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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Amendment to Proclamation

November 9, 1999

Whereas, On July 20, 1999, I declared a State of Drought Emergency in fifty-five counties of the Commonwealth due to a long and continuing period of unusually dry weather, abnormally low stream flows, and reduced groundwater which resulted in widespread shortage of water supplies throughout the Commonwealth; and

Whereas, on August 9, 1999, due to the severe impact of the drought on the Commonwealth's agricultural community, I requested that the United States Department of Agriculture declare all sixty-seven counties of the Commonwealth to be in a state of disaster emergency; and

Whereas, on August 13, 1999, the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture declared all sixty-seven counties of the Commonwealth as a primary natural disaster area; and

Whereas, on September 10, 1999, I amended my July 20, 1999 proclamation to include all sixty-seven counties of the Commonwealth making it consistent with the geographical area covered by the United States Department of Agriculture's declaration of an agricultural disaster area; and

Whereas, on September 10, 1999, I transferred up to \$5,000,000 in unused appropriated funds to the Department of Agriculture to be expended by the Department in a manner approved by me to relieve the drought emergency conditions affecting the Commonwealth's farming and agricultural community; and

Whereas, on September 30, 1999, I amended my proclamation to lift the drought emergency proclamation for all counties with the exception of Somerset County, which had a continuing need to implement mandatory water conservation measures, and the agricultural drought emergency that affected all sixty-seven counties; and

Whereas, on September 30, 1999, I directed the Department of Agriculture to continue implementing a hay assistance program and other measures necessary to respond to the agricultural drought emergency; and

Whereas, the Department of Agriculture has completed development of a comprehensive Hay Assistance Program to assist Pennsylvania's farming and agricultural community in coping with the agricultural drought emergency.

Now, Therefore, I, Tom Ridge, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution, the Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa. C.S. § 7101 et seq., as amended, and other laws of the Commonwealth, do hereby amend my Proclamation of September 30, 1999 as follows:

1. I hereby approve the expenditure of up to \$5,000,000 appropriated unused funds under the Hay Assistance Program as developed by the Department of Agriculture in order to respond to the agricultural drought emergency.

2. This Proclamation Amendment shall take effect immediately.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Governor, at the city of Harrisburg, this ninth day of November in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and ninety-nine and of the Commonwealth, the two hundred and twenty-fourth.

Annex A

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 200. BUSINESS OF COURTS

Rule 223. Conduct of the [Jury] Trial. **Generally.**

[(a)] Subject to the requirements of due process of law and of the constitutional rights of the parties, the court may make and enforce rules and orders covering any of the following matters, inter alia:

* * * * *

Official Note: [Berks Rules 308 and 314 limit the number of witnesses. The rules of several counties limit the number of trial counsel who may address the jury. Time limits are placed upon addresses to the jury in the rules of about ten counties.]

Trial courts in Pennsylvania customarily exercise discretion as to the exclusion of persons from the courtroom in the interest of good order and morals.

The [subject matter of former Rule 223(b) regulating the] exclusion of the taking of photographs or radio or television broadcasting is [now] governed by Canon 3A(7) of the Code of Judicial Conduct[, adopted November 21, 1973 and effective January 1, 1974].

[(b) Rescinded.]

(*Editor's Note:* Rule 223.1 is a new rule. It is printed in regular type to enhance readability.)

Rule 223.1. Conduct of the Trial. Trial by Jury.

(a) In conducting a trial by jury, the court may use one or more of the procedures provided in subdivisions (b) and (c) as may be appropriate in the particular case:

Official Note: This rule catalogs certain procedures which may be utilized in the conduct of a jury trial. Since the court has broad power and discretion in the manner in which it conducts a jury trial, it is not intended that this rule be construed as enlarging, restricting or in any way affecting that power and discretion.

(b) The court may permit jurors to view a premises or a thing in or on a premises.

Official Note: See Rule 219 governing view of premises.

(c) The court may

(1) permit specified testimony to be read back to the jury upon the jury's request,

(2) charge the jury at any time during the trial, and

Official Note: The court is not limited to charging the jury after the closing argument by the attorneys,

(3) make exhibits available to the jury during its deliberations.

Explanatory Comment

The jury trial has been the subject of recent national attention with the adoption of standards and rules and the publication of proposals and studies. Review of procedures governing the jury trial in Pennsylvania has resulted in the recommendation and promulgation of new Rule of Civil Procedure 223.1 and the amendment of Rule 223.

New Rule 223.1 governs the conduct of a jury trial and is designed to be a catalog of the specified options which the court may utilize to facilitate the jurors' understanding of the case. The note to subdivision (a) states that the new rule is not meant to be construed "as enlarging, restricting or in any way affecting" the power and discretion of the court in conducting a jury trial.

The use of the procedures set forth in the new rule is subject to the discretion of the court. Subdivision (a) provides: "The court may use one or more of the procedures provided in subdivisions (b) and (c) as may be appropriate in the particular case."

New Rule 223.1 lists two categories of procedures. Subdivision (b) contains a procedure through which the court may allow the jurors to actively participate in the trial by viewing a premises or a thing in or on a premises. Subdivision (c) contains procedures which the court may employ for the benefit of the jurors: permitting specified testimony to be read back to the jury upon the jury's request, charging the jury at any time during the trial, and making exhibits available to the jury during its deliberations.

Rule 223 has been amended in three respects, none of which affect practice or procedure. First, since the rule is equally applicable to both jury and non-jury trials, the caption of Rule 223 has been amended to read: "Conduct of the Trial. Generally". Second, obsolete references in the note to Rule 223 have been deleted. Finally, since the rule contains but one subdivision, the designation of the subdivision as "(a)" has been deleted.

Rule 206. Petitions and Answers.

Petitions and rules shall be governed by Pa.R.C.P. 206.6. Pursuant to Pa.R.C.P. 206.5(2), a party may seek any relief for which petition and rule procedure may be appropriate. If disputed facts can be determined by a brief hearing, the party shall request that a hearing, and not depositions, be scheduled to determine facts. The petition shall be accompanied by an order conforming to Pa.R.C.P. 206.6 as modified by this local rule, as follows:

consult with the Court within ten days after an answer is filed to determine appropriate procedure for determining disputed facts;

(5) An evidentiary hearing on disputed facts shall be held _____ 19 _____, at _____, in Courtroom _____, of Adams County Courthouse;

(6) Depositions shall be completed within ____ days of this date;

(7) Argument shall be held on _____, 19 _____ at _____, in Courtroom _____ of the Adams County Courthouse;

Comment: This rule is intended to modify and closely mirror procedures in state rules. The rule contemplates that a petitioner will request the appropriate method to determine disputed facts. Since the rule has been expanded to include diverse subjects of relief, many petitions should be determined on Business Court day, with a short hearing followed by argument. Regardless of the procedure that is proposed, petitioners or counsel should first file the petition in the appropriate office and then present it and a proposed order in accordance with Local Civ. Rule 2. Pursuant to that rule, the petition and order may be presented in open court, to the Court Administrator, or to a judge in chambers. When presented to the Court Administrator, that officer shall, before the petition and order is submitted to a judge, ensure that appropriate boxes are checked and if a hearing is requested, that a proper date has been added. The judge may modify the order or attempt to resolve the matter without the issuance of a rule. If counsel requests that facts be determined by depositions, both ¶ 6 and ¶ 7 shall be checked. Normally, depositions should be completed within two months and the case scheduled for argument no sooner than forty days after the completion of depositions, in accordance with Local Civ. Rule 210(b).

Paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (8) shall apply to all petitions. Paragraphs (4), (5), (6), and (7) are alternative procedures. Paragraphs (6) and (7) shall be employed together.

If a petitioner desires to waive oral argument, he or she shall add at the end of (7), words to the effect that all issues shall be decided on brief and that oral argument is waived.

Rule 206.1. Motions to Change or Modify Procedure.

Either the petitioner or respondent may, after notice to opposing counsel or parties, move to change or modify the procedure ordered when a petition is filed under Local Civ. Rule 206. The motion may be filed at any time either before or after an answer is filed to the petition, but may be refused if it will substantially delay resolution of the rule to show cause.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of December 1999

The Department of Banking of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P. L. 13, No. 6) (41 P. S. § 301), hereby determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of December, 1999, is 9%.

The interest rate limitations under the State's usury statute were preempted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub. L. 96-221). Further preemption was instituted with the signing of Pub. L. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on an individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department of Banking is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in Pennsylvania. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board and/or the U. S. Treasury. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 6.60 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 9.10 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 9%.

The following parties have applied for an NPDES permit to discharge controlled wastewaters into the surface waters of this Commonwealth. Unless otherwise indicated on the basis of preliminary review and application of lawful standards

and regulations, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) proposes to issue a permit to discharge, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions. These proposed determinations are tentative.

Where indicated the EPA, Region III, Administrator has waived the right to review or object to this proposed permit action under the waiver provision 40 CFR 123.6E.

Notice of Intent to Establish Alternate Site-Specific Water Quality Criteria for Copper

Under 25 Pa. Code § 16.24(e), the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) proposes to amend the following permits by incorporating the results of a Water-Effect Ratio (WER) into the calculation of the water quality based effluent limit for copper. The WER is a site-specific determination of an aquatic life criterion, which provides a more appropriate level of protection than the Statewide criteria by taking into account the site-specific biological and/or chemical conditions. The WER is determined by conducting side-by-side toxicity tests on sensitive aquatic species using site or simulated site water and lab dilution water. The site-specific water results are divided by the lab dilution water results to determine the WER. The WER procedure recognizes that the physical and/or chemical characteristics of site water can influence the toxicity of a chemical on resident aquatic life. On June 6, 1997, the POTWs listed as follows submitted a Group WER proposal to modify their NPDES copper limits. Following intensive review of their sampling protocol and study results, the EPA approved the WERs listed as follows.

Alternate site specific criteria for copper will be developed by multiplying the Statewide fish and aquatic life copper criteria contained in Chapter 6, App. A, Table 1 by the WER for each POTW. The site-specific criteria will be used in the recalculation of the NPDES permit limits for copper. These changes will affect the copper limits of only the listed facilities.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) will conduct a public hearing on December 21, 1999, beginning at 1 p.m. in the Air Quality Conference Room of the DEP Regional Office Building located at 230 Chestnut Street, Meadville, PA 16335-3407.

The hearing is for the Department to accept testimony concerning its decision to approve, with conditions, Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) plan by Sithe Pennsylvania Holdings LLC, Warren Station, 2325 Penna. Avenue West Ext., Warren, PA to meet the requirements under 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.91–129.95 (RACT), concerning the emissions of oxides of nitrogen (NOx) and volatile organic compounds (VOC) from various air contamination sources. The final RACT proposal will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to Pennsylvania's State Implementation Plan (SIP). This facility is located in Warren County.

The proposed SIP revisions do not adopt new regulations. They incorporate the provisions and requirements contained in the RACT approval for the facility to comply with current regulations.

The preliminary RACT determination, if finally approved, will be incorporated into Plan Approvals and/or Operating Permits for the facility and will be submitted to the EPA as a revision to Pennsylvania's SIP.

The following is a summary of the preliminary NOx and VOC RACT determination for the Sithe Pennsylvania Holdings LLC, Warren Station: Boilers 1, 2, 3 and 4, Combustion Turbine and Emergency Diesel Generator:

1. a. Each Boiler (Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4) shall not exceed an annual capacity factor of 65.1%.

b. Based upon a nominal heat input of 286.5 MMBtu/hr, each boiler shall be limited to an annual heat input of 1.634 million MMBtu/year on a 12-month rolling basis.

c. Each boiler shall implement bias firing. The boilers shall be operated and maintained in accordance with manufacturers specifications and good air pollution control practices.

2. Recognizing one common stack Continuous Emission Monitoring System (CEM) for Boiler Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4, total NOx (nitrogen oxides expressed as NO₂) emissions, combined from all four boilers, shall not exceed 2,025.9 tons/year on a 12 month rolling basis.

3. NOx emissions from Boiler Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 combined, shall not exceed 0.62 lb./MMBtu based on a 30-day rolling average.

4. Continuous Emission Monitoring System (CEMS) shall be operated and maintained to monitor NOx emissions from the four boilers. All four boilers exhaust into a common stack containing a single CEMS.

5. The CEMS shall comply with 25 Pa. Code Chapter 139 and the requirements of the Continuous Source Monitoring Manual.

6. NOx emissions from the combustion turbine shall not exceed 400 tons on a 12-month rolling basis.

When burning Natural Gas:

a. Emission rate shall not exceed 0.499 lb/MMBTU.

b. Heat input shall not exceed 2.005×10^{12} BTU/yr or 1.944×10^9 CF/yr.

c. Annual capacity factor shall not exceed 18.3% on a heat input basis.

When burning No. 2 Oil:

a. Emission rate shall not exceed 0.9 lb/MMBTU.

b. Heat input shall not exceed 1.091×10^{12} BTU/yr or 7,905,000 gal/hr.

c. Annual capacity factor shall not exceed 9.98% on a heat input basis.

For each gallon used of No. 2 fuel oil, natural gas limit in the above statement shall decrease by 246 cubic feet. The turbine shall also be operated and maintained in accordance with manufacturers specifications and good air pollution control practices.

7. Compliance with the short term NOx emission limit for the combustion turbine shall be established based on the average of three 1-hour stack tests.

a. Prior to testing, the test procedure shall be approved by the Department.

b. By September 30, 2002, stack tests shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of 25 Pa. Code Chapter 139 to show compliance with the short term NOx emission limit.

c. At least 2 weeks prior to the test, the Department shall be informed of the date and time of the test.

d. Within 60 days after the test, two copies of the complete test report, including all operating conditions, shall be submitted to the Department for approval.

8. Within 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter, quarterly reports shall be submitted to the Department to show compliance with Conditions 1, 2, 3 and 6.

9. The emergency diesel generator shall comply with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 129.93(c)(5). The emergency diesel generator shall not exceed an operating schedule of 500 hours in a consecutive 12-month period. The source shall be operated and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and good air pollution control practices.

10. Within 30 days of the end of the calendar year, the owner or operator shall submit annual operating reports to show compliance with RACT requirements for the emergency diesel generator.

11. a. VOC RACT for all sources shall be operation and maintenance in accordance with manufacturers specifications and good air pollution control practices.

b. Fugitive evaporative sources of VOCs shall comply with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.51, 129.54–129.72, 129.81 and 129.82, as applicable.

12. This RACT Approval applies to the emission of NOx and VOC pollutants only. Emission of other pollutants, including criteria pollutants, shall be governed by the existing Plan Approvals, Operating Permits and appli-

cable rules and regulations of the Department. These approvals, permits and requirements are incorporated herein by reference and made part of this permit.

Proposed Revision to the State Implementation Plan for Oxides of Nitrogen and Volatile Organic Compounds and Public Hearing

Approval of Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) plan for Grumman Olson in Clinton Township, Lycoming County

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a preliminary determination to approve a revision of a Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) plan and an amendment to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for a truck and van manufacturing facility owned and operated by Grumman Olson in Clinton Township, Lycoming County.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the amendment of the RACT approval for the facility which are intended to comply with current regulations.

The preliminary RACT determination, if finally approved, will result in the revision of Operating Permit OP-41-0002 issued on September 25, 1997, and will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to Pennsylvania's SIP.

The Department proposes to expand one source category identified in Operating Permit OP-41-0002 to include two additional 3 million BTU per hour natural gas-fired burners, a second identified source category to include an additional 240 gallon diesel fuel tank and to establish a new source category which will consist of three small solvent cleaning sinks used for maintenance

and housekeeping operations. All of the subject sources are minor emitters of volatile organic compounds and each of the respective three source categories will be limited to having total combined category-wide volatile organic compound emissions of no greater than 3 pounds per hour, 15 pounds per day and 2.7 tons per year.

One public hearing will be held for the purpose of receiving comments on the proposed operating permit revision and the proposed SIP revision. The hearing will be held on January 4, 2000, at 1 p.m. at the DEP Northcentral Regional Office, 208 West Third Street, Suite 101, Williamsport, PA. The public is invited to comment on the proposal. Hazle Township, Luzerne County

The Plan calls for Hazle Township to construct new sewage collection and conveyance system to service approximately 736 Equivalent Dwelling Units (EDUs) in the following areas: Stockton Number 6 and 8, Coxville, New Coxville, Jeansville, Beaver Brook, Four Season Park, Hazle Village/Yorktown, Mount Laurel, Harwood, Hollar Hill, West Gate Mobile Home Park and Crystal Ridge. The collected sewage will be conveyed to the Greater Hazleton Joint Sewer Authority's (GHJSA) existing treatment plant located in West Hazleton Borough, Luzerne County. The Hollar Hill, West Gate Mobile Home Park and Crystal Ridge areas (approximately 90 EDUs) will be connected to the GHJSA's existing Cranberry Pumping Station while all other areas will be connected directly to the treatment plant by a new sanitary sewage conveyance system.

Texas Township, Wayne County

The Department has completed its review of a Sewage Facilities Plan Special Study for the Indian Orchard Business District Area of Texas Township, Wayne County. The Department has found that the Special Study is now acceptable and hereby grants planning approval.

The Special Study provides for the elimination of malfunctioning onlot wastewater disposal systems, through the construction of a wastewater collection and conveyance system. The system is to serve two trailer parks, several commercial establishments and eight residences. All wastewater from the project area will be treated at the Borough of Honesdale's Wastewater Treatment facility. The project is based on a wastewater flow of 33,400 gpd (84 EDUs).

Vernon, Woodcock Townships, Crawford County

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), under the authority of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (35 P. S. §§ 6020.101—6020.1305) (HSCA) will conduct 15 investigations and potential response actions for the Avtex Mercury Adjunct Sites (sites). The sites are located at various locations in central Crawford County, PA. A more detailed description of the location for each of the 15 individual sites is located in the administrative record compiled for this response. The sites are various residential, commercial, agricultural and industrial properties, where media from the trickling filter of the wastewater treatment plant at the former Avtex Fibers, Inc. facility (media waste), was utilized as fill material. That media waste was contaminated with mercury, and may have caused a release of mercury into the environment at the site.

Since investigations at some of the sites have already revealed levels of mercury that represent a threat to human health and the environment, the Department has decided that response actions are appropriate at each of the sites. For these prompt interim responses, the Department considered two alternatives for each of the sites.

For the Ackerman, Griffin Motors, Longo, Meadville Sandblasting, O'Polka, Porky Road, Reixo Road, Shidemantle, Van Buren, Watson and Wetzal sites, the Department considered: 1A) no action with deed notification and ongoing monitoring; and 2A) excavation and offsite disposal of Avtex media waste and associated contaminated soils and sediment, followed by restoration to pre-excavation conditions.

For the Greenleaf Corporation site the Department considered: 1B) no action with deed notification and ongoing monitoring; and 2B) excavation and offsite disposal of Avtex media waste and associated contaminated soils and sediment, followed by restoration to pre-excavation conditions.

For the Ralph Hunter Gravel Pit site the Department considered: 1C) no action with deed notification, and 2C) excavation and offsite disposal of soil contaminated with mercury from the Avtex media waste, followed by restoration to pre-excavating conditions.

For the Game Farm Logging Road and Tobin sites the Department considered 1D) no action with deed notification and ongoing monitoring, and 2D) (if the waste is Avtex media waste) excavation and off-site disposal of Avtex media waste and associated soil and sediment, followed by restoration to pre-excavating conditions.

Each alternative was evaluated with respect to three comparison criteria of: 1) Effectiveness; 2) Implementability; and 3) Cost. Furthermore, this comparative analysis evaluated the relative performance of each alternative in relation to each specific comparison criterion. The comparative analysis identified advantages and disadvantages of each alternative, so that tradeoffs between the alternatives could be determined.

Based on the comparative analysis the Department chose to implement: Alternative 2A (removal and offsite disposal and restoration) as the prompt interim response for the Ackerman, Griffin Motors, Longo, Meadville Sandblasting, O'Polka, Porky Road, Reixo Road, Shidemantle, Van Buren, Watson and Wetzal sites; Alternative 1B (no action with monitoring) for the Greenleaf Corporation site; Alternative 1C (no action) for the Ralph Hunter, Inc. Gravel Pit; and 2D (if the waste is Avtex media waste) excavation and offsite disposal (otherwise, no action) for the Game Farm Logging Road and Tobin sites. These alternatives were selected because they would, in the most cost-effective manner, protect the public and environmental receptors from direct contact with site-related hazardous substances, and eliminate the ongoing release and threat of release of hazardous substances into the environment.

This notice is being provided under section 506(b) of HSCA. The administrative record, which contains the information that forms the basis and documents the selection of this response, is available for public review and comment. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

The water quality objectives for both phosphorus and sediment were established using a reference watershed approach. These water quality objectives were set with the expectation that they could be reasonably achieved.

The TMDL sets allowable loading rates for both sediment and phosphorus for each land use category identified. The basis of information used in establishment of this TMDL are aquatic biological surveys and water quality analysis modeling using the ArcView based Generalized Watershed Loading Function (AVGWLF) model designed by the Pennsylvania State University.

The following table shows the current loading for the watershed and the necessary reductions to meet the TMDL. The loads are expressed in pounds per year.

Bureau of Aviation; Availability of Local Real Estate Tax Reimbursement Grants for Taxes Paid in 1999

The Department of Transportation, Bureau of Aviation, is accepting applications for Tax Reimbursement Grants from qualifying owners of public airports who have paid local real estate taxes for the calendar year ending December 31, 1999.

Each year, under Subchapter B of the Aviation Code (74 Pa.C.S. §§ 6121, 6122, 6123 and 6124) and 67 Pa. This agreement shall be a covenant which runs with the land and thus shall apply to any subsequent purchases of the land. Upon acceptance of any grant, the covenant shall be deemed extended for one additional year. Any violation of the agreement shall make the owner liable for the repayment of the total appropriation for the year plus a penalty of two times the grant. In any action wherein the owner is found to have violated the agreement, the Department shall receive all costs of prosecution.

HEALTH CARE COST CONTAINMENT COUNCIL

Mandated Benefits

Section 9 of Act 34 of 1993 requires that the Health Care Cost Containment Council (Council) review existing or proposed mandated health benefits on request of the executive and legislative branches of government. The Council has been requested by Senator Edwin G. Holl, Chairperson of the Senate Banking and Insurance Committee, to review Senate Bill 1094, Printers Number 1330 (Schwartz), the Prescription Contraception Equity Act. Senate Bill 1094 would require health insurance policies that provide coverage for prescription drugs and devices to provide coverage for prescription contraceptive drugs and devices approved by the FDA and to provide coverage for outpatient medical or counseling services necessary for the effective use of contraception if the policy provides coverage for other outpatient medical or counseling services.

The Council is requesting that anyone supporting or opposing these mandated insurance benefits provide six copies of such documentation to the Council no later than January 20, 2000. Documentation submitted should be in accordance with any or all of the following information categories described in section 9 of Act 34:

(i) The extent to which the proposed benefit and the services it would provide are needed by, available to and utilized by the population of the Commonwealth.

(ii) The extent to which insurance coverage for the proposed benefit already exists, or if no such coverage exists, the extent to which this lack of coverage results in inadequate health care or financial hardship for the population of the Commonwealth.

(iii) The demand for the proposed benefit from the public and the source and extent of opposition to mandating the benefit.

(iv) All relevant findings bearing on the social impact of the lack of the proposed benefit.

(v) Where the proposed benefit would mandate coverage of a particular therapy, the results of at least one professionally accepted, controlled trial comparing the medical consequences of the proposed therapy, alternative therapies and no therapy.

(vi) Where the proposed benefit would mandate coverage of an additional class of practitioners, the results of at least one professionally accepted, controlled trial comparing the medical results achieved by the additional class of practitioners and those practitioners already covered by benefits.

(vii) The results of any other relevant research.

(viii) Evidence of the financial impact of the proposed legislation, including at least:

(A) The extent to which the proposed benefit would increase or decrease cost for treatment or service.

(B) The extent to which similar mandated benefits in other states have affected charges, costs and payments for services.

(C) The extent to which the proposed benefit would increase the appropriate use of the treatment or service.

(D) The impact of the proposed benefit on administrative expenses of health care insurers.

(E) The impact of the proposed benefits on benefits costs of purchasers.

(F) The impact of the proposed benefits on the total cost of health care within the Commonwealth.

Department of Public Welfare—Subsidized Child Day Care Eligibility; Regulation No. 14-464

Order

On October 13, 1999, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this regulation from the Department of Public Welfare (Department). This rulemaking amends 55 Pa. Code Chapter 3040. The authority for this regulation is 62 P.S. §§ 201—211, 401—493 and 701—703 and 42 U.S.C.A. §§ 9858—9858q. Notice of proposed rulemaking was omitted for this regulation; it will become effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

This proposal amends Chapter 3040 (Subsidized Child Care) of the Department's regulations. It revises income limits and co-payments for eligible low-income families

and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) recipients. An existing eligibility termination date of February 1, 2000, for currently eligible families with incomes between 185 and 235 percent of Federal Poverty Income Guidelines (FPIG) is eliminated.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be in the public interest. It contains a new and simpler incremental co-payment system. That corrects an existing problem with disproportionate co-payment increases for families. Continued subsidy for families with income at 185 to 235% of FPIG keeps them in the program, thereby avoiding disruption of their child care services. However, we also request that the Department continue to closely monitor the impact of co-payments on the ability of eligible families to remain in or receive services under this program.

Therefore, It Is Ordered That:

1. Regulation No. 14-464 from the Department of Public Welfare, as submitted to the Commission on October 13, 1999, is approved; and

2. The Commission will transmit a copy of this Order to the Legislative Reference Bureau.

Department of Public Welfare—Special MA Eligibility Provisions; Regulation No. 14-462

Order

On August 31, 1999, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this regulation from the Department of Public Welfare (Department). It amends various provisions of 55 Pa. Code Chapter 140. The authority for this regulation is section 4732 of the Federal Balanced Budget Act of 1997 (Pub.L. No. 105-33), which amended section 1902(a)(10)(E) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.A. § 1396a(a)(10)(E)). Notice of proposed rulemaking was omitted for this regulation under section 812(b) and (e) of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 279.3a). It will become effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

On September 20, 1999, the Commission received a request from the Department to toll the consideration of this final-omitted regulation to make technical corrections. On October 19, 1999, the Department submitted its revisions to the final-omitted regulation to the Commission.

This regulation expands coverage under the Medical Assistance Program to include full or partial payment of Medicare Part B premiums for the elderly or disabled with incomes of at least 120 percent, but less than 175 percent, of the current Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be in the public interest. The Department must comply with Federal requirements to avoid jeopardizing its Federal financial participation and the Commonwealth from facing possible legal sanctions from the Health Care Financ-

ing Administration. The Federal government will reimburse all of Pennsylvania's program costs, which the Department estimates will be \$1,699,255 for FY 1999-2000.

Therefore, It Is Ordered That:

1. Regulation No. 14-462 from the Department of Public Welfare, as revised on October 19, 1999, is approved; and

Environmental Quality Board—Erosion and Sediment Control; Regulation No. 7-332

Order

On January 20, 1998, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Environmental Quality Board (EQB). This rulemaking amends 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102. The authority for this regulation is found in sections 5 and 402 of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.5 and 691.402) and section 11 of the Conservation District Law (3 P.S. § 859(2)). The proposed regulation was published in the February 7, 1998 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 60-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on October 5, 1999.

The amendments to Chapter 102 are part of the Department of Environmental Protection's Regulatory Basics Initiative. The amendments are intended to eliminate obsolete terms; simplify technical requirements for best management practices; update and clarify permit requirements; and integrate Pennsylvania's regulations with the current Federal National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit requirements for stormwater discharges associated with construction activities.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be in the public interest. The regulation clarifies the erosion and sediment control planning and permitting requirements and is consistent with the Federal NPDES requirements.

Therefore, It Is Ordered That:

1. Regulation No. 7-332 from the Environmental Quality Board, as submitted to the Commission on October 5, 1999, is approved; and

Environmental Quality Board—Mobile Equipment Repair and Refinishing; Regulation No. 7-334

Order

On September 8, 1998, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed

regulation from the Environmental Quality Board (Board). This rulemaking amends 25 Pa. Code Chapters 121 and 129. The authority for this regulation is section 5(a)(1) of the Air Pollution Control Act (35 P.S. § 4005(a)(1)). The proposed regulation was published in the September 26, 1998 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 67-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on October 5, 1999.

The proposal establishes volatile organic compound limitations for mobile equipment repair and refinishing and finish materials used in the aftermarket finishing and refinishing of mobile equipment. Additionally, it establishes coating application technology requirements and work practice standards for the mobile equipment refinishing industry.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be in the public interest. This regulation is one component of the attainment strategy for reducing ground-level ozone. Approximately 4,400 body shops that repair and refinish automobiles and other mobile equipment must meet the requirements. Although the equipment required may be more costly, the Board projects more efficient use of coating materials, offsetting the increased cost.

Therefore, It Is Ordered That:

1. Regulation No. 7-334 from the Environmental Quality Board, as submitted to the Commission on October 5, 1999, is approved; and
