

# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

# Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency

wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

### **How to Find Documents**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state. pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde\_index.cfm.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is available at www.pabulletin.com.

### **Printing Format**

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised. A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

### Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish such information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44. 1 Pa. Code § 3.44 reads as follows:

### § 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

# Title 255—LOCAL COURT RULES

### SCHUYLKILL COUNTY

Criminal Rule of Procedure 530 Designation, Duties and Powers of County Bail Agency; AD 64-15

### **Order of Court**

And Now, this 22nd day of June, 2015 at 3:30 p.m., Schuylkill County Criminal Rule of Procedure, Rule 530, Designation, Duties and Powers of County Bail Agency is adopted for use in the Court of Common Pleas of Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania, Twenty-First Judicial District, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, effective thirty days after publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

The Clerk of Courts of Schuylkill County is Ordered and Directed to do the following:

- 1) File seven (7) certified copies of this Order and Rules with the Administrative Office of the Pennsylvania Courts.
- 2) Forward two (2) certified copies of this Order and Rule and a CD-ROM containing the text of the local rules to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
- 3) Forward one (1) certified copy of this Order and Rules with the Pennsylvania Criminal Procedural Rules Committee.
- 4) Forward one (1) copy to the Schuylkill County Law Library for publication in the Schuylkill Legal Record.
- 5) Copies shall be kept continuously available for public inspection in the Office of the Schuylkill County Clerk of Courts and the Schuylkill County Law Library.

It is further *Ordered* that said rule as it existed prior to the amendment is hereby repealed and annulled on the effective date of said rule as amended, but no right acquired thereunder shall be disturbed.

# Rule 530. Designation, Duties and Powers of County Bail Agency.

- (a) The Schuylkill County Bail Release Program, which shall be administered by the Schuylkill County Adult Probation Department, is hereby designated as the county bail agency pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 530.
- (b) The county bail agency shall have all the duties and powers specified in Pa.R.Crim.P. 530, which shall include, but not be limited to:
- (1) the authority to make recommendations to the bail authorities concerning the conditions of release on bail;
- (2) the authority to supervise defendants released on bail pursuant to conditions approved by the bail authorities;

- (3) the power to subject defendants released on bail under its supervision to reasonable rules and regulations to implement the bail agency's functions; and
- (4) upon issuance of a bail piece, to apprehend and detain a defendant for the purpose of bringing the defendant before the bail authority pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 536(B).
- (i) A defendant taken into custody pursuant to a bail piece issued by a judge of the Court shall be processed in accordance with the procedure set forth in Pa.R.Crim.P. 150
- (c) The county bail agency shall, in all cases, be qualified and empowered to act as the supervisory agency over all defendants committed to supervised bail if so designated by the Court or other bail authority; but the county bail agency shall incur no financial liability by acting as the supervisory agency.
- (d) Designation by the bail authority of the county bail agency as the supervisory agency in a bail case shall subject the defendant to the supervisory rules and regulations of the county bail agency.
- (e) The county bail agency is hereby authorized to charge the defendant such fees for the performance of its supervisory duties as may be authorized from time to time by administrative order of the Court. The fees so charged to the defendant shall be payable to the County of Schuylkill.
- (f) Nothing in this rule shall prohibit the posting of any other type of bail permitted by Pa.R.Crim.P. 527 or 528 by a private or licensed surety.
- (g) Any designation of the Schuylkill County Bail Release Program as the supervisory agency shall be listed on the bail bond as a condition of bond pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 526.


Reorganization of the Governor's Office of the Budget

Annually the Department of Community and Economic Development (Department) prepares the Action Plan which outlines the method of distribution for Federal funding received by the Department. This Federal funding includes the HOME program. An Action Plan for these funds was finalized and submitted to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on July 7, 2014, and an amendment was submitted to HUD on July 1, 2015. The Department is proposing changes to the method of distribution for the HOME, which according to the Pennsylvania Citizen Participation Plan for the Consolidated Plan, constitute a significant change in the distribution of funds under the program and thus necessitate a substantial amendment to the original action plan.

The substantial amendment to the Action Plan and supporting documentation is available for a 30-day public comment period and can be viewed on the Department's web site at http://www.newpa.com/. The text is available to sight and hearing-impaired persons using technological assisted devices by means of the Department's previously listed web site. A translation into Spanish will also be available on the Department's web site for citizen com-

ment. The final version of the substantial amendment will be submitted to HUD no later than August 6, 2015.

Availability of the 21st Century Community Learning Centers 2015-2018 Request for Applications and 21st Century Community Learning Centers Cohort 8 Grant Paper Application and Instructions

The Department of Education (Department) announces the availability of the 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) 2015-2018 Request for Applications (RFA) and the 21st CCLC Cohort 8 Grant Paper Application and Instructions for 2015-2018. The Cohort 8 application for the 21st CCLC grant will be created, submitted, collected and competed by means of a paper application process.

The purpose of the program is to establish or expand community learning centers that provide students who attend high-poverty and low-performing schools with academic enrichment opportunities by expanding learning

opportunities during nonschool hours along with activities designed to complement the students' regular academic program. Community learning centers must also offer families of these students literacy and related educational development. Centers, which can be located in elementary or secondary schools or other similarly accessible facilities, provide a range of high-quality services to support student learning and development, including tutoring and mentoring, homework help, academic enrichment (such as hands-on science or technology programs) and community service opportunities, as well as music, arts, sports and cultural activities. At the same time, centers help working parents by providing a safe environment for students during nonschool hours or periods when school is not in session.

### Application Process

The 21st CCLC Grant RFA and Guidance for Fiscal Years (FY) 2015-2018, the 21st CCLC Cohort 8 Grant Paper Application and Instructions for 2015-2018 and all attachments for new grants will be available online beginning July 1, 2015, on the Department's 21st CCLC web site at www.education.pa.gov (Keywords: 21st CCLC).

Applicants are required to complete each section of the 21st CCLC paper application explained in the 21st CCLC Cohort 8 Grant Paper Application and Instructions for 2015-2018 document and submit the completed application to Maribel Martinez at the Department's Division of Student Services at the address listed as follows by 12 p.m. on Wednesday, August 5, 2015. All sections must be completed to submit the application. No sections of the paper application are optional. Faxed and e-mailed copies will not be accepted. Originals, paper copies and attachments received after the deadline will not be reviewed. Failure to submit the required copies of the signatory documents by the deadline will result in the disqualification of the grant application and denial to proceed to the peer review.

### Prior to Grant Award

All potential applicants must complete the following steps:

- 1. Notify the Department by means of e-mail of the applicant's intent to submit an application. Include the legal name of entity and either the AUN (school districts/charter schools/intermediate units) or EIN (all other organizations) and vendor number for the lead organization. Specify in the letter of intent to apply the target population to be served including grade levels, proposed site locations, district and school names, community based organization partners, and the like. E-mail the letter of intent to sdannunzio@pa.gov by 4 p.m. on Monday, July 13, 2015. Note this is due prior to the paper application submission deadline. No extensions will be granted.
- 2. If the agency is not a school district, charter school or intermediate unit, the agency will need to register for a vendor number. Nonprocurement entities can apply for a brand new vendor number at www.vendorregistration. state.pa.us. Applicants must have a vendor number to do business with the Commonwealth and so that the applicants can be paid by the Commonwealth if their application is selected for funding. Once applicants have a vendor number, applicants will provide the vendor number on the Title Page form and grant agreement document.
- 3. Consult with eligible nonpublic entities located within the attendance area of local education agencies (LEA) regarding participation in the proposed 21st CCLC

program. Complete the Certification of Nonpublic Involvement Form located in Appendix A of the 21st CCLC Grant RFA and Guidance for FY 2015-2018. (Charter school applicants need not complete.)

4. Register for and attend one preproposal workshop. One preproposal workshop will be simultaneously broadcast from Harrisburg Pennsylvania Training and Technical Assistance Network (PaTTAN) on Monday, July 13, 2015, to the King of Prussia and Pittsburgh PaTTAN locations.

#### Submission

Paper applications with attachments for 21st CCLC funding must be submitted by mail or hand delivered to the Department. Applications submitted by e-mail, facsimile or any method other than the approved mailed paper submission will not be accepted. Applications submitted by means of overnight mail must be received at the Department's Division of Student Services no later than 12 p.m. on Wednesday, August 5, 2015. Print a paper copy of the completed paper application with all attachments for the applicant's own records.

Forward original signature documents signed in blue ink to the Department no later than 12 p.m. on Wednesday, August 5, 2015, to the attention of Maribel Martinez, Fiscal Technician, Department of Education, Division of Student Services, 333 Market Street, 5th Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17126-0333.

*Note*: Failure to submit the required copies of the signatory documents by the deadline will result in the disqualification of the grant application and denial to proceed to the peer review. A list of required signature documents is provided in the Cohort 8 Grant Application and Instructions.

Eligible entities may apply for funding on behalf of one or more public schools within the applicant district through a single paper application process. Each district is limited to one application per district.

### Pregrant Workshops/Webinar

To assist eligible applicant entities in completing the paper application, the Department will host a 1-day 21st CCLC pregrant workshop at the three regional PaTTAN offices located in Harrisburg, King of Prussia and Pittsburgh on Monday, July 13, 2015, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The presentation in Harrisburg will be live and streamed to the other two PaTTAN locations.

Participation in a pregrant workshop is required for all eligible community-based organizations, school districts or charter schools, intermediate units, faith-based organizations and Nationally affiliated service organizations planning to submit an application for the 21st CCLC competitive funds for 2015-2018. To register, e-mail Jeanette Medina at jemedina@pa.gov. No phone calls. Include the location where the applicant will attend, the applicant's name, e-mail address, telephone number and the name of the organization that is planning to apply. Be aware that an access code will be required for entry at the Pittsburgh PaTTAN location.

### Funding Availability

The Department will have approximately \$18 million available for Cohort 8 grants. Applicants may select to provide out-of-school time programming (that is, before school, afterschool, holidays, weekends and summer school services) focused on improving prekindergarten through grade 12 performance measures of school attendance, classroom performance or reduced disciplinary

referrals, or both, and meeting State and local academic achievement standards in reading, math and science. In keeping with the 21st CCLC nonregulatory guidance that larger, more comprehensive grants are more likely to have a measurable impact on student achievement, applicants proposing services for traditional afterschool programming during the regular after school hours, weekends, evenings and summer may request funds ranging from a minimum of \$50,000 to a maximum of up to \$400,000. Programs that propose to provide both school year and summer programming are more powerful for results and data; therefore, no funds will be available for applicants who do not propose a minimum of 6 weeks of summer programming. There will be no summer-only applicants in this grant round.

Communities or organizations may apply together to share resources, so long as statutory requirements are met. The Department can determine what constitutes an eligible consortium as long as the Commonwealth's determination is consistent with program requirements. Only one contract will be issued for each application selected for funding, even for joint proposals. In the case of a joint application, the identified entity will have fiscal and contractual responsibility. Only those community-based organizations and Nationally affiliated service organizations who will be partnering with Commonwealth schools are eligible to apply. The services to be provided must target the neediest of this Commonwealth's students and their families.

Per section F-12 of United States Department of Education 21st CCLC Non-Regulatory Guidance, communities that presently have a 21st CCLC Grant from the Department are eligible to receive additional funds under the Department administered program. The United States Department of Education Non-Regulatory Guidance document can be accessed at http://www2.ed.gov/programs/21stcclc/guidance2003.pdf. However, local applicants should be aware that new funds must be used in a manner consistent with all the requirements of the statute and must be used only to supplement, not supplant, any Federal, State or local dollars available to support activities allowable under the 21st CCLC program.

### Federal Funding Priorities

The Department will give competitive priority to applications that both propose to serve students who attend schools identified for improvement (under section 1116 of Title I) and that are submitted jointly between at least one LEA receiving funds under Title I, Part A and at least one public or private community organization.

In determining whether an application has been "submitted jointly," the Department will look for evidence of:

- a. Collaboration in the planning and design of the program.
- b. Substantial roles for each partner in the delivery of services and management and oversight of the program.
  - c. Shared grant resources to carry out roles.
  - d. One partner serving as the fiscal agent.
  - e. Integration with the regular school day program.

Only one contract will be issued for each application selected for funding, even for joint proposals. Communities or organizations may apply together to share resources, so long as statutory requirements are met. The Department has determined that for the purpose of the 21st CCLC grant, the following constitute an eligible

consortium: two or more individual companies; community-based organizations; service-related organizations; or educational entities that partner together to benefit the students at the educational site locations targeted for program implementation for the purpose of the grant and who actively contribute to and collaborate on the 21st CCLC-funded project. Only one partner will be named as the grantee if selected for funding and will have the fiduciary and fiscal responsibilities for the grant. Consequently, every joint application must identify only one organization to be designated as the grantee and the fiscal agent on behalf of all members of the consortium. That entity will have fiscal and contractual responsibility for carrying out the proposed grant program. The Department encourages joint collaborators to identify a grantee that has expertise in managing the fiscal and contractual obligations required by 21st CCLC. Organizations do not have to demonstrate prior experience in providing afterschool programs to be eligible to apply for a grant, but must describe the likelihood of successful implementation and the capability to provide activities and services outlined in the proposal. Members seeking payment for services will be considered providers rather than part-

Letters of endorsement are not by themselves sufficient evidence that organizations or school districts have substantially been involved in the design of a program. Letters of support of applications received will not be reviewed as part of the peer review process. Refrain from submitting letters of support.

As mandated by Federal law (Pub. L. No. 107-110, § 4204(i)), highest funding priority will be given to applications that meet both of the following conditions:

- 1. The applicant proposes to serve students who attend school districts that have been identified for improvement by the Department.
- 2. The application has been submitted jointly by at least one LEA receiving funds under Title I, Part A, and at least one public or private community organization.

To be viewed as a joint application, there must be evidence that: (1) the LEA and at least one other organization collaborated in the planning and design of the program; (2) each have substantial roles to play in the delivery of services; (3) both share grant resources to carry out those roles; and (4) both have significant ongoing involvement in the management and oversight of the program.

### The Commonwealth's Funding Priority

Up to 65 additional priority points could be assigned to applications demonstrating prior program experience and that propose highest quality programming for the priority area targeted. Following are the additional priority areas:

- 1. Preference for funding will be given to qualified applicants proposing to provide afterschool services to students attending schools designated as "priority" or "focus" schools with school performance profile scores in the lowest 5% to 10% of Title I schools and will receive the highest funding priority consideration for 21st CCLC funds. All applicants must meet this Commonwealth priority to receive highest funding priority consideration. The 2014-2015 Priority and Focus schools can be found at www.education.pa.us (The Department will award points for this application required priority.)
- 2. Preference for funding will be given to qualified applicants with demonstrated previous experience and success in providing services to elementary, middle and

high school students in grades 2—12 and who propose offering Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) and the addition of Arts education to STEM services (STEAM) exclusively to students from eligible elementary, middle schools and high schools in grades 2—12. Programs that integrate the proposed afterschool programming with existing research-based programs and that demonstrate effective utilization of STEM and have previous experience and success in providing STEM or STEAM, and in raising the awareness and understanding of students about STEM/STEAM activities by infusing STEM/STEAM into expanded learning opportunities, after school and summer programming and that meet the previous criteria, could be eligible for up to ten extra priority points based upon the quality of their proposal.

3. Preference for funding will be given to qualified applicants offering credit recovery to high school students. An applicant may propose to use 21st CCLC program funds for a before-school or after-school program or activity for which participants may receive credit toward high school graduation requirements if: (1) a program or activity is an expansion of the options for receiving high school credit in a particular area that would not have been provided without the 21st CCLC program; and (2) the program or activity does not replace or reduce the courses and programs normally provided by a local school district or private school (that is, there is no reduction in the course offerings or costs in that particular academic area). Note that a drop in program is unallowable, credit recovery students must attend the program for all portions of the program, and credit recovery must include a blended approach of face-to-face instructor led components and online programming. The online component cannot be 100% of the teaching methodology. Applicants could be eligible for up to ten extra priority points based upon the quality of their proposal.

*Note*: It is important to note that it is the responsibility of the entity to award the credit. There must be a letter of agreement between the LEA and the grantee clarifying the responsibility of recording the credits.

- 4. Preference for funding will be given to qualified applicants offering career and college readiness opportunities for high school students in grades 10-12 and who document evidence of expanding career connections for students while promoting career-technical and college routes. Career and college readiness programming must offer the following: alignment with realistic college attendance aspirations; academic planning for college and career readiness; academic enrichment opportunities to improve grades, and college or technical school eligibility; offer assistance in paper and online applications; helping students to prepare for careers, technical school or college; provide structured homework help, college counseling services, and afterschool and summer learning programs; and provide engaging learning opportunities for youth by connecting learning to careers, college and other future plans. An applicant may propose to use 21st CCLC program funds for a before or afterschool program or activity that provides participants with early and ongoing exposure to career and college readiness opportunities for high school students. Applicants could be eligible for up to ten extra priority points based upon the quality of their proposal.
- 5. Preference for funding will be given to qualified applicants proposing services to K—12 students located in counties, communities and schools identified by the Department as those that have not previously housed 21st CCLC programs or received funding as an applicant or

part of a consortium. Preference for funding will be given to qualified applications from communities across this Commonwealth that have not previously received 21st CCLC funding. To qualify for this priority no member of the consortium group or any single applicant agency, district or community-based agency will have received a 21st CCLC grant under any name since 2008. Applicants could be eligible for up to 20 extra priority points based upon the quality of their proposal.

6. High risk grantees may have up to 40 points deducted from their application rubric subtotal score based upon prior grant history, failure to comply with the general or specific terms and conditions of the grant, and failure to meet the expected performance goals as described in their prior applications.

### Period of Availability

The grant period will range from October 1, 2015, to September 30, 2018.

### Eligible Applicants

Federal law mandates, per section 4203(a)(3), that any public or private organization may apply for 21st CCLC funding if it proposes to serve:

- 1. Students who primarily attend either:
- a. Schools eligible for schoolwide programs under (Title I) section 1114.
- b. Schools that serve a high percentage of students (at least 40%) from low-income families.
  - 2. The families of those students described previously.

Preference for funding will be given to qualified applicants designated as "priority" or "focus" schools with school performance profile scores in the lowest 5% to 10% of Title I schools will receive the highest funding priority consideration for 21st CCLC funds. All applicants must meet this Commonwealth priority to receive highest funding priority consideration.

Additional Commonwealth funding priorities can be found in the 21st CCLC Grant RFA and Guidance for FY 2015-2018.

### Due Process for Unsuccessful Applicants

• Upon written request, applicants not selected for funding may submit a request on agency letterhead to the Department within 4 weeks of award notification requesting information on the ranking and scoring of their

application to sdannunzio@pa.gov. Include the name of the applicant agency in the request.

- Applicants have 30 days from the time they are informed of their right to a hearing to request a hearing.
- The Department will conduct that hearing within 30 days of the request for a hearing.
- The Department will issue a final written ruling within 10 days from the date of the hearing, including findings and reasons for the final ruling.
- If the Department does not rescind its ruling the applicant may apply to the Secretary of the United States Department of Education within 20 days of the applicant receiving a written notification of the results of the hearing.

This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

For NPDES renewal applications in Section I, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a tentative determination to reissue these permits for 5 years subject to effluent limitations and monitoring and reporting requirements in their current permits, with appropriate and necessary updated requirements to reflect new and changed regulations and other requirements.

For applications for new NPDES permits and renewal applications with major changes in Section II, as well as applications for MS4 Individual Permits and Individual Stormwater Construction Permits in Sections IV and VI, the Department, based upon preliminary reviews, has made tentative determinations of proposed effluent limitations and other terms and conditions for the permit applications. In accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.32(d), the proposed discharge of stormwater associated with construction activities will be managed in accordance with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102. These determinations are published as proposed actions for comments prior to taking final actions.

Unless indicated otherwise, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region III Administrator has waived the right to review or object to proposed NPDES permit actions under the waiver provision in 40 CFR 123.24(d).

Persons wishing to comment on NPDES applications are invited to submit statements to the contact office noted before the application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for public hearings on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be

published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

### MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30 days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30 days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request, and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. When a public hearing is held, the Department will consider comments from the public hearing in the final determination on the NPDES permit application.

#### Water Quality Certification under Section 401 of the Federal Clean Water Act for the Use of Land Licensed to Exelon Generation Company, LLC for the Wildcat Point Generating Facility proposed by Old Dominion Electric Cooperative; DEP File No. EA36-038

On June 30, 2014, Exelon Generation Company, LLC, licensee for the Conowingo Hydroelectric Project ("Conowingo Project"), Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") Project No. 405, filed an application requesting FERC authorization to allow Old Dominion Electric Cooperative ("ODEC"), permittee, the use of Conowingo Project lands and waters for the withdrawal and discharge of water for ODEC's Wildcat Point Generation Facility ("Wildcat Point Project") in Cecil County, Maryland. ODEC is proposing to construct, operate, and maintain a water pump station and intake for cooling and process water and a wastewater discharge outfall on Conowingo Project lands in Fulton Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania and is proposing to discharge wastewater effluent consisting primarily of non-contact cooling water from the Wildcat Point Project's cooling tower. ODEC is also proposing to construct, operate, and maintain intake and outfall pipelines that extend from within the Conowingo Project lands through Lancaster County, Pennsylvania to the Wildcat Point Project in Maryland.

On April 28, 2015, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania ("Commonwealth") Department of Environmental Protection ("PADEP") received a request for Water Quality ("WQ") Certification under Section 401 of the Federal Clean Water Act from Exelon for the FERC approval of project lands for non-project purposes by ODEC for the Wildcat Point Project in Fulton Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. The DEP File No. for this WQ Certification request is EA36-038. Pennsylvania WQ Certification is required for the FERC approval of this project under the Federal Power Act for the portions of the Wildcat Point Project that occur within the FERC regulated Conowingo Project lands and waters in Pennsylvania. Code Chapter 93:

- 1. Discharge Permit—ODEC shall comply with the PADEP National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit No. PA0265951, including any future amendments, modifications, or revisions thereto, for the discharge of Industrial Wastewater (IW) from the operation of the Wildcat Point Project pursuant to Pennsylvania's Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and all applicable implementing regulations (25 Pa. Code Chapters 92a, 93 and 96).
- 2. Erosion and Sediment Control Permit—ODEC shall obtain and comply with a PADEP NPDES Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Construction Activity pursuant to Pennsylvania's Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and Storm Water Management Act (32 P. S. §§ 680.1—680.17) and all applicable implementing regulations (25 Pa. Code Chapter 102) for any earth disturbance activities that require said permit. ODEC submitted Individual NPDES Permit applications for PADEP review. The Individual NPDES permit numbers for the applications that are pending at PADEP for this project are PAI033614009 and PAI033614009(1).
- 3. Water Obstruction and Encroachment Permits—ODEC shall comply with all PADEP Chapter 105 Water Obstruction and Encroachment Permits obtained for the construction, operation and maintenance of all water obstructions and encroachments associated with the Wildcat Point Project pursuant to Pennsylvania's Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001), Dam Safety and Encroachments Act (32 P. S. §§ 693.1—693.28), and Flood Plain Management Act (32 P. S. §§ 679.101—679.601) and all applicable implementing regulations (25 Pa. Code Chapter 105). The PADEP Water Obstruction and Encroachment General Permits (GP) acknowledged for the Wildcat Point Project are numbered GP-11-36-14-135; GP-07-36-14-202; GP-05-36-14-203; and GP-04-36-14-202.
- 4. Submerged Lands License Agreement—ODEC shall obtain and comply with a Pennsylvania Submerged Lands License Agreement, pursuant to the Pennsylvania Dam Safety and Encroachments Act (32 P. S. §§ 693.1—693.28) and all applicable implementing regulations (25 Pa. Code Chapter 105).
- 5. Susquehanna River Basis Commission—ODEC shall implement and comply with the Consumptive Water Use Plan and Surface Water Withdrawal as approved and conditioned by the Susquehanna River Basin Commission on March 6, 2014, Docket No. 20140308, including any future amendments, modifications, or revisions to that approval.

- 6. Water Quality Monitoring—PADEP retains the right to specify additional studies or monitoring to ensure that the receiving water quality is not adversely impacted by any operational and construction process that may be employed by ODEC.
- 7. Operation—For the Wildcat Point Project under this certification, ODEC shall at all times properly operate and maintain all Wildcat Point Project facilities and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) which are installed to achieve compliance with the terms and conditions of this Certification and all required permits. Proper operation and maintenance includes adequate laboratory controls, appropriate quality assurance procedures, and the operation of backup or auxiliary facilities or similar systems installed by ODEC.
- 8. Inspection—The Wildcat Point Project, including all relevant records, are subject to inspection at reasonable hours and intervals by an authorized representative of PADEP to determine compliance with this Certification, including all required permits required, and Pennsylvania's Water Quality Standards. A copy of this Certification shall be available for inspection by the PADEP during such inspections of the Wildcat Point Project.
- 9. Transfer of Projects—If Exelon intends to transfer any legal or equitable interest in the Conowingo Project lands which is affected by this Certification, Exelon shall serve a copy of this Certification upon the prospective transferee of the legal and equitable interest at least thirty (30) days prior to the contemplated transfer and shall simultaneously inform the applicable PADEP Regional Office of such intent. Notice to PADEP shelinclude a transfer agreement signed by the existing and new owner containing a specific date for transfer of Certification responsibility, coverage, and liability between them.
- If ODEC intends to transfer any legal or equitable interest in the Wildcat Point Project which is affected by this Certification, ODEC shall serve a copy of this Certification upon the prospective transferee of the legal and equitable interest at least thirty (30) days prior to the contemplated transfer and shall simultaneously inform the applicable PADEP Regional Office of such intent. Notice to PADEP shall include a transfer agreement signed by the existing and new owner containing a specific date for transfer of Certification responsibility, coverage, and liability between them.
- 10. Correspondence—All correspondence with and submittals to PADEP concerning this Certification shall be addressed to the Department of Environmental Protection, South-central Regional Office, Waterways and Wetlands Program Manager, 909 Elmerton Avenue, Harrisburg, PA 17110-8200.
- 11. Reservation of Rights—PADEP may suspend or revoke this Certification if it determines that Exelon and ODEC have not complied with the terms and conditions of this Certification. PADEP may require additional measures to achieve compliance with applicable law, subject to Exelon and ODEC's applicable procedural and substantive rights.
- 12. Other Laws—Nothing in this Certification shall be construed to preclude the institution of any legal action or relieve Exelon and ODEC from any responsibilities, liabilities, or penalties established pursuant to any applicable federal or state law or regulation.
- 13. Severability—The provisions of this Certification are severable and should any provision of this Certifica-

tion be declared invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the Certification shall not be affected thereby.

Any person aggrieved by this action may appeal, pursuant to Section 4 of the Environmental Hearing Board Act, 35 P.S. § 7514, and the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa.C.S. Chapter 5A, to the Environmental Hearing Board, Second Floor, Rachel Carson State Office Building, 400 Market Street, PO Box 8457, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8457, 717.787.3483. TDD users may contact the Board through the Pennsylvania AT&T Relay Service, 800.654.5984. Appeals must be filed with the Environmental Hearing Board within 30 days of receipt of written notice of this action unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. Copies of the appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure may be obtained from the Board. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in braille or on audiotape from the Secretary to the Board at 717.787.3483. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create any right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law.

If you want to challenge this action, your appeal must reach the Board within 30 days. You do not need a lawyer to file an appeal with the Board.

# Approved Prearrest and Evidential Breath Testing Devices

The Department of Health (Department) has statutory authority to approve both prearrest and evidential breath testing devices for use by law enforcement officials to determine the alcohol content of blood by analysis of a person's breath. This notice contains the combined ap-

proved lists of prearrest breath testing devices and evidential breath testing devices.

Prearrest Breath Testing Devices

The Department approves prearrest breath testing devices as required by 28 Pa. Code §§ 5.101—5.104 (relating to equipment to determine blood alcohol content under the Vehicle Code and the Fish and Boat Code). Authority to promulgate these regulations is contained in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(k) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(k) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance), the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502(j) (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol) and section 2102(g) of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 532(g)).

Prearrest breath testing devices approved under this authority may be used by police officers, waterways patrolmen and officers enforcing the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code in conducting preliminary determinations of the alcohol content of blood of persons suspected of driving, boating, hunting or furtaking while under the influence of alcohol. Officers and patrolmen use these devices to assist them in determining whether or not a person should be placed under arrest for violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance), for violation of 30 Pa.C.S. § 5502 (relating to operating watercraft under influence of alcohol or controlled substance), for violation of 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 (relating to hunting or furtaking prohibited while under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or for any other criminal offense under the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code or the Game and Wildlife Code which involves operating a vehicle or boat, hunting or furtaking while under the influence of alcohol.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) of the United States Department of Transportation published model specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids at 59 FR 39382 (August 2, 1994). These specifications established performance criteria and methods for testing alcohol screening devices to measure alcohol content. The NHTSA established these specifications to support state laws and the United States Department of Transportation's workplace alcohol testing program. The Department has elected to use the NHTSA criteria for approving devices for the prearrest testing of a person's breath to determine the alcohol content of the person's blood.

The NHTSA published its first Conforming Products List (CPL) for screening devices at 59 FR 61923 (December 2, 1994), with corrections at 59 FR 65128 (December 16, 1994), identifying the devices that meet the NHTSA's Model Specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids. Thereafter, the NHTSA updated the CPL at 60 FR 42214 (August 15, 1995), 66 FR 22639 (May 4, 2001), 70 FR 54972 (September 19, 2005), with corrections at 70 FR 72502 (December 5, 2005) and 72 FR 4559 (January 31, 2007).

The NHTSA published revised Model Specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids at 73 FR 16956 (March 31, 2008). These specifications removed from use interpretive screening devices (ISD) because ISDs did not provide an unambiguous test result. These specifications also removed from use the Breath Alcohol Sample Simulator as it is not necessary for testing breath alcohol screening devices. All other perfor-

mance criteria and test methods were maintained. The NHTSA published an additional update to the CPL at 74 FR 66398 (December 15, 2009). The current list was published at 77 FR 35745 (June 14, 2012).

Evidential Breath Testing Devices

The Department approves evidential breath testing devices under the authority of the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(1)), the Fish and Boat Code (30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(c)(1)) and the Game and Wildlife Code (34 Pa.C.S. § 2502(c)).

Evidential breath testing devices approved under this notice may be used by law enforcement officials to obtain test results which will be admissible in evidence in any summary or criminal proceeding in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 or any other violation of the Vehicle Code arising out of the same action or 30 Pa.C.S. § 5502 or any other violation of the Fish and Boat Code arising out of the same action or 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 or any other violation of the Game and Wildlife Code arising out of the same action.

The NHTSA published the Standards for Devices to Measure Breath Alcohol at 38 FR 30459 (November 5, 1973). A Qualified Products List of Evidential Breath Measurement Devices comprised of instruments that met this standard was first issued at 39 FR 41399 (November 21, 1974).

The NHTSA converted the Standards for Devices to Measure Breath Alcohol to Model Specifications for Evidential Breath Testing Devices (Model Specifications) and published a CPL of instruments that were found to conform to the Model Specifications as Appendix D to that notice at 49 FR 48854 (December 14, 1984). Those instruments are identified in this notice with an asterisk.

The NHTSA published a notice to amend the Model Specifications at 58 FR 48705 (September 17, 1993) and to update the CPL. That notice changed the alcohol concentration levels at which instruments are evaluated for precision and accuracy, from 0.000, 0.050, 0.101 and 0.151 BAC, to 0.000, 0.020, 0.040, 0.080 and 0.160 BAC, respectively. It also included a test for the presence of acetone and an expanded definition of alcohol to include other low molecular weight alcohols, for example, methyl or isopropyl. Since that time, the CPL has been annotated to indicate which instruments have been determined to meet the Model Specifications, as revised and published in 1993. Thereafter, the NHTSA has periodically updated the CPL with those breath instruments found to conform to the Model Specifications.

The Department's list of evidential breath testing devices contains updates to the CPL published at 77 FR 35747 (June 14, 2012) for instruments that conform to the Model Specifications for Evidential Breath Alcohol Measurement Devices at 58 FR 48705 (September 17, 1993).

On September 25, 2014, the NHTSA indicated that is has approved the ALERT J4X, Alcohol Countermeasure Systems Corp. as a breath alcohol screening device. The Department received confirmation of this addition on October 15, 2014.

The NHTSA also evaluates equipment to determine if it must be operated at fixed locations (that is, nonmobile equipment) or can be transported to nonfixed operational sites in the field (that is, mobile equipment). Most equipment on the following list is approved for mobile

and nonmobile operation. The instruments on the list not marked with an asterisk meet the specifications for use as prearrest or evidentiary breath testing devices. The instruments on the list marked with an asterisk may be used as evidentiary devices for blood alcohol concentrations at or above 0.050%. These instruments may also be used as prearrest breath testing devices if they are approved for mobile operations. However, these instruments may not be used for making arrests under the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code or the Game and Wildlife Code when blood alcohol concentrations below 0.050% must be determined. Nonmobile devices can only be used as evidentiary testing instruments since they are not portable. Before purchasing breath testing devices, law enforcement officials should consult with the manufacturer of the equipment they intend to purchase to verify that the devices can be used for their intended purposes.

Law enforcement agencies should determine that an approved training program in the use of the equipment is available in accordance with the previously referenced statutes before purchasing any of the devices contained on this list. Law enforcement agencies that plan to utilize a device that does not appear on the following list should contact the manufacturer of the equipment to verify that it has been evaluated by the NHTSA and found to meet the NHTSA's performance requirements. If a device is approved by the NHTSA after the date of this publication, the manufacturer of the device will need to forward documentation of the NHTSA acceptability to Dr. James

R. Lute at the address given as follows so that the Department has information sufficient to enable it to include the device in the next revision of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Some of the devices included in this notice are listed under the name of more than one manufacturer due to the fact that the name of the manufacturer has changed or the right to produce a device has been transferred to a different company. In these instances, the device is listed under the name of every company that was ever associated with the device to allow law enforcement agencies to continue using devices bearing the name of a previous manufacturer.

To facilitate accessibility of information concerning breath alcohol testing devices which are approved for law enforcement purposes in this Commonwealth, the Department will publish revisions of this list of equipment semiannually as notices in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Laboratories Approved to Determine Analyses of Blood or Serum, or Both, for Controlled Substances under The Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151—2165) or section 353 of the Federal Clinical Laboratories Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a), or both, and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood or serum, or both, for the determination of controlled substances. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances or their biotransformation products in blood or serum, or both.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening or confirmatory analyses, or both, on blood or serum, or both. Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic blood or serum analysis services, or both, from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for medicolegal purposes. They should also determine that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing analyses for forensic purposes. Persons seeking blood or serum analyses, or both, are responsible for specifying the controlled substances for which testing is being sought. Persons seeking those analyses should first determine the purpose of the analyses, that is, whether they are for medical, legal or other purposes.

The Vehicle Code contains a provision in 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(3)(ii) that permits test results on blood or urine for alcohol or controlled substances to be introduced into evidence in legal proceedings in this Commonwealth if the laboratory is located in another state and is not licensed and approved by the Department to provide these services. This section states that the test results may be admissible into evidence at summary or criminal proceedings in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) if the laboratory that performed the test is licensed by the state in which the facility is located and licensed under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (Pub. L. No. 100-578, 102 Stat. 2903). A similar provision appears in the Fish and Boat Code in 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(c)(3)(ii).

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the

identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories before the name of the laboratory.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Questions regarding this list should be directed to Dr. James R. #### Laboratories Approved to Determine Blood Alcohol Content under The Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151-2165) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code §§ 5.50 and 5.103 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services; and blood tests for blood alcohol content) to perform alcohol analyses of blood, serum or plasma. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories. These laboratories are also approved and designated under the provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 (relating to hunting or furtaking prohibited while under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) as qualified to perform the types of specialized services which will reflect the presence of alcohol in blood, serum or plasma.

The Vehicle Code at 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(3)(ii) also permits test results on blood or urine for alcohol or controlled substances to be introduced into evidence in certain legal proceedings in this Commonwealth if the laboratory is located in another state and is not licensed and approved by the Department to provide forensic blood, serum or plasma analysis services. This section states that the test results will be admissible into evidence at summary or criminal proceedings in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or any other violation of the Vehicle Code arising out of the same action if the laboratory that performed the test is licensed to conduct the test by the state in which the facility is located and licensed under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (Pub. L. No. 100-578, 102 Stat. 2903). A similar provision appears in the Fish and Boat Code at 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(c)(3)(ii).

Since procedures for determining the alcohol content of serum and plasma are identical and results obtained from serum or plasma derived from a blood sample are the same, laboratories that demonstrate reliability in the determination of alcohol in serum are approved to analyze both serum and plasma for alcohol content.

Persons seeking forensic blood, serum or plasma analysis services from the following designated laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for forensic purposes and that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing determinations for this purpose.

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories before the name of the laboratory.

The Department's blood alcohol and serum and plasma alcohol proficiency testing programs are approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with the requirements in section 353 of the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a), and implementing regulations at 42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937 (relating to approval of proficiency testing programs; and toxicology), which are administered by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Participation in these programs may therefore be used to demonstrate acceptable performance for approval purposes under both Federal and Commonwealth statutes.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Questions regarding this list should be directed to Dr. James R. Laboratories Approved to Determine Controlled Substance Content of Urine under The Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151—2165) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of urine for the determination of controlled substances or their biotransformation prod-

This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances or their biotransformation products in urine.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening and/or confirmatory urine drug analyses. Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic urine drug analysis services from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose. They should also determine that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing analyses for that purpose. Persons seeking the analyses are responsible for specifying the extent to which the presence of a controlled substance is to be verified. That specification should be predicated upon the purpose for which the analysis is being sought.

The Vehicle Code contains a provision in 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(3)(ii) that permits test results on blood or urine

for alcohol or controlled substances to be introduced into evidence at legal proceedings in this Commonwealth if the laboratory is located in another state and is not licensed and approved by the Department to provide these services. This section states that the test results may be admissible into evidence at summary or criminal proceedings in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or any other violation of the Vehicle Code arising out of the same action if the laboratory that performed the test is licensed by the state in which the facility is located and licensed under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (Pub. L. No. 100-578, 102 Stat. 2903). A similar provision appears in the Fish and Boat Code in 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(c)(3)(ii).

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories before the name of the laboratory.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Questions regarding this list should be directed to Dr. James R. 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Laboratories Approved to Perform Blood Lead and/or Erythrocyte Protoporphyrin Determinations under The Clinical Laboratory Act

The following laboratories are licensed in accordance with The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P. S. §§ 2151—2165) and are currently approved under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood for lead or erythrocyte

protoporphyrin content. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic evaluations conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Department of Health (Department).

Lead poisoning is reportable. Approved laboratories that offer blood lead testing services are required to inform the Department of actual or possible incidents of this condition in accordance with 28 Pa. Code § 27.34 (relating to reporting cases of lead poisoning). These regulations specify the following requirements for reporting by clinical laboratories:

- (1) A clinical laboratory shall report all blood lead test results on both venous and capillary specimens for persons under 16 years of age to the Department's Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, Division of Maternal and Child Health, Bureau of Family Health.
- (2) A clinical laboratory shall report an elevated blood lead level in a person 16 years of age or older to the Department's Division of Environmental Health Epidemiology, Bureau of Epidemiology or to other locations as designated by the Department. An elevated blood lead level is defined by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH). As of January 26, 2002, NIOSH defines an elevated blood lead level as a venous blood lead level of 25 micrograms per deciliter (µg/dL) or higher. The Department will publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* any NIOSH update of the definition within 30 days of NIOSH's notification to the Department.
- (3) A clinical laboratory which conducts blood lead tests of 100 or more specimens per month shall submit results electronically in a format specified by the Department.
- (4) A clinical laboratory which conducts blood lead tests of less than 100 blood lead specimens per month shall submit results either electronically or by hard copy in the format specified by the Department.
- (5) A laboratory which performs blood lead tests on blood specimens collected in this Commonwealth shall be licensed as a clinical laboratory and shall be specifically approved by the Department to conduct those tests.
- (6) Blood lead analyses requested for occupational health purposes on blood specimens collected in this Commonwealth shall be performed only by laboratories which are licensed and approved as specified in paragraph (5), and which are also approved by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration of the United States Department of Labor under 29 CFR 1910.1025(j)(2)(iii) (relating to lead).
- (7) A clinical laboratory shall complete a blood lead test within 5 work days of the receipt of the blood specimen and shall submit the case report to the Department by the close of business of the next work day after the day on which the test was performed. The clinical laboratory shall submit a report of lead poisoning using either the hard copy form or electronic transmission format specified by the Department.
- (8) When a clinical laboratory receives a blood specimen without all of the information required for reporting purposes, the clinical laboratory shall test the specimen and shall submit the incomplete report to the Department.

Erythrocyte protoporphyrin determinations may be performed as an adjunct determination to substantiate blood lead levels of 25 micrograms per deciliter or higher. Since erythrocyte protoporphyrin concentrations may not increase as a result of low-level exposures to lead, direct blood lead analysis is the only reliable method for identifying individuals with blood lead concentrations below 25 micrograms per deciliter.

Persons seeking blood lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin analyses should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose for which the analyses are sought.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories before the name of the laboratory.

The Department's blood lead proficiency testing program is approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with 42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937 (relating to approval of proficiency testing programs; and toxicology) which are administered by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Participation in these programs may therefore be used to demonstrate acceptable performance for approval purposes under both Federal and Commonwealth statutes.

#### Minimum Levels of Controlled Substances or Their Metabolites in Blood to Establish Presence of Controlled Substance

Under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(4) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance), as amended by the act of September 30, 2003 (P. L. 120, No. 24), the Department of Health (Department) is publishing a notice of the minimum levels of Schedule I, nonprescribed Schedule II and nonprescribed Schedule III controlled substances or their metabolites that must be present in a person's blood for the test results to be admissible in a prosecution for a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 1543(b)(1.1), § 3802(d)(1), (2) or (3) or § 3808(a)(2) (relating to driving while operating privilege

is suspended or revoked; driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance; and illegally operating a motor vehicle not equipped with ignition interlock).

Testing for controlled substances in blood is normally a two-step process. The first step involves screening of the blood using a relatively rapid and inexpensive procedure to presumptively determine whether a specimen contains a controlled substance or a metabolite of a controlled substance. The second step utilizes an alternate procedure to confirm the presence of the controlled substance or metabolite that was presumptively detected by the screening procedure. Confirmatory analyses employed to substantiate the presence of a controlled substance or metabolite are also used to determine the concentration of the controlled substance or metabolite. A limit of quantitation (LOQ) for a controlled substance or metabolite is the lowest concentration that a laboratory can reliably determine. A laboratory's LOQ for each controlled substance or metabolite will depend upon the equipment and procedures the laboratory employs for confirmatory

Laboratories that operate in this Commonwealth and perform analyses of blood to determine controlled substance content must be approved by the Department in accordance with 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) and be listed in notices published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The minimum levels listed in this notice were developed by reviewing the LOQs reported by the laboratories approved by the Department to analyze blood for controlled substances or their metabolites. Laboratories are not required to have LOQs for controlled substances or their metabolites that are equal to or below minimum levels listed. The levels listed are intended to establish the lowest reportable results admissible in a prosecution.

The Department recognizes that testing may be conducted for controlled substances and metabolites not listed in this notice. When testing is necessary, interested parties should contact the laboratory performing the test to inquire as to that laboratory's specific method of testing, the equipment used and any policies or procedures employed by that laboratory to ensure that the test results are valid. In subsequent notices, the Department will revise, as needed, the minimum levels of controlled substances or metabolites already included in this notice and add new controlled substances or metabolites when warranted.
