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

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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency

wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is available at www.pabulletin.com.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised. A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Whereas, it will benefit the commonwealth to define and address the unique contributions, needs and concerns of women and girls to improve the lives of all Pennsylvanians.

Now, Therefore, I, Tom Wolf, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other laws, do hereby reestablish the Pennsylvania Commission for Women as the commonwealth's advocate agency for women as herein set forth.

TITLE 4. ADMINISTRATION PART I. GOVERNOR'S OFFICE

CHAPTER 6. ADDITIONAL COUNCILS AND COMMITTEES Subchapter YY. (Reserved)

§§ 6.601—6.609. (Reserved).

Subchapter BBB. PENNSYLVANIA COMMISSION FOR WOMEN § 6.631. Functions.

The Pennsylvania Commission for Women shall:

- (1) Work with the Administration on policies, procedures, legislation and regulations that affect women.
 - (2) Support economic and civic opportunities for women.
 - (3) Support mentoring programs for girls and young women.
- (4) Serve as a resource for women and community groups by identifying and supporting strategies and programs that will expand and enhance the civic, social, educational, cultural and economic status of women, and providing constituent guidance as necessary.
- (5) Identify, and help build, programs and opportunities for the benefit and advancement of women.

§ 6.632. Composition.

- (a) The Pennsylvania Commission for Women (Commission) shall consist of no more than 30 volunteer members appointed by the Governor who represent a diverse population within this Commonwealth. The Governor will invite a member of each of the four legislative caucuses in the General Assembly to serve on the Commission.
- (b) Appointees shall have an interest in improving the status of women in this Commonwealth, commit to volunteer their time to and further the mission and work of the Commission, and support the Governor's legislative efforts as it positively impacts the women and girls of this Commonwealth.
- (c) The Governor will designate one member of the Commission to serve as chairperson. The Governor may designate one or more Commission members to serve in leadership positions as needed. Commission leadership shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.
- (d) The Governor will appoint a member of his staff to serve as Executive Director of the Commission, who shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

§ 6.633. Terms of membership.

- (a) Members will be appointed for terms of 2 years and serve until their respective successors are appointed. A member may be reappointed for one or more additional terms. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and adhere to a policy setting forth Commissioner responsibilities and expectations as may be promulgated by the Executive Director and the Pennsylvania Commission for Women (Commission chairperson).
- (b) If a vacancy occurs on the Commission, the Governor will appoint a successor. The successor shall fulfill the remainder of the term. The successor may thereafter be reappointed for one or more additional terms.
- (c) A member who is absent from two consecutive meetings of the Commission, without sufficient excuse, shall forfeit membership on the Commission.

§ 6.634. Compensation.

Members of the Pennsylvania Commission for Women will not receive compensation for their service except that members may, upon request, be reimbursed for travel in accordance with Commonwealth policy. See Chapter 40 (relating to travel and subsistence).

§ 6.635. Relationship with other agencies.

Agencies under the Governor's jurisdiction shall cooperate with and provide assistance and support as needed by the Pennsylvania Commission for Women (Commission) to carry out its functions effectively. Independent agencies, State-affiliated entities and State-related institutions are also strongly encouraged to work with the Commission to support its mission.

§ 6.636. Procedures.

- (a) The Pennsylvania Commission for Women (Commission) is authorized to establish subcommittees, rules and procedures for the effective implementation of its functions, consistent with this subchapter. Subcommittees may include advisory nonmembers if approved by the Commission's chairperson and Executive Director.
- (b) A majority of the Commissioners serving at any time constitutes a quorum.

§ 6.637. Effective date.

This subchapter takes effect immediately and remains in effect unless revised or rescinded by the Governor.

§ 6.638. Rescission.

Executive Order 2015-09 is rescinded.

[EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2017-03]

Review of State Professional and Occupational Licensure Board Requirements and Processes

October 24, 2017

Whereas, according to the White House report on occupational licensing, 20.2 percent of Pennsylvania workers have an occupational license. The share of workers licensed at the State level has grown rapidly since the 1950s with more than one-quarter of U.S. workers now requiring a license to work in their respective jobs; and

Whereas, the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) within the Pennsylvania Department of State provides administrative and legal support to 29 professional and occupational licensing Boards and Commissions; and

Whereas, the Commissioner of BPOA is responsible for carrying out the duties set forth in the Administrative Code, including providing administrative support and services to the occupational licensing Boards and Commissions; and

Whereas, regulatory Boards and Commissions and occupational licensure serve to protect the public from harm and benefit workers; and

Whereas, onerous licensing requirements, excessive fees, and strict criminal history and other policies can create unnecessary barriers for Pennsylvanians who want to enter the job market.

Now, Therefore, I, Tom Wolf, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other laws, do hereby order and direct the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs within the Department of State as follows:

- 1. The Commissioner shall work with each Board and Commission stated in this Executive Order to undertake a critical and comprehensive review of the processes, fees, training, and continuing education requirements for occupational and professional licensure. The Commissioner shall prepare a report for each type of professional and occupational license issued by each Board or Commission. At a minimum for each type of professional license, this report shall include training requirements; licensing, registration, and renewal fees; continuing education requirements; and any other requirements described within this Executive Order. The report shall also include information regarding the number of other states which require a license for each professional or occupational license, the national and regional averages for training requirements, fees, and continuing education requirements.
- 2. The Commissioner may establish an advisory group to assist with the research, data collection, and formatting of the reports, and any other function the Commissioner deems necessary. The advisory group shall be composed of members chosen by the Commissioner from the professional Boards and Commissions, BPOA staff, and any other persons the Commissioner deems necessary. The Commissioner shall have 30 days from the effective date of this Executive Order to establish the advisory group.
- 3. For the purposes of this Executive Order, "regional" shall mean the Northeast quadrant of the United States, including Ohio, West Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey, New York, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New Hampshire, Vermont, and Maine.
- 4. For each of the requirements and fees identified in paragraph (1), if the requirement or fee in Pennsylvania is above the national or regional average for that license, the report shall include justification for the requirement with respect to protecting the public health and safety of the

- residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. For each of the requirements and fees identified in paragraph (1), the report shall indicate whether the requirement or fee is mandated by statute, regulation, or policy.
- 5. For each occupational or professional license, the report shall identify which other states also provide the same or an equivalent license.
- 6. The report shall also include any automatic criminal history bans on licensure, specifying which crimes or convictions trigger an automatic ban and if a ban lasts for a specific period. If the criminal history ban is not applied in a majority of other regional states with the same or an equivalent license, the report shall provide justification with respect to protecting the public health and safety of the residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The report shall indicate whether the criminal history ban is mandated by statute, regulation, or policy.
- 7. The report shall include any Interstate Compacts or Reciprocity Agreements that exist and identify to which states they are applicable. For the purposes of this Executive Order, an Interstate Compact or Reciprocity Agreement is any agreement that allows a license or credential issued by another state to satisfy Board or Commission licensure requirements in Pennsylvania.
- 8. The report shall include the following information for each Board and Commission:
- a. The number of disciplinary actions imposed on licensees each year for the last five years, including fines, penalties, license suspensions, and other disciplinary actions, and the ten most frequent violations resulting in a fine;
- b. Any disciplinary actions taken against persons practicing without a license or practicing with an expired or suspended license, and;
 - c. The average timeframe for approval for each type of license.
- 9. The report shall contain demographic information, including but not limited to, race, ethnicity, gender, and regional statistics of its licensee population and professional community.
- 10. The Commissioner shall submit the report including the information required in this Executive Order to the Governor, the Secretary of Policy and Planning, and the Secretary of the Commonwealth no later than 180 days from the establishment of the advisory group in paragraph (2) or 210 days from the effective date of this Executive Order, whichever is sooner.
- 11. For the purposes of this Executive Order, the term "Board" includes without limitation, the State Board of Accountancy, the State Architects Licensure Board, the State Board of Auctioneer Examiners, the State Board of Barber Examiners, the State Board of Certified Real Estate Appraisers, the State Board of Chiropractic, the State Board of Cosmetology, the State Board of Crane Operators, the State Board of Dentistry, the State Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, and Geologists, the State Board of Funeral Directors, the State Board of Landscape Architects, the State Board of Massage Therapy, the State Board of Medicine, the State Board of Nursing, the State Board of Nursing Home Administrators, the State Board of Occupational Therapy, the State Board of Optometry, the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, the State Board of Pharmacy, the State Board of Physical Therapy, the State Board of Podiatry, the State Board of Psychology, the State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists, and Professional Counselors, the State Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, the State Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers, and Salespersons, the Navigation Commission, and the Real Estate Commission.
 - 12. Effective Date. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.

13. *Expiration Date*. This Executive Order shall expire after the final report is delivered to the Governor, the Secretary of Policy and Planning, and the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

LOCAL RULE OF JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION

Rule 6001. Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts.

Rule 6001.7. Confidential Information.

Case Records and Pleadings containing confidential information shall be filed in the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas as follows:

All documents filed with the Court which contain Confidential Information as defined in Section 7.0 of the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts shall be filed in duplicate with an unredacted original and a copy with all Confidential Information redacted.

The unredacted original must be filed with a Fifth Judicial District Unredacted Original Cover Sheet, available at the Department of Court Records, or if e-filing, by marking the document as an unredacted original document.

Redacted Copies need not be used in matters in which the documents filed by the parties are otherwise completely confidential by law or rule and unavailable for public access including, but not limited to:

- Act 53 Proceedings
- Adoptions
- Dependency Proceedings
- Juvenile Delinquency Proceedings that are completely confidential pursuant to applicable rules and statute

- Pennsylvania Judicial Bypass Proceedings
- Support Proceedings
- \bullet Incapacity proceedings filed pursuant to 20 Pa.C.S. §§ $5501{-}5555$
 - Proceedings under 20 Pa.C.S. § 711(9)
- Confidential proceedings under the Mental Health Procedures Act, 50 P.S. § 7101 et. sec.
- Matters under seal in the Civil Division that are unavailable for public access
- Documents filed under seal in the Civil Division that are unavailable for public access

Rule 6001.10. Limits on Remote Access to Case Records.

In accordance with the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of the Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts, online access to the docket and case records shall be restricted as follows:

- a. The public's online access to records shall be limited as set forth in section 10.0 of the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of the Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts.
- b. Attorneys listed as counsel of record who have entered their appearance on a Civil Division, Family Division or Orphans' Court case and who have a verified login to the Department of Court Records online access portal shall have the same access to that case online as they would if they had appeared in person at the Court Facility where the records are kept, except for access to:
 - 1. Sealed Records or Documents
 - 2. Qualified Domestic Relations Orders;
 - 3. Transcripts;
 - 4. Adoption Proceedings
- 5. Proceedings under the Mental Health Procedures Act, 50 P.S. § 7101 et. sec.
 - 6. Proceedings under 20 Pa.C.S. § 711(9)
 - 7. Inheritance Tax Returns
 - 8. Inventories and Accounts in Orphans' Court Matters
 - 9. Addresses of Victims of Abuse;
- 10. Confidential Documents as defined in Section 8.0 of the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of the Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts except the documents listed in subsections 8.0(A)(5), (6) and (7);
- 11. Any Other Proceedings or Documents Specified by the President Judge or an Administrative Judge of a Division
- c. Attorneys acting in a pro bono capacity on a Family Division case may enter a limited appearance. Attorneys who have entered a limited appearance and who have a verified login to the Department of Court Records online access portal shall have the same access to that case online as an Attorney of Record in subparagraph (b) above.
- d. Parties to a Family Division, Civil Division, or Orphans' Court case who have filed a Praecipe of Appear-

ance for Online Access on a case and who have a verified login to the Department of Court Records online access portal shall have the same access to that case online as an Attorney of Record in subparagraph (b) above.

e. A Guardian Ad Litem in a Family Division, Civil Division, or Orphans' Court Case who has been appointed by court order filed with the Department of Court Records and who has filed a Praecipe of Appearance for Online Access on a case with the Department of Court Records and who has a verified login to the Department of Court Records online access portal shall have the same access to that case in person and online and as an Attorney of Record in subparagraph (b) above. The Guardian Ad Litem shall file a Withdrawal of Appearance upon completion of their involvement in the case which will terminate their access to the case.

LOCAL RULE OF JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION

Rule 100.

In accordance with Section 7.0 Confidential Information of the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts, certain information described in Section 7.0(A) shall not be included in any document filed with the court or custodian. Parties or attorneys shall file a Confidential Information Form contemporaneously with such document. L.R.CIV.P. 1920.51. Administrative Fee for Appointment of Master in Divorce.

- 1. Simultaneously with the filing of a Motion for Appointment of a Master in Divorce, an administrative fee of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars shall be paid to the Office of Judicial Services and Records (Prothonotary) by the moving party. Within twenty (20) days of service of the Motion for Appointment of a Master in Divorce, the responding party shall pay an administrative fee of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars to the Office of Judicial Services and Records (Prothonotary).
- 2. The Master in Divorce may allocate the administrative fees charged herein as part of the recommendations of the Master's Report between the parties as may be fair and equitable by giving credit/deduction to the fees as part of the equitable distribution of marital property.
- 3. In the event a party fails to pay the required fee, that party shall be subject to the contempt powers of the Court and the payment of any additional expenses and costs, including attorney fees of the opposing party necessary for the enforcement of this requirement within the discretion of the Court.
- 4. In the event one party pays both administrative fees, he or she shall be awarded a Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollar credit as part of the final equitable distribution of marital property.
- 5. In the event that a party is indigent, and unable to pay the administrative fee, he or she may petition the Court for in forma pauperis (IFP) status to waive the fee

pursuant to Pa.R.C.P. 240. If the party is represented by an attorney, that attorney shall file a certification that he or she is providing free legal services to that party as part of the IFP petition. If one party is indigent, the Court may allocate both fees to the non-indigent party. If both parties are indigent, neither party shall be responsible for the fee.

- 6. No other administrative fees shall be charged due to the appointment of a Master in Divorce.
- 7. Luzerne County Local Rule of Civil Procedure 1920.51 shall be effective thirty (30) days after the date of publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Title 28—HEALTH AND SAFETY

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH [28 PA. CODE CH. 1191]

Medical Marijuana; Patients and Caregivers; Temporary Regulations

The Department of Health (Department) is publishing temporary regulations in Chapter 1191 (relating to patients and caregivers) to read as set forth in Annex A. The temporary regulations are published under the Medical Marijuana Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 10231.101—10231.2110). Section 1107 of the act (35 P.S. § 10231.1107) specifically provides that, to facilitate the prompt implementation of the act, the Department may promulgate temporary regulations that are not subject to sections 201—205 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240) (45 P.S. §§ 1201—1205), known as the Commonwealth Documents Law, the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. §§ 745.1—745.14) and sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the Commonwealth Attorneys Act (71 P.S. §§ 732-204(b) and 732-301(10)).

To implement the Medical Marijuana Program, the Department will be periodically publishing temporary regulations regarding various sections of the act. The temporary regulations for patients and caregivers will expire on November 12, 2019.

Chapter 1191 pertains to patients and caregivers who wish to participate in the Medical Marijuana Program, including requirements for identification cards, application fees, background checks for caregivers, and the patient and caregiver registry. The next set of temporary regulations that the Department anticipates publishing relate to academic clinical research centers.

Annex A

TITLE 28. HEALTH AND SAFETY

PART IX. MEDICAL MARIJUANA

CHAPTER 1191. PATIENTS AND CAREGIVERS

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§ 1191.21. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Adult patient—A patient who is 18 years of age or older.

Applicant—

- (i) A patient or a caregiver who submits an identification card application to the Department.
- (ii) The term includes a legal guardian or a parent who submits an application on behalf of a patient.
- (iii) The term does not include an individual under 21 years of age unless the Department has determined under section 507(a) of the act (35 P.S. § 10231.507(a)) that the individual should be permitted to serve as a caregiver.

Caregiver—One of the following:

- (i) An individual designated by a patient to obtain on behalf of a patient, and provide to a patient, a medical marijuana product.
- (ii) For a minor patient, an individual who meets the requirements of section 506(2) of the act $(35 \text{ P.S.} \S 10231.506(2))$.

Legal guardian—

- (i) An individual appointed as a guardian of a patient under the laws of the Commonwealth.
- (ii) The term does not include an individual who has been appointed a guardian only of a patient's property.

Medical marijuana cardholder—An adult patient or caregiver who possess a valid identification card.

Medical marijuana patient authorization letter—A document issued by the Department under § 1191.32 (relating to medical marijuana patient authorization letters).

Minor patient—A patient who is under 18 years of age.

Parent—The biological, natural or adoptive mother or father of a patient.

Patient and caregiver registry—A list of patients and caregivers established and maintained by the Department.

Patient certification—The document issued by a practitioner under § 1181.27 (relating to issuing patient certifications) certifying that a patient has one or more serious medical conditions.

Pennsylvania Justice Network—An integrated justice portal that provides a common online environment for authorized users to access public safety and criminal justice information.

§ 1191.22. Patient and caregiver registry.

- (a) The Department will maintain a patient and caregiver registry.
- (b) Patient and caregiver information maintained by the Department is confidential and not subject to public disclosure, including disclosure under the Right-to-Know Law (65 P.S. §§ 67.101—67.3104), including all of the following:
- (1) Information provided in an identification card application
- (2) Information in a patient certification issued by a practitioner.
- (3) Criminal history record check information provided as part of an identification card application submitted by a caregiver under § 1191.27 (relating to criminal background checks).
- (4) Information encoded in the 2D barcode of an identification card.
- (5) Information relating to a patient's serious medical condition.
- (c) A caregiver who is listed in the patient and caregiver registry may waive in writing the caregiver's right to confidentiality and consent to the caregiver's name and contact information being provided to a patient who has obtained a patient certification from a practitioner.

§ 1191.23. Patients and caregivers generally.

- (a) The qualifications that a patient or caregiver shall meet to be included in the patient and caregiver registry and to obtain an identification card or a medical marijuana patient authorization letter are continuing qualifications.
- (b) Except with respect to a minor patient as provided in § 1191.32 (relating to medical marijuana patient authorization letters), the Department may issue an identification card to an applicant who meets the qualifications in the act and this part.
- (c) The Department may issue an identification card to an individual who is under 21 years of age to serve as a caregiver when a sufficient showing, as determined by the Department, is made to the Department that the individual should be permitted to serve as a caregiver.
- (d) A minor patient shall have a caregiver who is one of the following:
 - (1) A parent or legal guardian.
- (2) An individual designated by a parent or legal guardian.
- (3) An appropriate individual approved by the Department upon a sufficient showing that a parent or legal guardian is not appropriate or available.

§ 1191.24. Medical marijuana cardholder responsibilities.

- (a) A medical marijuana cardholder shall immediately contact the Department upon the occurrence of any of the following:
- (1) A change of the medical marijuana cardholder's name or address.
- (2) The withdraw of a patient certification by a practitioner under § 1181.29 (relating to revocation of a patient certification).
- (3) A decision by a patient or the patient's legal guardian to discontinue the services of a caregiver.
- (4) A decision by a caregiver to no longer serve as a caregiver for a patient.
- (5) A decision by a patient, the patient's legal guardian or a parent on behalf of a patient to discontinue obtaining medical treatment from the practitioner who issued the patient certification to the patient.
- (b) A medical marijuana cardholder shall return the identification card to the Department within 10 business days following receipt of written notice from the Department of the occurrence of any of the following:
- (1) The removal of the medical marijuana cardholder from the patient and caregiver registry under § 1191.30 (relating to revocation or suspension of identification card; removal or suspension from the patient and caregiver registry).
- (2) The Department has received notification from the practitioner who issued the patient certification to the patient of the occurrence of any of the circumstances described in § 1181.29(b).

§ 1191.25. Application for, and issuance of, identification cards.

- (a) An applicant shall submit an identification card application on a form prescribed by the Department. The application will be made available on the Department's publicly-accessible web site and in hard copy upon request.
- (b) An identification card application submitted by or on behalf of a patient must include, at a minimum, all of the following:
- (1) The name, address, telephone number, e-mail address, if available, and date of birth of the patient.
- (2) The patient's Pennsylvania driver's license number, a Department of Transportation State-issued identification card, if applicable, or other documentation acceptable to the Department evidencing the patient's identification and residency in this Commonwealth.
- (3) The name, address and telephone number of the practitioner who issued the patient certification.
- (4) The name, birth date, address, telephone number and e-mail address, if applicable, of up to two individuals designated by the applicant to serve as caregivers, if applicable.
- (5) The patient certification issued by the patient's practitioner, which will be provided by the practitioner to the Department under § 1181.27(c)(2) (relating to issuing patient certifications).
- (6) The appropriate fee or proof of financial hardship as provided for in § 1191.26 (relating to application fees).
 - (7) The signature of the applicant and the date signed.

- (8) A statement that a false statement made in the application is punishable under the applicable provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. Chapter 49 (relating to falsification and intimidation).
- (9) Any other information deemed necessary by the Department.
- (c) For an application submitted under this section that designates an individual as a caregiver who is not authorized under the act or this part to serve as a caregiver, all of the following apply:
- (1) The Department may deny that portion of the application and approve the balance of the application. In that case, an identification card may be issued to the patient but the designated caregiver will not be authorized to serve in that capacity.
- (2) If the application is submitted on behalf of a minor patient but does not include the designation of another individual as a caregiver who is authorized under the act or this part to serve as a caregiver, the Department will deny the entire application unless and until the applicant designates an individual who is authorized to serve.
- (3) An individual designated as a caregiver is not authorized to serve as a caregiver unless and until the individual submits an application under subsection (d) and is issued an identification card by the Department.
- (d) An identification card application submitted by a caregiver must include, at a minimum, all of the following:
- (1) The name, address, telephone number, e-mail address, if available, and date of birth of the caregiver.
- (2) The caregiver's Pennsylvania driver's license number, a Department of Transportation State-issued identification card, if applicable, or other documentation acceptable to the Department evidencing the caregiver's identification.
- (3) The name, address and telephone number of the practitioner who issued the patient certification.
- (4) The patient certification issued by the patient's practitioner, which will be provided by the practitioner to the Department under § 1181.27(c)(2).
- (5) A copy of the criminal history record information required under § 1191.27 (relating to criminal background checks).
- (6) The name, address, telephone number and e-mail address, if available, of up to five patients for which the caregiver wishes to be approved by the Department as a caregiver.
- (7) The appropriate fee or proof of financial hardship as provided for in § 1191.26.
 - (8) The signature of the applicant and the date signed.
- (9) A statement that a false statement made in the application is punishable under the applicable provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. Chapter 49.
- (10) Any other information deemed necessary by the Department.
- (e) The Department will review the criminal history record information obtained by a caregiver under § 1191.27 and the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program database before approving the issuance of an identification card to the caregiver. The Department will deny the issuance of an identification card to a caregiver if the caregiver has been convicted of a criminal offense relating to the sale or possession of drugs, narcotics or controlled

- substances that occurred within the 5 years immediately preceding the submission of the application. The Department may deny the issuance of an identification card to a caregiver if the caregiver has a history of drug abuse or of diverting controlled substances or illegal drugs.
- (f) The Department will promptly notify an applicant in writing if an identification card application is incomplete or factually inaccurate, and provide the applicant with an explanation as to what documents or information are necessary for the Department to consider the identification card application to be complete and accurate.
- (g) An applicant shall have 60 days from receipt of a notification under subsection (f) to submit to the Department the documents or information requested. If an applicant fails to submit the requested documents or information within 60 days, the Department may deny the identification card application.
- (h) The Department will notify an applicant in writing of the reasons for the denial of an identification card application.
- (i) An applicant whose identification card application is denied may submit a new identification card application. The Department may decline to consider a new application that does not correct the deficiencies in the initial application leading to a prior denial.

§ 1191.26. Application fees.

- (a) An applicant shall submit a fee of \$50 with an identification card application or identification card renewal application.
- (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), an applicant shall submit a fee of \$25 under the following circumstances:
- (1) The Department issues a replacement identification card as a result of a lost, stolen, destroyed, defaced or illegible identification card.
- (2) The patient's practitioner has been removed from the practitioner registry under § 1181.26 (relating to removal of a practitioner from the practitioner registry) and the patient applies for a new identification card.
- (c) The Department may establish higher fees for issuance of a second and subsequent replacement identification cards. Each January, the Department will post on its publicly-accessible web site the fees for issuance of a second and subsequent replacement identification cards, and will publish notice of those fees in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
- (d) Subject to § 1191.32 (relating to medical marijuana patient authorization letters), the Department may waive or reduce the fee for an identification card application or identification card renewal application for an applicant who demonstrates financial hardship. Each January, the Department will post on its publicly-accessible web site the qualifications for financial hardship that an applicant requesting a waiver or reduction of the application fee shall submit with an identification card application or identification card renewal application. The Department will publish notice of the qualifications for financial hardship in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

§ 1191.27. Criminal background checks.

(a) An individual applying for an identification card to serve as a caregiver shall submit fingerprints to the Pennsylvania State Police or its authorized agent for the purpose of obtaining a criminal history record check. The Pennsylvania State Police or its authorized agent will submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investi-

gation for the purpose of verifying the identity of the caregiver and obtaining a current record of any criminal arrests and convictions.

(b) The Department may only review the criminal history record information received under subsection (a) to determine the caregiver's character, fitness and suitability to serve as a caregiver under the act and this part.

§ 1191.28. Identification cards.

- (a) The Department will issue an identification card to a patient or caregiver as soon as reasonably practicable after approving an identification card application.
- (b) An identification card will contain all of the following information:
 - (1) The full name of the medical marijuana cardholder.
 - (2) The address of the medical marijuana cardholder.
- (3) A designation of the medical marijuana cardholder as a patient or a caregiver.
- (4) The date of issuance and the date of expiration of the identification card.
- (5) A unique identification number for the medical marijuana cardholder.
- (6) A photograph of the medical marijuana cardholder unless the patient or caregiver provides the Department with a statement in accordance with subsection (c).
- (7) Any requirement or limitation on the patient certification concerning the recommended form of medical marijuana or limitation on the duration of use, if applicable.
- (8) Any other information deemed necessary by the Department.
- (c) Notwithstanding subsection (b)(6), the Department may not require a photograph on an identification card if a statement is provided to the Department in an identification card application that a photograph cannot be provided due to religious beliefs.
- (d) An identification card issued to a patient will expire on the earlier to occur of the following:
 - (1) The date occurring 1 year from the date of issuance.
- (2) The date, if any, contained in the patient certification issued to the patient beyond which the practitioner does not believe the use of medical marijuana by the patient would be therapeutic or palliative.
 - (3) The date the patient dies.
- (e) An identification card issued to a caregiver will expire on the earlier to occur of the following:
- (1) The date that occurs 1 year from the date of issuance.
- (2) Any of the events listed under subsection (d)(2) or (3).
 - (3) The date the caregiver dies.
- (f) A medical marijuana cardholder shall apply to the Department for a replacement identification card within 10 business days of discovering the loss or defacement of the identification card.

§ 1191.29. Renewing an identification card.

(a) A medical marijuana cardholder shall submit an identification card renewal application to the Department no later than 30 days prior to the expiration date on the card. The form of the renewal application will be prescribed by the Department and will be made available on the Department's publicly-accessible web site and in hard

- copy upon request. A medical marijuana cardholder shall include with the identification card renewal application a new or updated patient certification issued by the patient's practitioner, which will be provided by the practitioner to the Department under § 1181.27(c)(2) (relating to issuing patient certifications).
- (b) If the Department denies an identification card renewal application or if the Department does not receive a complete identification card renewal application by the expiration date on the identification card, the identification card will no longer be valid beyond the expiration date and the Department may remove a medical marijuana cardholder from the patient and caregiver registry.

§ 1191.30. Revocation or suspension of identification card; removal or suspension from the patient and caregiver registry.

- (a) The Department may revoke or suspend a medical marijuana cardholder's identification card and remove the patient or caregiver from the patient and caregiver registry upon the occurrence of any of the following:
- (1) The Department receives written notice from a practitioner under § 1181.29(a) (relating to revocation of a patient certification).
- (2) A caregiver notifies the Department in writing that the caregiver is no longer acting as a caregiver.
- (3) Information obtained from the Pennsylvania Justice Network indicates that a caregiver has been convicted of a criminal offense relating to the sale or possession of drugs, narcotics or controlled substances after being issued an identification card.
- (4) The patient or caregiver has intentionally, knowingly or recklessly violated the act or regulations as determined by the Department. The suspension or revocation will be in addition to any criminal or other penalty that may apply.
- (5) Except for good cause shown, a medical marijuana cardholder does not visit a dispensary within 60 days from the issuance date on an identification card.
- (6) A patient notifies the Department in writing that the patient has removed or changed a current caregiver. If the caregiver is not serving as a caregiver for any other patient, the Department will issue a notification to the caregiver that the caregiver's identification card is invalid and shall be promptly returned to the Department.
- (b) The Department will promptly notify a medical marijuana cardholder in writing of any action taken by the Department regarding the medical marijuana cardholder as a result of information received under subsection (a).
- (c) If a patient's practitioner has been removed from the practitioner registry under § 1181.26 (relating to removal of a practitioner from the practitioner registry) or if a patient's practitioner withdraws the patient's patient certification under § 1181.29(c), a medical marijuana cardholder shall submit a new application for an identification card within 90 days of receiving written notice from the Department or prior to the expiration date on the identification card, whichever is sooner.

§ 1191.31. Obtaining medical marijuana from a dispensary.

- (a) A medical marijuana cardholder may only obtain medical marijuana product from a dispensary.
- (b) A medical marijuana cardholder may only obtain medical marijuana product from a dispensary based upon

the recommendation in a patient certification that has not been revoked under § 1181.29 (relating to revocation of a patient certification) and that may be accessed by a dispensary through the electronic tracking system.

- (c) A medical marijuana cardholder may not obtain or possess any of the following:
- (1) A different form or greater quantity of medical marijuana product, if any, from that indicated on the patient certification.
- (2) Subject to paragraph (1) and subsection (d), a greater quantity of medical marijuana product than a 30-day supply.
- (3) Medical marijuana product that has otherwise been dispensed by a dispensary in violation of § 1161.24 (relating to limitations on dispensing).
- (d) Notwithstanding subsection (c)(2), during the last 7 days of any 30-day period, a patient may obtain and possess a 30-day supply for the subsequent 30-day period.

§ 1191.32. Medical marijuana patient authorization letters.

(a) The Department will issue a medical marijuana patient authorization letter to a minor patient instead of issuing an identification card to the minor. Upon reaching majority, a minor patient who has been issued a medical marijuana patient authorization letter will be entitled to

- receive an identification card upon application under § 1191.25 (relating to application for, and issuance of, identification cards).
- (b) The Department may issue a medical marijuana patient authorization letter to an adult patient.
- (c) A patient who has been issued a medical marijuana patient authorization letter by the Department under this section shall have all of the rights and obligations of a medical marijuana cardholder under this chapter, except that an identification card shall be required for entry into a dispensary.
- (d) A medical marijuana patient authorization letter is subject to the same terms and conditions, including expiration, revocation and suspension requirements, as an identification card under this chapter.
- (e) A patient who has been issued a medical marijuana patient authorization letter by the Department under this section will not be required to pay an identification card application fee or an identification card renewal application fee.

§ 1191.33. Appeals.

Chapter 5 of 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to practice and procedure) applies to all actions of the Department under this chapter constituting an adjudication as defined in 2 Pa.C.S. § 101 (relating to definitions).

Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for public hearings on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. A person intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard or intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area shall file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30 days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30 days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request, and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. Code § 54.40(d) states that the maintenance of an EGS license is contingent on the licensee providing proof to the Commission that a bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120 prior to the EGS's current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferable in blue ink, and displays a "raised seal" or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS's license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security's expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company's electric supplier license, removal of each

company's information from the Commission's website and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license. As of October 17, 2017, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission, to replace its expired bond.

As part of its EGS license validation procedures, the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services sent a 90-day Security Renewal Notice Letter to each entity in the Supplier Table above stating that original documentation of a bond, or other approved security, must be filed within 30 days prior to each entity's security expiration date.
