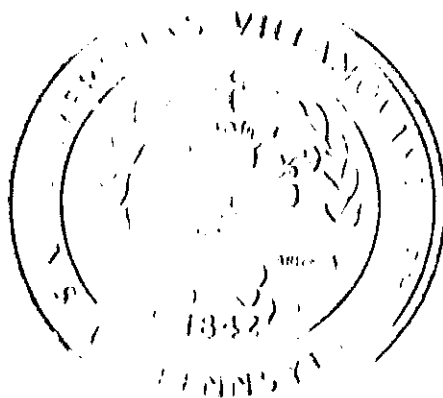

THE CARDINAL DOUGHERTY HIGH SCHOOL BAND

The Cardinal Dougherty High School Band, under the direction of moderator Reverend John A. Danks, represents the largest Catholic high school in the world.

The band has achieved honors in America and in Europe. During a 1966 European tour, the band performed at the Vatican for Pope Paul VI and earned the highest number of points ever scored in the Marching Band Competition of the World Music Festival at Kerkrade, Holland.

On this continent, the Cardinal Dougherty band has appeared in Florida, New England and Canada. The band, which consists of 226 members, includes musicians, drill team and color guard and was seen by more than 200 million people, live and via television, in its fifty performances last year.

The concert band, made up of 120 boys under the baton of Mr. James R. Watson, music director, is appearing at Villanova's Commencement exercises for the second time.
