A TRIBUTE TO THE MEMBERS OF THE *VILLANOVA LAW REVIEW*

I had the rewarding and interesting assignment of serving as the faculty advisor to the *Villanova Law Review* for Volumes XVII to LIX, which spanned forty-three years. I had a great assignment because my function was to establish a supportive working relationship with the editor-in-chief and executive editor of each volume of the *Law Review*. While ensuring adherence to law school policies was part of my job description, most of the time I was a resource to be sought out for guidance and possibly a little help in getting things done within the law school.
