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Brown trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
 - (iv) Wild Rainbow Trout Fisheries.

Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 2.0 kg/ha (1.78 lbs/acre).

In order for a water to be removed from the Class A Wild Trout Streams designation, total trout biomass must be documented below the set criteria for two consecutive stream examinations.

At its meeting on April 16 and 17, 2007, the Commission intends to consider adding Tannery Hollow Run, Section 01, in Cameron County to its list of Class A Wild Trout Streams. Tannery Hollow Run is a tributary to Sterling Run. Section 01 extends for a distance of 2.75 miles, from the headwaters downstream to the mouth. Based on a stream examination inventory conducted by Commission staff in August 2006, Section 01 supported an estimated wild brook trout biomass of 40.04 kg/ha and met the biomass criteria for designation as a Class A wild brook trout water. The Commission will not consider the removal of any streams from the list at the April 2007 meeting.

2007 Classification of Wild Trout Streams; Additions, Deletions and Adjustment

Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.11 (relating to listing of wild trout streams), it is the policy of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) to accurately identify and classify stream sections supporting naturally reproducing populations of trout as wild trout streams. The Commission's Fisheries Management Division maintains the list of wild trout streams. The Executive Director, with the approval of the Commission, will from time-to-time publish the list of wild trout streams in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The listing of a stream section as a wild trout stream is a biological designation that does not determine how it is managed. The Commission relies upon many factors in determining the appropriate management of streams.

At the next Commission meeting on April 16 and 17, 2007, the Commission will consider changes to its list of wild trout streams. Specifically, the Commission will consider the removal of the following stream from the list:
