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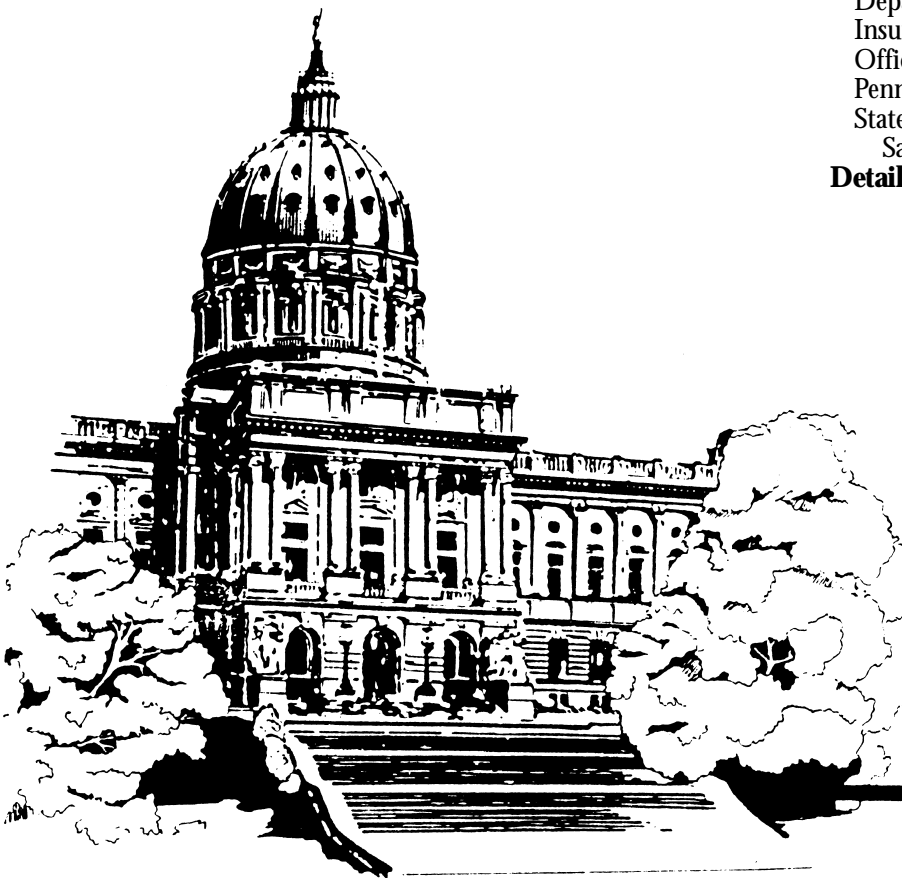

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READER'S GUIDE TO THE *PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN* AND *PENNSYLVANIA CODE*

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where “no fiscal impact” is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Whereas, on September 18, 2004, I amended said proclamation to include Beaver, Bedford, Bradford, Centre, Clarion, Clinton, Clearfield, Columbia, Cumberland, Dauphin, Fulton, Indiana, Jefferson, Juniata, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Lycoming, Mifflin, Monroe, Northampton, Northumberland, Perry, Pike, Schuylkill, Snyder, Susquehanna, Union, Wayne, Westmoreland, and Wyoming Counties; and

Whereas, on September 19, 2004, I amended said proclamation to include Blair, Bucks, Cameron, Carbon, Greene, Lehigh, Huntingdon, and Somerset Counties; and


Whereas, on September 21, 2004, I amended said proclamation to include Franklin, Lebanon, Montour, Tioga, and York Counties; and

Whereas, on October 6, 2004, I amended said proclamation to include Chester, Crawford, Delaware, Lawrence, Montgomery, Philadelphia, and Sullivan Counties.

Now Therefore, pursuant to the provisions of Subsection 7301(c) of the Emergency Management Services Code (35 Pa.C.S.A. Section 7101 et seq. as amended), I do hereby amend my Proclamation of September 17, 2004, as follows:

1. The period of the state of disaster emergency is extended from December 17, 2004, to March 16, 2005.
2. I hereby direct that the other operational provisions of the September 17, 2004 Proclamation that remain applicable to the current emergency circumstances in the counties shall continue in full force and effect.
3. This amendment to Proclamation shall take effect immediately.



And Now, this 8th day of December, 2004, upon the recommendation of the Appellate Court Procedural Rules Committee, the proposal having been published before adoption at 32 Pa.B. 3075 (June 29, 2002);

It Is Ordered, pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, that Pennsylvania Rule of Appellate Procedure 1316, and Note thereto, is adopted in the following form.

This *Order* shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. 103(b) and shall be effective 60 days after adoption.

CHAPTER 13. INTERLOCUTORY APPEALS BY PERMISSION

Rule 1316. Incorrect Use of Petition for Permission to Appeal or Petition for Review.

(a) *General Rule.* The appellate court shall treat a request for discretionary review of an order which is immediately appealable as a notice of appeal under the following circumstances:

(1) where a party has filed a timely petition for permission to appeal pursuant to Pa.R.A.P. 1311; or

(2) where a party has filed a timely petition for review from a trial court's refusal of a timely application pursuant to Pa.R.A.P. 1311 to amend the order to set forth expressly the statement specified in 42 Pa.C.S. § 702(b).

(b) *Additional Requirements.* The appellate court may require any additional actions necessary to perfect the appeal.

Official Note: This Rule requires the appellate court to treat a timely, but erroneous, petition for permission to appeal pursuant to Pa.R.A.P. 1311 from an order which is, in fact, immediately appealable as of right, as a timely notice of appeal. See *Commonwealth v. Shull*, 811 A.2d 1 (Pa.Super. 2002). This Rule supersedes *Thermo-Guard, Inc. v. Cochran*, 596 A.2d 188, 192 (Pa. Super. 1991), which stated, as dictum, that "... in the future, where a petition for permission to appeal seeking review of a final order, appealable as of right, or of an interlocutory order made appealable as of right ... is filed, this court should simply deny the petition." Also, pursuant to subdivision (a)(2) of this Rule, where the trial court refuses an application to amend an order to set forth expressly the statement specified in 42 Pa.C.S. § 702(b), and that order was in fact appealable as of right, the appellate court shall treat a Chapter 15 petition for review of the trial court's refusal to amend as a notice of appeal.

Use of the term "notice of appeal" in this Rule is not intended to preclude treatment of the petition for permission to appeal as a petition for review if the proper method of appeal as of right would be a petition for review addressed to the Commonwealth Court's appellate jurisdiction found at 42 Pa.C.S. § 763.

Corrective Amendment to 25 Pa. Code § 93.9e

The Department of Environmental Protection has discovered a discrepancy between the agency text of 25 Pa. Code § 93.9e (relating to Drainage List E), as deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau and published at 30 Pa.B. 6059, 6094 (November 18, 2000), and the official text codified in the February *Pennsylvania Code*

Reporter (Master Transmittal Sheet No. 315), and as currently appearing in the *Pennsylvania Code*. When the amendments made by the Department at 30 Pa.B. 6059 were codified, the entry for the Delaware Estuary, Philadelphia County, was duplicated.

Therefore, under 45 Pa.C.S. § 901: The Department of Environmental Protection has deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau a corrective amendment to 25 Pa. Code § 93.9e. The corrective amendment to 25 Pa. Code § 93.93e is effective as of February 3, 2001, the date the defective official text was announced in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The correct version of 25 Pa. Code § 93.9e appears in Annex A, with ellipses referring to the exiting text of the regulation.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of December 2004

The Department of Banking (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P. L. 13, No. 6) (41 P. S. § 301), hereby determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of December 2004 is 7%.

The interest rate limitations under the State's usury statute were preempted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub. L. No. 96-221). Further preemption was instituted with the signing of Pub. L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as a principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board and/or the United States Treasury. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 4.47 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 6.97 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 7%.

THE CLEAN STREAMS LAW AND THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT

APPLICATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLLUTION DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITS AND WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT (WQM) PERMITS

This notice provides information about persons who have applied for a new, amended or renewed NPDES or WQM permit, a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges or submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a general permit. The applications concern, but are not limited to, discharges related to industrial, animal or sewage waste, discharges to groundwater, discharges associated with municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4), stormwater associated with construction activities or concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFOs). This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92 and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act.

For NPDES renewal applications in Section I, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a tentative determination to reissue these permits for 5 years subject to effluent limitations and monitoring and reporting requirements in their current permits, with appropriate and necessary updated requirements to reflect new and changed regulations and other requirements.

For applications for new NPDES permits and renewal applications with major changes in Section II, as well as applications for MS4 individual permits and individual stormwater construction permits in Sections IV and VI, the Department, based upon preliminary reviews, has made a tentative determination of proposed effluent limitations and other terms and conditions for the permit applications. These determinations are published as proposed actions for comments prior to taking final actions.

Unless indicated otherwise, the EPA Region III Administrator has waived the right to review or object to proposed NPDES permit actions under the waiver provision in 40 CFR 123.24(d).

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES application are invited to submit a statement to the regional office noted before an application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on a WQM permit application are invited to submit a statement to the regional office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. Comments should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for a public hearing on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995

PREAMBLE 3

The Department has taken action on the following plans and reports under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Provisions of 25 Pa. Code § 250.8, administration of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act), require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a notice of final actions on plans and reports. A final report is submitted to document cleanup of a release of a regulated substance at a site to one of the remediation standards of the act. A final report provides a description of the site investigation to characterize the nature and extent of contaminants in environmental media, the basis of selecting the environmental media of concern, documentation supporting the selection of residential or nonresidential exposure factors, a description of the remediation performed and summaries of sampling methodology and analytical results which demonstrate that the remediation has attained the cleanup standard selected. Plans and reports required by provisions of the act for compliance with selection of remediation to a site-specific standard, in addition to a final report, include a remedial investigation report, risk assessment report and cleanup plan. A remedial investigation report includes conclusions from the site investigation, concentration of regulated substances in environmental media, benefits of refuse of the property and, in some circumstances, a fate and transport analysis. If required, a risk assessment report describes potential adverse effects caused by the presence of regulated substances. If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. A work plan for conducting a baseline remedial investigation is required by provisions of the act for compliance with selection of a special industrial area remediation. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded Assessment

The purpose of this notice is to propose the amount, methodology and aggregate impact of the assessment on Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded (ICFs/MR). This notice is published in compliance with section 805-C (A) of Act 69 of 2004 (act) (62 P. S. §§ 805-C) and section 811-C of Act 154 of 2004 (62 P. S. § 811-C).

Article VIII-C of Act 69 of 2004 (62 P. S. §§ 801-C—811-C) authorizes the Department of Public Welfare (Department) to implement a monetary assessment on each ICF/MR within the Commonwealth. The act further requires that the Department provide initial and final public notices describing the assessment methodology and providing the level of assessment and the aggregate fiscal impact of the assessment. Interested parties are given 30 days from the initial notice to submit comments to the Department, and the comments are to be considered in the final assessment rate which will then be published in a second notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Act 154 of 2004 amends the act to allow the Department to impose

the assessment effective July 1, 2003, for the NonState ICF/MR and ICF/ORC (Intermediate Care Facilities for Persons with Other Related Conditions) programs and allows the Department to impose the assessment effective July 1, 2004, for the Public ICF/MR programs.

Assessment Methodology and Amount

The Department intends to impose an assessment on each licensed ICF/MR (which includes NonState ICFs/MR, ICFs/ORC and State Centers) within the Commonwealth at a level of 6% of net operating revenue. The initial assessment will be made retroactively to July 1, 2003, as permitted under section 811-C of the act for NonState-ICF/MR and ICF/ORC programs and amended under section 811-C of Act 154 of 2004. The Department intends that the initial assessment for Fiscal Year 2003-04 will be imposed as a single annual amount and will be based on the revenue submitted by the providers on their most recently accepted annual cost reports for the NonState ICF/MR and ICF/ORC programs. The Department has determined that the most recent available revenue amounts for the Nonstate ICF/MR and ICF/ORC programs are from the Fiscal Year 2002-03 cost reports. These revenue amounts will be trended forward by the budget inflators used by the Department for rate setting purposes. The budget inflator for Fiscal Year 2003-04 was 1% for the NonState ICF/MR program and 2% for the ICF/ORC program.

For Fiscal Year 2004-05 the Department will calculate the annual assessment amount for each provider again using the revenue amounts from the providers' most recently accepted cost reports for the NonState ICF/MR and ICF/ORC programs. These revenue amounts will be trended forward by the applicable budget inflators used by the Department for rate setting. For Fiscal Year 2004-05 the most recent available revenue amounts for the NonState ICF/MR and ICF/ORC programs are again from the providers' Fiscal Year 2002-03 cost reports. The Department has determined that the most recent available adjusted net operating revenue amounts for the State Centers are from the Fiscal Year 2002-2003 cost apportionment report. There are no inflationary increases applied to these amounts.

The budget inflators are 1% for Fiscal Year 2003-04 and 2% for Fiscal Year 2004-05 for the NonState ICF/MR program. The budget inflators are 2% for Fiscal Year 2003-2004 and 2% for Fiscal Year 2004-2005 for the ICF/ORC program. For Fiscal Year 2004-2005, the most recent available adjusted net operating revenue amounts for the State Centers are in the Fiscal Year 2002-2003 Cost Apportionment Report. There is no inflationary increase applied to the State Centers for Fiscal Year 2004-2005.

Once the annual assessment for Fiscal Year 2004-2005 has been determined, the assessment will be collected on a quarterly basis from the providers and the State Centers. For Fiscal Years 2005-2006 and thereafter, the Department intends to determine the assessment amounts using the same methodology as outlined above for Fiscal Year 2004-2005. The Department intends to use the most recent available revenue data as submitted on the providers' most recently accepted annual cost reports as the basis for determining the 6% assessment amounts for the NonState ICF/MR and the ICF/ORC programs and the most recently identified cost apportionment report for the State Centers.

For each year for which the assessment is in place, including the initial Fiscal Year 2003-04 (for the NonState

ICF/MR and ICF/ORC programs only), the Department will provide each ICF/MR the specific amount of the assessment calculated for the facility.

Fiscal Impact

The proposed Fiscal Year 2003-04 assessment is expected to generate additional aggregate revenue of \$14.645 million during Fiscal Year 2004-05 and the Fiscal Year 2004-05 assessment is expected to generate additional aggregate revenue of \$31.237 million of which \$27.388 million is expected to be received during Fiscal Year 2004-05.

Payments to Nursing Facilities; Final Rates for State Fiscal Year 2003-2004

The purpose of this notice is to announce the Department of Public Welfare's (Department) final payment rates for Medical Assistance (MA) nursing facility providers for the State Fiscal Year 2003-2004 (FY 03-04). The Department calculated the final payment rates in accordance with the case-mix rate-setting methodology in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1187 (relating to nursing facility services) and the Commonwealth's approved Medicaid State Plan. A proposed rate notice for FY 03-04 was published at 34 Pa.B. 5317 (September 25, 2004) and provided for a 30-day comment period. The Department received one comment letter regarding the proposed State FY 03-04 notice. The Department considered the comment in the development of the final rates.

Under the Department's case-mix payment methodology, the Department establishes a new case-mix per diem payment rate for each MA nursing facility provider once each fiscal year. See 55 Pa. Code § 1187.95 (relating to

general principles for rate and price setting). Each provider's annual case-mix per diem rate is comprised of four cost components: (i) resident care; (ii) other resident related; (iii) administrative; and (iv) capital. For each quarter of the fiscal year, the Department adjusts the resident care cost component of each provider's rate by multiplying the resident care cost component by the provider's MA Case Mix Index for the appropriate picture date as follows: July 1 rate—February 1 picture date; October 1 rate—May 1 picture date; January 1 rate—August 1 picture date; and April 1 rate—November 1 picture date. See 55 Pa. Code § 1187.96 (relating to price and rate setting computations). The Department pays the provider for nursing facility services provided to MA recipients during that quarter using the provider's adjusted quarterly per diem rate.

The Department has calculated new annual case-mix per diem payment rates for FY 03-04 for MA nursing facility providers. The Department will make payments to MA nursing facility providers using these rates. The final FY 03-04 annual per diem rates are available on the Office of Medical Assistance Programs' (OMAP) website: www.dpw.state.pa.us/omap. The final FY 03-04 annual per diem rates are also available at local county assistance offices throughout this Commonwealth or by contacting Tom Jayson, Policy Unit, Bureau of Long Term Care Programs, (717) 705-3705.

The Department has also calculated adjusted quarterly rates for the July, October, January and April quarters of FY 03-04 for each MA nursing facility provider. These adjusted quarterly rates are also available on the OMAP's website, at local county assistance offices and from Tom Jayson.

The database that the Department used to calculate the rates is available on the OMAP's website. Since some of the audited cost reports in the database relate to fiscal periods beginning prior to January 1, 2001, the Department revised the audited costs in the database as specified in 55 Pa. Code § 1187.91(1)(iv)(D) (relating to database) to disregard certain audit adjustments disallowing minor movable property or linen costs. The criteria that the Department used to make these revisions are available on the OMAP's website or by contacting Tom Jayson.

Fiscal Impact

The estimated increase in annual aggregate expenditures for MA nursing facility services for FY 03-04 is \$142.500 million (\$64.467 million in State funds).

The purpose of this notice is to announce the Department of Public Welfare's (Department) peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices for general nursing facilities, county nursing facilities, hospital-based nursing facilities and special rehabilitation facilities under 55 Pa. Code § 1187.95(a)(4) (relating to general principles for rate and price setting). The Department used the peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices to determine case-mix rates for nursing facilities for the State Fiscal Year July 1, 2003, through June 30, 2004. The Department calculated the peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices announced in this notice in accordance with 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1187 (relating to nursing facility services) as amended at 32 Pa.B. 734, 758 (February 9, 2002). The data that the Department used to determine the peer group medians and prices is available on the Office of Medical Assistance Programs' website: www.dpw.state.pa.us/omap.

To establish the database for the calculation of peer group medians and prices, the Department used each facility's three most recent audited cost reports that were issued by the Department on or before March 31, 2003, and indexed the costs for each report forward to the common date of December 31, 2003, using the CMS Nursing Home Without Capital Market Basket Index.

The following is a listing, by group, of the number of facilities with a particular year-end, and the inflation factor used to roll the costs of each facility forward to the common date of December 31, 2003.

After the database was inflated using the inflation values, the Department grouped the facilities in the correct geographic and bed size groupings. To establish peer groups, the Department used the most recent Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) group classification as published by the Federal Office of Management and Budget on or before April 1, 2003, to classify each nursing facility into one of three MSA groups or one non-MSA group. Then the Department used the bed complement of the nursing facility on the final day of the reporting period of the most recent audited MA-11 used in the Nursing Information System database to classify nursing facilities into one of three bed complement groups. These groups are 3—119 beds, 120—269 beds and 270 beds and over. Peer groups 7 and 10 have been collapsed in accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.94(1)(iv) (relating to peer grouping for price setting). Peer group 13 is designated for special rehabilitation facilities only and peer group 14 is designated for hospital-based nursing facilities only, regardless of geographic location or bed size.

After the database was established and the peer groups determined, the Department then calculated the medians and prices for each peer group. To calculate the resident care cost medians, the Department divided the audited allowable resident care costs for each cost report by the total facility case-mix index from the available February 1 picture date closest to the midpoint of the cost report period to obtain case-mix neutral total resident care cost for the cost report year. The Department then divided the case-mix neutral total resident care cost for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days for the cost report year to obtain the case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem for each nursing facility to obtain the average case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem of each nursing facility. The Department arrayed the average case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups and determined a median for each peer group.

To calculate the other resident care cost medians, the Department first divided the audited allowable other resident care costs for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days for the cost report year to obtain the other resident related cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the other resident related cost for each nursing facility to obtain the average other resident related cost per diem of each nursing facility. The Department arrayed the average other resident related cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups and determined a median for each peer group.

To calculate the administrative cost medians, the Department adjusted, as appropriate, the total audited actual resident days for each cost report to a minimum 90% occupancy in accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.23 (relating to nursing facility incentives and adjustments). The Department then divided the audited allowable administrative cost for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days, adjusted to 90% occupancy, if applicable, to obtain the administrative cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the administrative cost for each nursing facility to obtain the average administrative cost per diem of each nursing facility. The Department arrayed the average administrative cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups to determine a median for each peer group.

After the medians were determined for each peer group, the Department set prices using the medians. To set peer group prices, the Department multiplied the resident care cost median of each peer group by 1.17 to obtain the resident care cost peer group price; multiplied the other resident related cost median of each peer group by 1.12 to obtain the other resident related peer group price; and multiplied the administrative cost median of each peer group by 1.04 to obtain the administrative cost peer group price.

The peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices of general and county nursing facilities, hospital-based and special rehabilitation nursing facilities for Year 9 are listed in Annex A.

A Medical Assistance nursing facility provider that has not submitted a signed Certification and Settlement Agreement for Year 9 may file an administrative appeal if the provider believes that the Department made any errors, or the provider otherwise disagrees with the Year 9 peer group prices that the Department established for its peer group. A provider's appeal must be sent in writing to the Department's Bureau of Hearings and Appeals, P. O. Box 2675, Harrisburg, PA 17102, and received by the Bureau of Hearings and Appeals within 30 days of the date of this notice. If a provider chooses to appeal, the provider will be afforded the opportunity for a de novo hearing before the Bureau of Hearings and Appeals. The peer group prices applied in setting the provider's rates may be changed as a result of the final adjudication of the provider's peer group price appeal. Providers should refer to 55 Pa. Code § 1187.141 (relating to nursing facility's right to appeal and to a hearing) for more detail regarding their appeal rights and the requirements related to their written appeals.

Disclosure of Departures From Statutory Accounting Principles; No. 2004-11

This document supersedes the notice published at 33 Pa.B. 5888 (November 29, 2003) and shall remain in effect until a subsequent notice is published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) adopted codified statutory accounting principles in March 1998. By Insurance Department Notice Nos. 1998-04 and 2000-02, all types of domestic insurers were advised of the requirement to adhere to the NAIC's codified *Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual* (Manual) in preparing financial statements to be filed with the Pennsylvania Insurance Department (Department) beginning with quarterly financial statements filed as of March 31, 2001. The Manual is not intended to preempt the legislative and regulatory authority of the states. It is intended to establish a comprehensive basis of accounting to be recognized and adhered to if not in conflict with the statutes or regulations of an insurer's domiciliary state (such as, state laws relating to permissible investments) or when the domiciliary state's statutes and regulations are silent.

Financial Regulation Updates; No. 2004-10

This notice is being issued to inform all Pennsylvania domestic insurers of the following recent developments relating to regulatory requirements:

Legislative Changes—Act 216 of 2004

Senate Bill 1096 (Printer's No. 1970) was enacted on November 30, 2004, and became Act No. 216 of 2004. The act includes the following Insurance Department initiatives:

- *New Surplus Note Law*—A new section 322.2 has replaced sections 322.1 and 809 of The Insurance Company Law (40 P. S. §§ 445.1 and 919). The new statute applies to all types of licensed insurers and is consistent with the *Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual* (SSAP No. 41 Surplus Notes) adopted by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC). Therefore, Pennsylvania's surplus note law is no longer considered a law relating to statutory financial statement presentation that may require disclosure in the notes to financial statements and CPA audit reports as a departure from the NAIC Manual. An important change in the

new law is the elimination of outdated requirements relating to interest rates and the forfeiture of interest earned on surplus notes. The new law became effective November 30, 2004.

- *Investment Limitations*—The life and property/casualty investment laws (40 P. S. §§ 504.2(15)(ii)(C) and 653c(a)(11)(ii)(C)) have been amended to increase the permissible limit in investments in agreements for the lending of securities, repurchase or reverse repurchase agreements with any one business entity from 2% to 5% of admitted assets. This change also reflects current national standards adopted in the NAIC Model Investment Law (Defined Limits) and became effective November 30, 2004.

- *Standard Nonforfeiture Law for Individual Deferred Annuities*—The nonforfeiture law for deferred annuities has been amended to revise the expense charges and interest rates used in determining minimum nonforfeiture amounts. The interest rates shall be based on the Five-Year Constant Maturity Treasury Rate. In addition, the interest rate used in determining minimum nonforfeiture amounts for an equity-indexed benefit may be reduced by up to 100 basis points depending on the value of the equity index benefit. The amendment is effective for contracts issued on or after January 1, 2006, or before January 1, 2006, if an insurer files with the Insurance Department a notice of election of the amendment. An interest rate of 1.5% is used in determining minimum nonforfeiture amounts for contracts issued on or after July 1, 2002, and before January 1, 2006, except if the insurer has elected to apply the amendment prior to January 1, 2006.

Pennsylvania Regulatory Requirements for Annual Audits and the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002

31 Pa. Code Chapter 147, Annual Audited Insurers' Financial Report Required, applies to all domestic insurers. If significant deficiencies in internal controls are identified in an annual audit, § 147.10 of this regulation requires notice to the Department, as follows:

§ 147.10. Report on significant deficiencies in internal controls.

(a) Concurrently with the filing of the annual audited financial reports, each insurer shall furnish the Commissioner with a written report prepared by the independent certified public accountant describing significant deficiencies in the insurer's internal control structure noted by the independent certified public accountant during the audit. The Statement of Auditing Standard No. 60, Communication of Internal Control Structure Matters Noted in an Audit (AU Section 325 of the Professional Standards of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Inc.) requires an independent certified public accountant to communicate significant deficiencies, known as "reportable conditions," noted during a financial statement audit to the appropriate parties within an entity. A report should not be issued if the independent certified public accountant does not identify significant deficiencies.

(b) The insurer is required to provide, within 60 days of the date of the independent certified public accountant's report on significant deficiencies, a description of remedial actions taken or proposed to correct significant deficiencies, if the actions are not described in the independent certified public accountant's report.

The Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002 applies to companies that are required to register with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. Section 404, Management Assessment of Internal Controls, of Sarbanes-Oxley requires companies that file annual reports under section 13(a) or 15(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (15 U.S.C.A. §§ 78m or 78o(d)) to include an internal control report that contains (1) a statement of management's responsibility for establishing and maintaining an adequate internal control structure and procedures for financial reporting and (2) management's assessment of the effectiveness of the company's internal control structure and procedures for financial reporting. The company's auditor is required to attest to and report on the management's assessment.

As a point of clarification relating to the interrelationship of these state and federal requirements, please be advised that compliance with 31 Pa. Code § 147.10 is required if an auditor's review conducted under section 404 of Sarbanes-Oxley results in the identification of significant deficiencies in internal controls that affect statutory financial reporting, as described in 31 Pa. Code § 147.10.

Statutory Cost of Living Increases for Salaries of State Officials and the Heads of Departments, Boards and Commissions

Section 3(e) of the Public Official Compensation Act, the act of September 30, 1983 (P. L. 160, No. 39) as amended by Section 2 of the act of October 19, 1995 (P. L. 324, No. 51) mandates that the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, State Treasurer, Auditor General, Attorney General, and the heads of the departments and members of boards and commissions shall be increased by applying the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area for the most recent 12 month period for which figures have been officially reported by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) immediately prior to the date adjustment is due to take effect.

As required by Section 3(e) of the Public Official Compensation Law, the Governor has determined, based on the change in the CPI-U (PA-DE-NJ-MD) over the past 12 months as reported by BLS on November 17, 2004, that the salaries covered by that law shall be increased by 5.2% effective January 1, 2005.
